"MERCY TRIUMPHS OVER JUDGMENT!"

On the 23rd of October every year we I wonder what St. James would say tocommemorate St. James the Apostle. It seems that more than anything else in Forgiveness and Eternal Life though His the world, everyone needs to stop for a moment and etch the words of St. James regarding the "law of love" deep into their minds and hearts.

"If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scriptures, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you do well; but if you show partiality, you commit sin, and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever shall keep the whole law, and yet stumble in one point, is guilty of all... For He Who said, 'Do not commit adultery,' also said, 'Do not murder.' Now if you do not commit adultery, but you do murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. So speak and so do as those who will be judged by the law of liberty. For judgment is without mercy to the one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment." (St. James 2:8-13).

tion and equality.

I suppose that, being the first bishop of Jerusalem, he would remind us that we are never to condemn any person. However, we are to condemn the sins that we do. Each person has the DNA of our Creator -- being in His Image. God loves each of us that we are given the Gift of Cross and Resurrection.

It is the sin that is condemned. However, forgiveness and repentance are offered on an "equal-opportunity" basis. At the same time let us note that nowhere is it said that one sin is less serious than another. One sin that goes without repentance can easily become a habit that leads to greater sins.

Unfortunately, people have forgotten the words of St. James. On the one hand, some feel justified in condemning or marginalizing others for their sins. On the other hand, some teach that sin does not even exist anymore under the guise of love. Teaching against evil and sin and in favor of God's Law of love (i.e., patience, repentance and self-control) seems irrelevant in our times. Our Church's moral teachings are being seri-

ously challenged. As Orthodox Christians, however, we judge ourselves with regard to the sins we commit, seeking God's mercy through repentance and love for others. In seeking God's mercy for ourselves, we seek God's mercy for others, as well. At the same time, we can never justify sin and evil as "okay and normal." It is with the love of God that we caution ourselves and others to follow our Lord's Commandment to love. When we abandon God, we fall away from love and mercy. This in itself is a sin.

Like the other Apostles, St. James committed the sin of abandoning Christ at His Cross. But, also he repented and offered his life for Christ, standing up for the Law of Love against those who preferred the "law of self."

SPIRITUAL THOUGHTS by Deacon Euthym

"Take care to distinguish between your thoughts, as the Fathers teach. Stop and look, decide which ones are good and which ones are bad. Then, disassociate from any that you find to be bad, believe nothing they tell you, do not believe for an instant that they are a part of who you are. This is of the utmost importance, because if we accept bad thoughts, then they will stay with us and make us believe that they are actually a part of us." --Elder Sergei of Vanves

What a great teaching...Stop and look at your thoughts. So important not to allow thoughts to fester and grow. Root out the ones that are not from God immediately. The bad thoughts tend to stick around if we don't stop and analyze them and push them out, then they begin to normalize in our minds, pretty soon we lose our ability to discern the good from the bad. Clear your mind, seek that which God would have us contemplate, seek wisdom not information and seek God's will not our own... "Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report;

if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things." (Philippians 4:8).

"Apt silence bridles anger; moderation in food bridles mindless desire; and the single-phrased Jesus Prayer bridles unruly thought." --Ilias the Presbyter

This is such a simple and great teaching. If we have anger issues, silence or moderate speech is the prescription. To curb worldly and physical urges, fast. Finally to control negative thoughts, say the Jesus Prayer. These are areas we all struggle in, and require spiritual prescriptions to control them. Let us then run and confess our struggles then implant these beautiful ideas and see the results. John the Baptist is often remembered throughout the year. He lived simply, but he was austere and controlled his anger. He had his thoughts on Christ, sharing the Good News of His incarnation. Let us imitate St John in our daily lives, glorifying God with everything we do.

"But when God dwells in a man, then the demons and passions are driven out, and the man becomes a temple of God, rifled with sanctification, filled with illumination, purity and grace. Blessed is he who sees the Lord in the innermost treasury of his heart as in a mirror." --Venerables Barsanuphius the Great and John the Prophet

Today's Gospel tells of the temptation of Christ by the devil in the wilderness. Despite being God incarnate, the second person of the Trinity who created all things including the angels, Christ did not engage in fruitless dialogue with the Evil one. Rather, He responded to the one, who is the source of misinformation and deceit in a singular fashion.... He quoted scripture. For every temptation Christ warded it off with the word of God. He is the Word, who took flesh and used His Word, Himself, to respond to the temptations of this world. We too must learn and study and immerse ourselves in scripture so that we have answers for every given temptation.




