# THE LADDER

SUNDAY OF THE HOLY FOREFATHERS

#### **BECOMING A NEW PERSON**

The general teaching of the Saints emphasizes the fact that, by virtue of the Birth of Christ into the world, our very "being" has changed from a "being" of flesh into a "being" of the spirit, joined with Christ, Who is Perfect God and Perfect Man. Thus, we no longer possess basic natural abilities, but we now possess divine abilities. St. Basil explained our "After Christ" "being," saying, "Christ emptied Himself, taking on the form of a servant, and becoming con-

formed to the fashion of our lowliness so that He might make us conformable to the image of His glory." (Divine Liturgy of St. Basil).

However, we have total freedom to choose between God's Will and our own self-centered plans. Through the garment of Baptism and Chrismation we have the grace of the Holy Spirit to vanquish every evil and unclean spirit. For this reason, St. Paul wrote to the Colossians: "Now put off from yourselves everything: anger, malice, evil, blasphemy, unseemly conversations..." (Colossians 4:6). - Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.

#### ST. SPYRIDON THE WONDERWORKER

Tomorrow we commemorate St. Spyridon, known as the God-bearing Father of the Church and the great defender of Corfu and the boast of all the Orthodox. He had Cyprus as his homeland. He was simple in manner and humble of heart, and was a shepherd of sheep. When he was joined to a wife, he begat of her a daughter whom they named Irene. After his wife's departure from this life, he was appointed Bishop of Trimythus, and thus he became also a shepherd of rational sheep.

When the First Ecumenical Council was assembled in Nicaea, he also was present, and by means of his most simple words stopped the mouths of the heretics known as the Arians who were wise in their own conceit. By the divine grace which dwelt in him, he wrought such great wonders that he received the surname 'Wonderworker." So it is that, having tended his flock piously and in a manner pleasing to God, he reposed in the Lord about the year 350, leaving to his country his sacred relics as a consolation and source of healing for the faithful.

Λειτουργια Αγ. Βασιλειou).

Ομως, εχουμεν την πασαν ευλευθεριαν να επιλεξουμεν αναμεσα στο θελημα του Θεου και την δικην μας εγωκεντρικη βουληση. Δια της ενδυμασιας του Αγ. Βαπτισματος και του Αγ. Χρισματος, εχουμεν την χαριν του Αγιου Πνευματος να κατακτησουμεν το καθε πονηρο και ακαθρατο πνευμα. Για αυτον τον λογον, ο Αγ. Παυλος εγραψε στους Κολοσσαεις: <Νυνι δε αποσεσθε και υμεις τα παντα: οργην, θυμον, κακιαν, βλασφημιαν, αισχρολογιαν εκ του στοματος υμων...> (Κολ. 4: 6). Η ενδυμασια μας για να εισελθωμεν στο Δειπνον του Θεου ειναι η στολη του Βαπτισματος, την οποιαν την διατηρουμεν συνεχως καθαρη δια μεσου της συνεχους μετανοιας.

Η μετανοια ειναι αδυνατον οσο επιλεγουμεν να μην συντριψουμεν τον πειρασμο και το κακο. Πραγματι, η μετανοια ειναι το "R.S.V.P." για να παρακολουθησουμεν το Μυστικο Δειπνο του Κυριου. Οι δικαιολογιες παρεμποδίζουν τις προσπαθειες μας να μετανοησουμεν. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

dom of God is one that we are to constantly maintain in a condition of cleanliness by virtue of our constant repentance.

Repentance is the "R.S.V.P." that we need in order to join in the Heavenly Banquet. Excuses hamper our efforts to repent. From to-day's Gospel passage, the excuses offered in justification for declining the invitations to the king's banquet were, in reality, distractions described as "excuses." However, excuses are not confessions and to seek being excused is much different from seeking forgiveness.

Repentance of sins is the beginning of our path leading to Baptism (or to the "second baptism," known as Holy Confession) and then on to Holy Communion. A trademark of a repentant life-style is that one is always aware of our Lord's presence and is therefore always aware of his or her accountability before the Heavenly King. This continuous presence before Christ our God is, at the same time, a life-style consisting of our baptismal vows to reject Satan and all of his demons and to accept Christ our True God. Our participation in the Sacrament of Holy Communion is the on-going reversal of the sin of Adam and Eve. They were commanded not to eat the fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil, for in so doing, were deceived into thinking they were gods; here, we are commanded to partake of the fruit of the vine and the grain made into bread, so that we can be united to Christ the True God.

We now "wear Christ." As such, anger, malice, bearing false witness and other sins are replaced with patience, forgiveness, truth and other virtues consistent with the character of one in whose soul Christ abides. Our "new self" in Christ is humble and in humility, we allow ourselves to be aided by the grace of the Holy Spirit, through prayer and worship, acquiring day-by-day the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

This acquisition of the gifts of the Holy Spirit is both a life-time experience, as well as one that is instantaneous. In his book, *Experiences During the Divine Liturgy*, Fr. Stephanos Anagnostopoulos, explains an important detail in the prayer asking for the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Precious Gifts—the bread and the wine: "Why do the words said by the priest ask that God first send the Holy Spirit upon us and then upon the Precious Gifts?...We must all first be cleansed of sin, sanctified, transfigured, converted and go through the good transformation of the soul and body." (pg. 535). Thus, the "old, pre-Christian" person who pretends to be a god is replaced with the "new, after baptism" person who is united to the True God.




