CHRIST IS RISEN!

The Gospel passage that is read at the performance of the Agape Vespers on Easter Sunday afternoon leaves us with the Doubting Thomas, who said, "Unless I see in His hands the print of the nails and place my finger in the print of the nails and thrust my hand into His side, I will not believe." (St. John 20:25). In this way our Church acknowledges a great human frailty, which manifests itself in reality. That is, we followed the Lord, side-byside with His Disciples at every event in His earthly life, including His Crucifi-

xion. We were present with the Myrrhbearing Women at His tomb and with others after His Resurrection from the dead. Even so, as with all of Christ's followers, we must face this great human frailty, namely: the need for proof!

Truly, we, along with Christ's Disciples—men and women—even though we have been present during His earthly ministry and when He perfored His many miracles (and He still performs them); and having been Continued on page 2

THE EXPERIENCE OF CHRIST'S VOICE PROCLAIMING ETERNAL LIFE

"He is risen as He said (*Matthew*28:6); there you will see Him, as He told you (*Mark* 16:7); and remember how He told you (*Luke* 24:6). The angels called the women and the disciples to remember His voice and His words; to reflect on all that had happened and to recognize that the promises of the Lord had been fulfilled, death and the tomb could not hold the Son of God, and just as He said, He is the resurrection and the life!

For the disciples the voice of Christ was a very real experience. They were present for all of the miraculous events and His teaching. Following His Resurrection and Ascension, they could not but speak of all the things they had seen and heard for those full years being with Him. (Acts 4:20)

In receiving the Gospel by faith, we affirm and proclaim the power and truth of His Passion and Resurrection as well. Through our worship and His power and presence in our midst, we hear His voice, we affirm the fulfillment of His promises, and we proclaim to the world the salvation and abundant life found in Jesus Christ, our risen Lord. We see and hear, and we become the voice of Christ!" (2016 Paschal Encyclical; His Eminence, Archbishop Demetrios)

Δηλαδη, παρακουλουθουσαμεν τον Κυριον χερι-χερι με τους μαθητας Του μεσα απο καθε εκδηλωση στην επιγειον ζωην του Χριστου μεχρι την Σταυρωσιν Του και παρουσιασθηκαμε με τις Μυροφορες Γυναικες στον ταφο Του και με τους αλλους μετα την Αναστασιν Του. Ωστοσο, οπως και με ολους τους οπαδους του Χριστου, πρεπει να αντιμετωπισουμεν αυτην την ανθρωπινην αδυναμιαν μας, η οποια ειναι η αναγκη μας για αποδειξεις!

Πραγματι, εμεις, μαζι με ολους τους μαθητας του Χριστου, ανδρες και γυναικες, αφου ημασταν παροντες κατα την διαρκειαν της διακονιας Του και οταν εκανε τα πολλα θαυματα Του (και ειμεθα ακομα δικαιουχοι των θαυματων Του μεχρι σημερα) και μαζι Του οταν αναστηθηκε ο Λαζαρος απο τον ταφο – ωστοσο, εμεις ευρισκομεθα εκπληκτοι με ο,τι δεν μπορουμεν να κατανοησουμεν.

Οπως εφαρερωθηκε ο Αναστας εκ νεκρων Χριστος στον Αγιον Θωμα με σκοπο την διαλυσιν των αμφιβολιων του, κατα τον ιδιον τροπο θα αποκαλυψει τον Εαυτον Του σε εμας δια μεσου της προσευχης μας και θα καταλαβουμεν την ακαμπτην αληθειαν: Χριστος Ανεστη!. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

with Him when Lazarus was raised from the dead—even so, we are confounded with whatever we cannot comprehend.

As the Risen Christ revealed Himself to St. Thomas, in the same way Christ will reveal Himself to each of us through our prayers. In fact, the truth of His Resurrection is revealed to each person in various ways—all by the grace of the Holy Spirit, the Giver of Life and the Source of all Wisdom.

Given that the only things that we can indeed prove are things that can be observed as part of the tangible universe, we must concede that there still exist many realities that lie outside the bonds of the tangible. There are *intangible realities*. Such realities of love and the beginning of the universe, as well as the reality of the very essence of light lie beyond the physical. They are part of the immaterial, intangible totality of God's creation.

Here's an example. Steve Jobs, who amassed great wealth through the Apple Industry, upon his death bed, shared the reality of *God's love*:

"I have come to the pinnacle of success in business. In the eyes of others, my life has been the symbol of success...At this time, lying on the hospital bed and remembering all my life, I realize that all the accolades and riches of which I was once proud, have become insignificant with my imminent death. In the dark, when I look at the green lights, of the equipment for artificial respiration and feel the buzz of their mechanical sounds, I can feel the breath of my approaching death looming over me. Only now do I understand that once you accumulate enough money for the rest of your life, you have to pursue objectives that are not related to wealth. It should be something more important...No, stop pursuing wealth; it can only make a person into a twisted being, just like me. God has made us one way: we can feel the love in the heart of each of us... This is the true wealth that will follow you; will accompany you. I can only take with me the memories that were strengthened by love. He will give strength and light to go ahead...Please treasure your family love; love for your spouse; love for your friends. Treat everyone well and stay friendly with your neighbors." (This quotation was shared with me by members of our parish.)

The only true love in the world is the *love of Christ our God*, Who arose from the dead, conquering death by His death. His Resurrection is as much a reality as is His voluntary death on the Cross. So, in this spirit (or, with this Spirit) let us celebrate the Feast of Love — *the Agape* — with love for one another as is conveyed in the Agape Vesper Service of our Church. +FR. THEODORE

Paschal Encyclical 2016 - His Eminence, Metropolitan Gerasimos

"You, O Christ, Who has destroyed Hades and raised up mankind by your Resurrection, make us worthy with pure heart to praise and glorify You." –From the Praises of Pascha



Dearly Beloved,

We have completed our Lenten journey and very soon we will find ourselves at the tomb of Christ where He has rested for three days. In this upcoming Holy and Great Week we will have journeyed with Him to Jerusalem and we will witness His Passion. We will see Him extend His arms to accept the life giving Cross. We will hear Him pardon those who crucified Him. We will hear Him grant entry to Paradise to the repentant thief crucified next to Him. And then early in the morning we will, like the women who went to anoint Him, experience His triumphant emergence from the tomb. He has destroyed death and granted life to the world.

In the icon of the Resurrection, our Lord and Savior reaches out to Adam and Eve and lifts them out of their tombs. When they saw Him in Hades, they extended their hands towards Him and the Risen Lord gave them new life. In one ancient text He says to them, "Arise!". In the Exapostilarion of Pascha we hear how Christ raised up Adam, the first man, from corruption. All of this reminds us that we are celebrating two resurrections in this Feast of Feasts, that of the Lord Jesus from His three days in the tomb and our own. We, the descendants of Adam, experience resurrection because we have joined ourselves to Christ. We have reached out to Christ and He has taken us by the hand to give us life. Christ has conquered death so that we may be free from its power. His conquest emboldens us to mock the darkness and chains of the Evil One with the words of St. Paul, "Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" (I Corinthians 15:54-55). The lit candles that we will hold up in middle of night on Pascha are symbols of that victory and we will carry them through the streets into the night to our homes to proclaim the news to all that Christ is Risen!

And the joy we will experience on the day of Pascha and through this season of resurrection must be proclaimed and shared. We will greet one another with a joy-filled "Christ Is Risen!". We will remember the words of the hymn of Holy Saturday "Arise, O God, and judge the earth; for You shall have an inheritance in all of the nations." The Resurrection banishes sadness in a tragedy-filled world and offers meaning and purpose in an age that feel adrift. The Resurrection shows us that the love and mercy of God knows no boundaries. The Resurrection gives life to the world, to all humanity, with no barriers. In the sermon of St. John Chrysostom we hear, "Let all enter into the joy of the Lord."

The words of joy, life, mercy and forgiveness are easy to say, but their meaning and implications for the world are not so easy to put into practice. We see the outstretched hands of the suffering in the Middle East, the refugees fleeing Syria, and all those who yearn for peace, security and freedom from persecution. We see the outstretched hands of the poor and the suffering in our own cities and among our neighborhoods. We, like Christ in the icon, must extend our hands to those who seek to experience the power of the Resurrection and receive the gift of the new life that Christ has granted to the world. The Risen Christ who has granted the world great mercy and new life, calls us to extend that mercy and love and new life to all.

Dearly beloved, may the power of the Resurrection fill your hearts with the power of God's infinite mercy and love. Χριστός Ανέστη! Christ is Risen!


