- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.

AT ISSUE: OUR FREE WILL

Throughout the course of the Ecclesiastical Year, we commemorate the great Saints, who participated in the proceedings of the Ecumenical Councils. We commemorate them today, as well. We commemorate these Saints, because they imparted to us the True Faith, as it appears in the Holy Gospel.

As such, today's passage from St. Luke's Gospel is read for the purpose of reminding us to be careful not to be deceived by some false teachings. In-

deed, it is for this reason that the Church has set before us the passage from St. Paul's Epistle to Titus, through which we heard: "Avoid stupid controversies, genealogies, dissentions and quarrels over the law, for they are unprofitable and futile." (Titus 3:9).

The Gospel of our Lord is "the seed." In other words, it is the Divine and pure Truth of Life. For us to know this Truth, it is necessary for each of us to have a pure soul, so that we would not be distracted by worldly continued on page 2

THE BASIS OF CHRISTIAN ETHICS — During the Divine Liturgy, prior to the Lord's Prayer, and in preparation to partake of Holy Communion, we hear the priest intone: "The mercy of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ be with all of you." With these words, he blesses the faithful. The words, "Our Great God and Savior Jesus Christ" comprise an ancient Christian phrase to emphasize that Christ is God as One of the Holy Trinity. This was to counter the pagan notion that "gods" acted on the basis of human-like emotions (anger, pleasure, retribution, etc.), as opposed to the Divine virtue of great mercy.

As we read in the Orthodox Study Bible, "Christians are good not merely out of obedience to the law, or harmony with nature, or in order to gain immortal bliss of the soul. Rather, they are in righteous anticipation of the age to come, the 'eschaton', the age of the fullness of creation in the Incarnate Son of God. Grace is the uncreated energy of God, the gift of the Holy Spirit, through which God gives His gifts to man in tender mercy and good will. It is a formative power, the rule of life of the eschaton, requiring our determined participation. To belong to God is to become like God. To be ransomed, or 'owned,' by God is not simply legal and static, but means to live in solidarity with Him: a blessed, victorious struggle." (pg. 1648).

God's mercy is expressed through the gift of God's Divine Grace in the Holy Spirit, whereby we are not subject to the whims of some false god, but we are partakers with God's energy, and we participate in God's love, through which we are able to love as beings created in the Image and Likeness of God. Christians, therefore are good, because it is a part of their very personhood (having God within their souls) rather than as a simple obligation to law or nature.

Κατα την διαρκειαν του Εκκλησιαστικου ετους, μνημονευουμεν τους Αγιους οι οποιοι ελαβαν μερος στις Οικουμενικες Συνοδους, οπως και σημερα. Μνημονευουμεν αυτους τους Αγιους, διοτι εμετεδωσαν σε εμας την αληθινην πιστιν οπως παρουσιαζεται στο Αγιο Ευαγγελιο.

Επομενως, η σημερινη περικοπη του κατα Λουκαν Ευαγγελιου αναγινωσκεται με σκοπον να προσεξουμεν να μην πλανουμεθα δια μεσου καμιας ψευτικης διδασκαλιας. Μαλιστα, και για αυτον τον λογον εθεσε η Εκκλησια μας την περικοπην απο την Επιστολην του Αγιου Παυλου προς τον Τιτον, κατα την οποιαν ακουσαμεν τα λογια του: «Μωρας δε ζητησεις και γενεαλογιας και εριν και μαχας νομικας περιιστασο, εισιν γαρ ανωφελεις και ματαιοι.» (Τιτ. 3–9).

Το Ευαγγελιο ομιλει για <τον σπορον>. Δηλαδη, <0 σπορος> ειναι η θεικη και ασπιλη αληθεια της ζωης. Για να γνωρισουμεν αυτην την αληθειαν ειναι αναγκη να εχει ο καθενας μας μια ασπιλην ψυχην, ωστε να μην επηρεαζεται δια μεσων των κοσμικων ενδιαφεροντων και των διδακαλων των ψευτικων ιδεολογιων. Στην μεσην ολων των συγχυσεων των ανθρωπων της καθε εποχης και τοπου, υπαρχει <ο Πονηρος>, ο οποιος ειναι ο διαβολος – ο οποιος, <αιρει τον λογον απο της καρδιας αυτων, ινα μην πιστευσαντες σωθωσειν.>(Λουκ. 8: 10).

Στο <Πατερ Ημων> προσευχωμεθα: <και ρυσαι ημας απο του πονηρου.> Ο <πονηρος> ειναι εκεινος που διαστρεφει την αληθειαν και ζητα την καταστροφην μας με σκοπον να μην δοξαζεται το Ονομα του Πατρος και του Υιου και του Αγιου Πνευματος. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ cares and teachers of false ideologies. In the midst of all of the confusion among people in every time and place is the devil, who "comes and takes away the Word from their hearts so that they may not be saved." (St. Luke 8:10).

In the Lord's Prayer, we pray, "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." In Greek, however, the word "evil" is one which gives a deeper, broader meaning to the work of the devil. The actual word in Greek is: "Poniros" (pronounced: poh-nee-rhohs). This word means: "crafty", "deceitful." Hence, evil is based on deception of the Truth. It is the devil who twists and spins the Truth so that the Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit cannot be glorified by us.

Our Lord spoke in parables in order to give people the opportunity to learn about the Truth of God's love in terms that can be easily comprehended, given the limits of human capacity. This parable is offered in the simple agrarian terms of farming so that people can see how "good seed" can fail to bring its fruit. Those who do not want to understand the deeper meaning of the parable are those who prefer to remain blind to the Truth of God's love. They *choose* to not see. As a result, whatever they hear, they cannot properly understand. But, the Disciples were the ones who wanted to know the deeper meaning of God's teaching. In response, our Lord explained in detail the meaning of this parable. A major element that leads to our salvation is our Free Will. God does not make anyone do anything! While God's love is available to all people, we, as individuals can only offer love back to God by wanting to do so. St. John Chrysostom noted that our Lord does not force people to love Him against their Free Will, saying, "To do so would be of no advantage to them." This Gospel passage counters the "Doctrine of Predestination", which John Calvin had preached in the 16th Century.

Certainly, if Christ our God does not *make* us do His Will, no one else can *make* people do God's Will. What we can do is offer the love of Christ our God to them in ways that they may be able to understand (like parables). But, it is up to them to accept this love. Certainly, we are not magicians. However, we can serve as guides toward salvation in Christ. We are obligated to pray for God to enlighten us so that we can find ways to inspire our loved ones and others; we can pray for them o the realize in some way on their own that they need God. We can teach the Truth by words and by example. In this way, we will honor the Saints of the Ecumenical Councils and inspire others to freely choose to follow God.
