Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

THE SYMBOL OF OUR SALVATION

Reading the Book of Numbers in the Old Testament, we see these words: "The people spoke against God and against Moses, saying, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt? To die in the desert?... Then the Lord sent venomous snakes among them and they bit the people and many Israelites died...And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a serpent and mount it upon a pole; anyone who is bitten can look upon it and live...'" (Numbers 21: 4-9).

This is a telling description of our own

relationship with God. Sometimes we become ungrateful for all of God's blessings and we turn away from God. As a result, we commit sins, and death is the fruit of their poison. The golden serpent of Moses was then a sign of God's forgiveness.

As is evident from today's Gospel reading, the "serpent in the wilderness" was a prototype of God's real deed of forgiveness for all of humanity. Christ Himself said, "As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that Continued on Page 2

THE "TREE" AND THE CROSS

In the Garden of Eden there was the "Tree" of "knowledge of good and evil". Hidden in this Tree of Eden was Satan who continues to bring us every form of temptation, as was done through the serpent. <u>Upon</u> "the Tree", which we know to be The Cross, God is nailed—our Savior; He Who is both God and Man. Remember the temptation offered by the serpent in the Garden of Eden? He said, "You will not die,... but you shall be as gods..." (Genesis 3:4...). The Cross is, however, the Symbol of Truth that contradicts the temptation of the serpent. The Holy Cross says, "You will not die, *because* you will be *with God*." The Holy Cross of our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ stands as the unifying message throughout the Bible—bringing together the Book of Genesis and the Book of Revelation, guiding us against the deception of the serpent and leading us to the truth of God's love.

Let us become aware of our thoughts and ideals so that we can compare them to the thoughts and ideals of our Lord's Holy Gospel. Let us bring ourselves to judgment so that we can turn to repentance, which is the synonym for "taking up one's Cross" and following our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Ισως, ειναι δυσκολον να κατανοησουμεν την μεγαλην σημασιαν του Σταυρου και την σχεσιν την οποιαν εχει με το Μυστηριον της Θειας Κοινωνιας και την δικην μας γενικην διανοησιν.

Λοιπον, ας αναφερω εναν στοιχον εκ των γραπτων του θρησκευτικου ποιητου, Ι. Π. Θεοδωροπουλου, καθως ευρισκεται στο βιβλιο του, Κατηχητικη Μουσα:

<Αληθεια, εχεις νοωσει βαθεια σου το μυστηριο της Θειας Ευχαριστιας – την φρικτη και απερι– γραπτη αυτη θυσια; Την ωρα που τελειται το μυστηριο, τα ιδια τα Χερουβειμ και τα Σεραφειμ παρευρισκονται στην Αγια Τραπεζα σκεπαζοντας τα προσωπα τους απο φοβο και σεβασμο, οι δε ουρανιες δυναμεις, μαζι με τον αρχιερεαν, τους ιερεις και διακονους, προσευχονται για σενα, για ολους τους αμαρτωλους, ενω το Αιμα του Χριστου χυνεται απο την αχρανταν Πλευρα Του μεσα στο Αγιο Ποτηριο. Συλλογησου την ιεροτητα της στιγμης, στασου με σεβασμο, προσευχησου.>(σελ. 37)

whoever believes in Him will have eternal life." (St. John 3:14).

Through Christ's death upon the Cross, forgiveness was granted to all of humanity and to each of us individually. Perhaps we find it difficult to understand the great significance of the Cross and its relationship to the Sacrament of Holy Communion and to our current mentality.

Let me quote a stanza from the religious poetry of the religious poet, J.P. Theodoropoulos, from his book, *Musings in Catechism*:

"Have you ever felt deep within you the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist — that amazing and indescribable sacrifice? At the moment at which the Sacrament is celebrated, the very same angels from the Orders of the Cherubim and the Seraphim are present at the Holy Altar, shielding their faces out of awe and great respect. The powers of heaven, along with the bishop, the priests and the deacons, pray for you; for all those who are laden with sin, since the Blood of Christ drips from His most pure Side from the Cross and into the Holy Chalice. Think about the great holiness of this moment. Live with respect for God and pray." (pg. 37).

On Wednesday, September 14th, we will commemorate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. We share here an excerpt, with a parenthetical analysis, from:

THE SERMON OF ST. JOHN of KRONSTADT ON THE FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS:

"Let us enter into the meaning of the mystery of the Cross...The world, that is, the human race, would have been given over to eternal death, according to the unchanging, most strict justice of God, if the Son of God had not become, out of His limitless goodness, a voluntary Intermediary and Redeemer of all of humanity, which became corrupted by sin. For, by the deception of the serpent, humanity was cut off from God and cast into a frightful abyss. (Note: Hence, the serpent of Moses in the wilderness was the beginning of the "unraveling" of the deception of the first serpent, which caused the "fall of Man". When Christ was raised upon the Cross, it was the "rise of Man" in the person of Christ, the Son of God. - Fr. Theodore) So that we might be capable of this redemption from above, it was necessary for the Son of God to descend into the world; to take upon Himself a human soul and body, and become the God-Man, in order that in His own Person, in His human nature, He might fulfill all the righteousness of God which had been brazenly violated by all manner of human unrighteousness." ("The Meaning of the Mystery of the Cross", by St. John of Kronstadt)

Verse 2—: Glorious things were said concerning you, O city of God.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

Refrain: "Soson imas, Yie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Verse 2</u> - There I shall cause to spring up a horn for David; there I prepared a lamp for my anointed.

Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who Arose from the dead, we sing to You, Alleluia."

<u>Verse 3 - </u> For the Lord has chosen Zion; He chose her for His dwelling.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

Doxa Patri ke Io ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous eonas ton eonon.

People: "O Monogenis Ios ke Logos tou Theou..." (O Only-Begotten Son and Word of God...)

From the womb of Hades has He delivered us and to all the world has granted His great redeeming mercy

<u>Hymn for The Nativity of the Theotokos:</u> Ie ghenisis Sou Theotoke...(Your Nativity, O Theotokos, imparted joy to the entire earth, for out of you has risen the Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God. He nullified the curse and instead gave His blessing; and causing death to be neutralized, He granted us eternal life.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis...(As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of kings, bearer of trophies are you, O Great Martyr George, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

<u>Kontakion Hymn</u>: Ioakim ke Anna onidhismou...(Both Joachim and Anna from their sterility's stigma, and Adam and Eve from their mortality's ruin have been set free, O immaculate Maid, by your holy nativity. For this do your people hold celebration, redeemed from the guilt of transgression as they cry to you, "The barren one bears the Theotokos, the nourisher of our Life.")
