LIVING WORTHILY

Today's Gospel passage begins with the words of Christ, "Behold, we go up to Jerusalem and the Son of Man will be given over to the high-priests and scribes and they will condemn Him to death." (St. Mark 10:33). With these words, we also prepare to go up to Jerusalem with Christ so that we can crucify our worldly desires and live the Resurrection for eternity.

Only the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross trampled upon death, as St. John

Chrysostom says, "The death of the Savior has set us free...Hades is vexed and has been done away with." (Catechetical Homily of St. John Chrysostom). To quote the Orthodox Study Bible, "The final reconciliation, the eternal one, is the presentation of Christ's Blood before God in heaven." (pg. 1664). St. Gregory the Theologian in his writing entitled, "The Second Oration on Pascha," says, "[Why] did the Blood of His Only-Begotten Son delight the Father, Who would not receive even the Isaac, when Continued on page 2

WHAT'S UP WITH STS. JAMES AND JOHN? — Today's Gospel passage includes an incident in which Sts. James and John incurred the condemnation from the other Apostles of our Lord for asking that they be given preferred treatment. After explaining to His Apostles, that they are going up to Jerusalem where He would be condemned to death, the first thing in the minds of Sts. James and John was that they have glory. The only glory that exists is God's glory. Human glory is both deceptive (meaning that it bears elements of untrue embellishment) and illusive (glory from people in this present life is always accompanied by jealousy, envy and attempts to disgrace the one "glorified.") God's glory is always something that no one willingly refuses, unless deceived by demons and through pride. Even those who reject God, in desperation, pray to Him — "every knee both in heaven and on earth" bows before Christ our God.

Our Lord quickly corrects Sts. James and John without condemning them. Instead, He teaches them the great privilege and value of servanthood for God's glory. According to the *Orthodox Study Bible*, "Note that with regard to sitting as equals on the right and left hand of Christ in His Kingdom, St. John Chrysostom teaches that no one could possibly occupy such a position. With regard to the hightest places of honor that can be given, icons of the Church universally depict the Virgin Mary (Most blessed among women [Lk.1:28] and John the Baptist [the greatest born of women] holding these places." (pg. 1307).

Μονον η θυσια του Χριστου εκατεπατησε τον θανατον,οπως ειπε ο Αγ. Ιωαννης ο Χρυσοστομος: <Ηλευθερωσε γαρ ημας ο του Σωτηρος θανατος...ο Αδης φησιν επικρανθη και γαρ κατηργηθη.> (Κατηχητικος Λογος Αγιου Ιωαννου Χρυσοστομου). Να παραθεσω το Orthodox Study Bible: <Η τελικη συμφιλιωσις, η αιωνια, ειναι η παρουσιαση της θυσιας του αιματος του Χριστου ενωπιον του Θεου Πατρος εις τους ουρανους.> (σελ. 1664). Ο Αγιος Γρηγοριος ο Θεολογος στην ομιλιαν του, <Δευτερα Ομιλια Περι της Αναστασεως>, λεει: <Γιατι ικανοποιησε τον Πατεραν Θεον το αιμα του Μονογενη Υιου Του, ο Οποιος δεν παραδεχθηκε ουτε τον Ισαακ καθως ηθελε ο πατερας του να τον προσφερει;...Διοτι η ανθρωποτης χρειαζοταν να αγιασθη απο την ανθρωποτηταν του Ιδιου Θεου.> Migne, P. G, σελ. 431).Το αιμα του Χριστου δεν ειναι μονον μια ανθρωπινη προσφορα εξιλεωσεως,αλλα ειναι η πραγματικη συγχωρησις απο τον Θεον, η οποια ενεργει μεσα εμας το ζηλον για να μετανοησουμεν. Δεν υπαρχει τιποτα αλλο παρα την μετανοιαν που να προσφερουμεν ως <πληρωμη> για την σωτηριαν μας. Η αληθεια αυτη εκφωνειται στα λογια του Ακαθιστου Υμνου: <...ισαριθμους γαρ ψαμμω ωδας αν προσφερωμεν...ουδεν τελουμεν αξιον ων δεδωκαν υμιν...> +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

he was being offered by his father?...because humanity was in need of being sanctified by the Humanity of God, that He might deliver us Himself and overcome the tyrant of death, drawing us to Himself by meditation of His Son..." (Nicene and Post-Nicene Fathers, Second Edition, Vol. 7, pg. 431). The Blood of Christ is not only a human offering of atonement, but it is the real forgiveness of God, which works within us the desire to repent of our sins.

There is nothing else beyond our repentance that can be offered to God as "payment" for our salvation. This is poignantly noted in the Orthodox Church Service of the *Akathist Hymn*, which was held this past Friday: "Every hymn falls short in describing the multitude of Your mercies, O Lord. For, if we were to praise you with hymns equal in number to the sands of the sea, we would do nothing in compare to what You, O Holy King, have done for us, who cry out to You: Alleluia."

No one except God the Creator, in the Person of His Only-Begotten Son, Jesus Christ, can offer what is acceptable for our salvation. To-day's rejection of Christ yields a new norm: the illusion that there is no such thing as sin, as well as the justification to blame others for our faults, rather than to repent of ourselves. Few people will try to adapt the inner disposition exemplified by St. Mary of Egypt, whose memory we commemorate today. Her inner disposition is one of sincere repentance, characterized as the turning away from sin, without finding excuses for them, and turning totally to God. Only in this way can people find purpose and a sense of "self" worth.

We live in an age in which one of the "buzz-words" peppering our conversations is *self-esteem*. The sense of worthlessness that is sometimes expressed is rooted the way people treat each other. It is also rooted in feelings of guilt, which are unresolved, or in the denial of guilt, through which destructive behavior is considered to be hopelessly aberrant. For the Christian, *self-esteem* is no more than an illusion. "God-esteem" is more of a reality through which one finds a sense of value or meaning. "God-esteem" is the presence of the grace of God within us. Christ is the only God that makes us *worthy* of salvation!

Our participation in the Sacrament of Holy Communion is not based on our "self-esteemed" notions of worthiness. Christ's Body and Blood is what makes us worthy as persons. Approaching Christ worthily makes all the difference. Fr. Stanley Harakas writes, "'Receiving worthily' refers to our behavior, our beliefs and our attitude of reverence." (The Orthodox Church:455 Questions and Answers, pg. 81). Holy Confession is the Sacrament of Repentance for the mistakes (or sins) that we commit through our weakness. Living "repentantly" is living worthily. +FR. THEODORE

Verse 2 – Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His rewards.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

<u>Verse 3—</u> The Lord prepared His throne in heaven, and His Kingdom rules over all.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, soter, soson imas.

Chanter(s): Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1—</u> Praise the Lord, O my soul! I shall praise the Lord while I live; I shall sing to my God as long as I exist.

Verse 2 - Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob; his hope is in the Lord his God.

Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, We arose from the dead, we sing to You, Alleluia."

Verse 3 – The Lord shall reign forever; your God, O Zion, to all generations.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Sunday Resurrection Hymn:</u> Ex ipsous katilthes...[Tone 8] ((From on high did You descend, O merciful Lord, for us did You endure, three days in the tomb that we may be, released from pas-sions in this world, You Who are our resurrection and our life. Glory unto You O Lord.)

Hymn for St. Mary of Egypt: En si miter akrivoshs...(In you, O Mother, is preserved undistorted what was made in the image of God; for taking up the cross, you followed Christ and by example taught, that we should overlook the flesh, since it passes away, and instead look after the soul, since it is immortal. And therefore, O devout Mary, your spirit rejoices with the angels.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis... ("As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of kings, bearer of trophies are you, O Great Martyr George, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.")

Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday: Prostasia ton Christianon...(A Protection of Christians unshamable; mediation with the Creator immovable. We sinners beg You: do not despise the voices of our prayers, but anticipate, since You are good, and swiftly come unto our aid as we cry out to You with faith: Hurry to intercession; and hasten to supplication, O Theotokos, Who defends at all times those who honor You.)

READINGS: Epistle - Hebrews 9: 11-14 / Gospel - St. Mark 10: 32-45


