Holy Communion Order

- 1. Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive
 Holy Communion, but
 they may receive the
 Holy Bread at the end
 of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

CHRIST IS CONSTANTLY PRESENT

As much as water is the basis for the life of the body, so much (and even to a countless greater degree) the grace of the Holy Spirit is the basis for the life of the soul. The Holy Spirit is "the Giver of Life," as we say when we say the prayer, "Heavenly King, Comforter, the Spirit of Truth, everywhere present, filling all things..." The Holy Spirit, Who is Truly God (the Third Person of the Holy Trinity) is the common denominator for the "water of life," and the enlightenment of the souls. The Holy Spirit gives life by re-

vealing Christ to each person; for, Christ is the Author of Life, Who endured the Cross and Resurrected from the dead. On this point, St. Basil the Great says: "It was not possible for the Author of Life to be held captive by corruption."

In this reality, the Holy Spirit grants life to the believer by revealing Christ, Who is the Light of our souls. It is here that we note the close relationship between Holy Baptism and Holy Chrismation. In *Continued on page 2*

PENTECOST SUNDAY

"When the day of Pentecost had come they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed as resting upon each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit . . . (Acts 2.1–4).

The Holy Spirit that Christ had promised to his disciples came on the day of Pentecost (Jn 14.26, 15.26; Lk 24.49; Acts 1.5). The apostles received "the power from on high," and they began to preach and bear witness to Jesus as the risen Christ, the King and the Lord. In the liturgical services of the feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit is celebrated together with the full revelation of the divine Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The fullness of the Godhead is manifested with the Spirit's coming to man, and the Church hymns celebrate this manifestation as the final act of God's self-disclosure and self-donation to the world of His creation.

Οσο ειναι το νερο η βασις της σωματικης ζωης, τοσο (και σε μια αμετρητη μεγαλυτερη σημασιαν) ειναι η χαρις του Αγιου Πνευματος η βασις της πνευματικης ζωης. Το Αγιο Πνευμα ειναι <η ζωη χορηγος,> οπως λεγομεν στην προσευχην: <Βασιλευ Ουρανιε.> Το κοινο στοιχειο μεταξυ του <υδατος της ζωης> και του φωτισμου της ψυχης ειναι το Αγιο Πνευμα, το Οποιο ειναι ο Ιδιος ο Θεος – το Τριτον Προσωπον της Αγιας Τριαδος.

Η δουλεια του Αγιου Πνευματος ειναι να αποκαλυψει στον καθεναν μας τον Χριστον, ο Οποιος ειναι ο Θεος ο Αρχηγος της Ζωης δια μεσου του Σταυρου και της Αναστασεως, οπως το λεγει ο Αγιος Βασιλειος: <ουκ ην δυνατον κρατεισθαι υπο της φθορας τον Αρχηγον της Ζωης.>

Μεσα σε αυτην την πραγματικοτηταν, το Αγιο Πνευμα χαριζει ζωην στον πιστον δια μεσου της αποκαλυψεως του Χριστου, ο Οποιος ειναι ο Φωτισμος της ψυχης μας. Εδω γνωριζουμεν την σχεση μεταξυ του Αγιου Βαπτισματος και του Αγιου Χρισματος. Δια του Βαπτιματος, συμμετεχουμεν στον θανατον και της Αναστασεως του Χριστου - και, συνεπως, διαφωτιζωμεθα με την Θειαν Αληθειαν: οτι ο Χριστος ειναι ο Θεος και η <Ενσαρκη Σοφια> του Θεου Πατρος. Δια του Χρισματος, διδεται στον καθεναν μας <η Πηγη της Αιωνιου Ζωης>, η οποια ειναι η καθημερινη εμπνευσις της Αγαπης του Θεου. Baptism we participate in the death and Resurrection of Christ and, consequently, we are enlightened with Divine Truth: that Christ is God; He is the "Wisdom of God in the flesh." In Chrismation each person is given the "Fountain of Life," which is a *daily supply* of Divine Love and Truth. The Holy Spirit helps us to comprehend that Eternal Life is life with Christ our God.

The Holy Spirit is the constant presence of Christ in the world at every place and at all times. Praying for the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Gifts during the Divine Liturgy changes them to the Body and Blood of Christ, whereby we are one with Christ our God. St. Basil amplifies this point in asking the rhetorical question, "How could one who has partaken of the Holy Spirit be willing to forget or disregard that the Holy Spirit is of the Father and the Son in every way?" (On the Holy Spirit, St. Vladimir's Press, pg. 87).

Our own spiritual life is deeply connected to the liturgical life of the Church. Assuming that they are separate realities is a mistake, which is perhaps one of the main reasons for why the Orthodox Church is sometimes called "the best-kept secret in America." Let me explain. In the Book of Acts, we realize that the Holy Spirit inspires every person in the world. The Gospel is meant for all, as in the cases of the Ethiopian (Acts 8) and Cornelius (Acts 10). In response to their desire to know our Lord, St. Philip baptized the Ethiopian and St. Peter went to Cornelius to give him instruction, allowing him to embrace the Orthodox Faith (which is Apostolic). Therefore, to assume that those who are not of the Orthodox Faith are therefore not guided by the Holy Spirit is a mistake. Making this mistake leads us to ignore our calling to minister to them. By ignoring them, we sadly fail to expose the beauty of our Church to others in the world. Hence, we go without their participation in the Sacramental life of the Church. Knowing that God loves them, what answer do we give to our Lord for not inspiring them to join His Church?

On the contrary, those who have been baptized and chrismated as Orthodox Christians, who willingly choose to seek a spiritual life apart from the Church, unwittingly give the message that God's Church is not important to the life of the world. By virtue of their free choice, they reject the reality that the Holy Spirit descends into our lives through the combined practice of private prayer *and* communal prayer as participants in the Sacramental life of the Church.

HYMNS FOR THIS SUNDAY'S CELEBRATION OF THE DIVINE LITURGY:

ANTIPHON I: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou..." (By the prayers of the Theotokos...)

<u>Verse 1 — The heavens declare the glory of God; the firmament shows the creation of His hands</u> Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

<u>Verse 2-</u>. Day to day utters speech, and night to night reveals knowledge.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas.

<u>Verse 3</u>-There is no speech nor language where their voices are not heard. Their proclamation went forth into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the world.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

Chanter(s): Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1-</u> May the Lord hear you in the day of afflictions; may the name of the God of Jacob defend you.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, Paraklte Agathe, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Verse 2 - May He send you help from His holy place, and may He support you from Zion.</u>

Refrain: "Save us, O Good Comforter, we sing to You, Alleluia."

<u>Verse 3 - May He remember every sacrifice of yours, and may your whole burnt offering be honored.</u> Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, Paraklite Agathe, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Doxa Patri ke Yio ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous aonas ton aonon. Amin.</u> "O Monogenis Yios ke Logos tou Theou…"

ANTIPHON III-You gave him his soul's desire, and You did not deprive him of his lips' request. O Lord, the king shall be glad in Your power, and in Your salvation he will greatly rejoice. For You anticipated him with blessings of goodness; You placed a crown of precious stones on his head.

<u>Pentecost Sunday Hymn</u>: Evloghitos-ee Christe o Theos...(Blessed are You, O Christ our God. You made the fishermen all-wise by sending down upon them the Holy Spirit and, through them, You drew the whole world into Your net. O Lover of all people, glory be to You.)

<u>Pentecostal Kontakion Hymn:</u> Ote katavas tas glossas...(When the Most High God descended and confused the tongues, He divided the nations. When He distributed the tongues of fire, He called all people to unity. And with one voice we glorify the All-Holy Spirit.)

At the Entrance with the Gospel: Instead of "Defte proskinisomen...," the following: Ypsothiti Kyrie en ti dynami Sou. Asomen ke psalloumen tas dynasti-ahs Sou. Soson imas Paraklite Agathe, psallontas Si, Alleluia (Be exalted, O Lord, in Your power; we will sing and praise Your mighty deeds. Save us, O Comforter-we sing to You.

Instead of "Aghios o Theos," we sing: Osi eis Christon evaptistite; Christon enedisastheh (As many as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ. Alleluia.)

<u>READINGS</u>: Epistle - Acts 2: 1-11 / Gospel - St. John 7: 37-52; 8: 12

<u>Megalinarion</u>: Instead of "Axion Estin," we sing: Mee tis fthorahs diapyrra...(Without sustaining corruption You still conceived a Child and lent Your flesh to the Word and Great Fashioner. O Mother Who knew no man, O Virgin Theotokos, the Container and Holder of Your uncontained and infinite Creator, You do we glorify.)
