THE FAITH

The main theme of the Second Sunday of Great Lent is that of maintaining our Faith in the grace of Christ our Savior. In the reading of St. Paul's Epistle to the Hebrews, we heard: "How shall we escape [consequences of disobedience] if we neglect so great a salvation, which at first began to be spoken by the Lord and was confirmed to us by those who heard Him?" (Hebrews 2:3). He is speaking about the Holy Tradition of Christ's Gospel. The Orthodox Faith is a collective Tradition of the experiences of personal faith of those who live according to the Gospel.

There are at least two expressions of personal faith: 1) One is our physical movements-for example, efforts to draw near to Christ, like the friends of the paralytic of today's Gospel passage-that is, (for example) motions which parallel our efforts to participate in the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. 2) The other is our spiritual life, based on prayer in the grace of Continued on page 2

Holy Communion Order

- 1. Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.

ST. GREGORY PALAMAS

This divine Father, who was from Asia Minor, was from childhood reared in the royal court of Constantinople, where he was instructed in both religious and secular wisdom. Later, while still a youth, he left the imperial court and struggled in asceticism on Mount Athos, and in the Skete at Beroea. He spent some time in Thessalonica being treated for an illness that came from his harsh manner of life. He was present in Constantinople at the Council that was convened in 1341 against Barlaam of Calabria, and at the Council of 1347 against Acindynus, who was of like mind with Barlaam; Barlaam and Acindynus claimed that the grace of God is created. At both these Councils, the Saint contended courageously for the true dogmas of the Church of Christ, teaching in particular that divine grace is not created, but is the uncreated energies of God which are poured forth throughout creation: otherwise it would be impossible, if grace were created, for man to have genuine communion with the uncreated God. In 1347 he was appointed Metropolitan of Thessalonica. He tended his flock in an apostolic manner for some twelve years, and wrote many books and treatises on the most exalted doctrines of our Faith; and having lived for a total of sixty-three years, he reposed in the Lord in 1359.

Το θεμα της Δευτερας Κυριακης της Μ. Τεσσαρακοστης ειναι η τηρησις της Πιστεως μας στην χαριν του Σωτηρος μας Χριστου. Κατα την αναγνωσιν της Επιστολης του Αγ. Παυλου προς τους Εβραιους, ακουσαμεν: <Πως ημεις εκφευξομεθα τηλικαυτης αμελησαντες σωτηριας; ητις αρχην λαβουσα λαλεισθαι δια του Κυριου...> (Εβρ. 2:3). Ομιλει περι της Ιερας Παραδοσεως του Ευαγγελιου του Χριστου. Η Ορθοδοξος Πιστις ειναι μια συλλογικη Παραδοση απο τις εμπειριες της προσωπικης πιστεως εκεινων οι οποιοι ζουν συμφωνα με το Ευαγγελιο.

Εχουμεν δυο εκφρασεις προσωπικης πιστεως: 1) η μια ειναι οι σωματικες κινησεις μας, π.χ., οι προσπαθιες μας να πλησιασουμεν τον Χριστον, οπως οι φιλοι του παραλυτικου της σημερινης Ευαγγελικης περικοπης – δηλ. (π.χ.) να εκκλησιαζωμεθα και να πραξουμεν εργα αγαπης. 2) Η αλλη ειναι η ψυχικη μας ζωη η οποια βασιζεται επανω στο εργο της εν Πνευματι προσευχης.

Ο Αγ. Γρηγοριος, τον οποιον μνημονευουμεν σημερα εδιδασκε περι ενος τυπου προσευχης που λεγεται Ησυχασμος. Η βασις του <ησυχασμου> ειναι η εντολη του Χριστου: <Συ δε οταν προσευχη, εισελθε εις το ταμιειον σου και κλεισας την θυραν σου προσευξαι τω Πατρι σου τω εν τω κρυπτω.> (Ματθ. 6:6). Δια της <εν τω κρυπτω> προσευχης αποφευγει ο ανθρωπος τα εγκοσμια εμποδια της προσευχης, κυριως, την εντυπωση σε αλλους οτι ειναι αξιος για επαινους – και, συνεπως, γνωριζει το <Φως Χριστου,> η οποια φωτιζει ολους. the Holy Spirit.

St. Gregory Palamas, whom we commemorate today, taught about a particular type of prayer called *Hesychasm*. The basis of *Hesychasm* is commandment of Christ, "When you pray, go into your closet, close the door and pray to your Father in secret." (St. Matthew 6:6). Through this "prayer in secret," one escapes worldly distractions of prayer, which even include thoughts of pride. As a result of such sincere prayer, one comes to know "the light of Christ," which illumines all people. Such prayer gives way to a God-centered view of life—i.e., prayer gives birth to our teachings. In this respect, the personal faith of generations of Saints became the "Faith" as it is summed up in our Church teachings—a "Faith" (or teaching) that transverses time, place, race, gender and circumstance. In sum, we might say that the teachings of our Church—the Orthodox Faith—is the result of prayers of individual Saints, collectively, offered through their personal faith in Christ.

Of course, when speaking about prayer, we need to discern between sincere, true prayer and "false" prayer, such as the kind of prayer offered by the Pharisees, who prayed in a braggadocios manner to impress others, while, at the same time, deceiving themselves. Indeed, there are many forms of "false" prayer, such as prayer for riches; prayer for power over others; prayer for our "self-will". In addition, true prayer arises through a silent, inner yearning for the love of the True God, Christ, and is not at all akin to modern or far Eastern forms of meditation or transcendentalism (an idealistic philosophical and social teaching akin to pantheism).

There is a relatively new book published by Fr. John Meyendorff, available through Amazon, that deals with the Tradition of Orthodox prayer and spiritual life. It is entitled: *St. Gregory Palamas and Orthodox Spirituality*. A review of this book indicates the basic theme that, through heart-felt prayer with Christ our God, the soul becomes the ruler of the body. True to Orthodox spiritual life (i.e., life in the Holy Spirit), prayer is a relationship with God, whereby one takes on Divine qualities. The paralytic of today's Gospel illustrates how the power of Christ our God overcomes the limits of the body.

Consistent with sincere, inner prayer (*Hesychasm*), a careful study of and participation in the celebration of the Divine Liturgy teaches that the ultimate purpose of prayer is union with Christ in His Body and Blood, whereby our bodies and blood are mingled with the Divinity. +FR. THEODORE

HYMNS AND READINGS FOR TODAY'S CELEBRATION OF THE DIVINE LITURGY

ANTIPHON I: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou..." (By the prayers of the Theotokos...)

<u>Verse 1-</u>: Bless the Lord, O my soul, and everything within me, bless His holy name.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, soter, soson imas."

Verse 2 – Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His rewards.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

<u>Verse 3—</u> The Lord prepared His throne in heaven, and His Kingdom rules over all.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, soter, soson imas.

Chanter(s): Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1—</u> Praise the Lord, O my soul! I shall praise the Lord while I live; I shall sing to my God as long as I exist.

Refrain: "Soson imas, Yie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Verse 2</u> - Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob; his hope is in the Lord his God.

Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who is Risen from the dead, Alleluia."

<u>Verse 3 -</u> The Lord shall reign forever; your God, O Zion, to all generations.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

Doxa Patri ke Io ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous eonas ton eonon.

Forever earnestly entreat for the salvation of our souls.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis... (As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and champion defender of kings, bearer of trophies are you. O great martyr George, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

<u>Kontakion Hymn</u>: Ti Ypermacho...(O Champion General, I your City now ascribe to you triumphant anthems as the tokens of my gratitude, being rescued from the terrors, O Theotokos. Inasmuch as you have power unassailable, from all kinds of perils free me so that unto you I may cry aloud: Rejoice, O unwedded Bride.




