- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

WHAT IS ETERNAL LIFE?

The Saints of the First Ecumenical Council, whom we commemorate today, gave the world a good example of the proper analysis of the Bible. In this they offered the example of the living application of Biblical teachings affecting our own mentality. Indeed, this mentality is a "spiritual mentality," because in all that we do, we include God as the loving Person to Whom we commend ourselves through worship and in our relationships with our fellow human beings.

Analyzing today's Gospel passage, these Saints remind us that the unity that we are to have among us in our Faith in Christ, is what unites us with God, Who is One God in Three Persons. This reality is expressed when we say the Nicene Creed during the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. Christ is, "Light of Light...(and) of the same essence with the Father." This expression of truth is based on Christ's words, "[Holy Father] for those who do believe...that they may be Continued on page 2

THE FIRST ECUMENICAL COUNCIL

The council was summoned in the year 325 by the Emperor St. Constantine the Great, assembled according to tradition on May 20 of 325. Early on, the Hierarchs and theologians in attendance faced a certain presbyter by the name of Arius, who questioned the divinity of Christ, suggesting that if Jesus was born, then there was a time when He did not exist. If He became God, then there was time when He was not. The Council declared Arius' teaching a heresy, unacceptable to the Church and decreed that Christ is God. In addressing this issue, the framework was laid for composting the Nicene Creed, which introduced the famous word, *homoousios*, a philosophical term meaning that the Son of God is *of one essence* with the Father. A number of renowned Saints were also present: Sts. Athanasius the Great, Nicholas of Myra, Spyridon of Trimythous, Alexander of Alexandria, and Paphnutius of Egypt.

This ecumenical council was the first effort to attain consensus in the Church through an assembly representing all of Christendom. St. Hosius of Cordoba, was one of the <u>Papal legates</u> and appeared to have *presided* over its deliberations. The main accomplishments of the First Ecumenical Council were: the construction of the first part of the Nicene Creed and establishing uniform observance of the date of Easter. In addition, Early Christian Canon Law took its beginnings with this Council.

Αυτη η αληθεια εκφραζεται σταν εκφωνουμεν <το Πιστευω> κατα την τελετην της Θειας Λειτουργιας. Ο Χριστος ειναι <Φως εκ Φωτος ...(και) ομοουσιος τω Πατρι.> Αυτη η εκφρασις της αληθειας βασιζεται στα λογια του Χριστου: <[Πατερ Αγιε ερωτω] περι των πιστευοντων...ινα παντες εν ωσι, καθως Συ, Πατερ, εν Εμοι, καγω εν Σοι, ινα και αυτοι εν ημιν εν ωσιν, ινα ο κοσμος πιστευση οτι Συ *με απεστηλας.*>(Ιωαν. 17: 20–21).

Στην αποριαν σε σχεση με τον τοπον του Παραδεισου, ο Χριστος ειπε: «Αυτη δε εστιν η αιωνιος ζωη,
ινα γινωσκωσι Σε τον Μονον Αληθινον Θεον και ον απεστειλας
Ιησουν Χριστον.» (Ιωαν. 17:3). Και
στην απορειαν σε σχεση με το Προσωπο του Χριστου,ο Ιδιος ειπε: «Νυν
δοξασον Με Συ, Πατερ, παρα σεαυτω τη δοξη η ειχον προ του τον κοσμον ειναι παρα Σοι.» (Ιωαν. 17:5).

Ο Χριστος ειναι η δοξα του Θεου Πατρος. Οτι θελει να εκδηλωθει η δοξα Του σε εμας, ειναι μια αποκαλυψη της ανθρωπιας Του. Η δοξα Του <προ του τον κοσμον ειναι> δειχνει οτι ειναι ο Αληθινος Θεος, και το Αγιο Πνευμα αποκαλυπτει συνεχως το γεγονος οτι ο Χριστος ειναι ο Αληθινος Θεος. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

One, as You are in Me, as I am in You, that they may be one in Us, so that the world may know that You sent Me." (St. John 17: 20-21).

To the mystery regarding the *place* of Paradise, Christ said, "This is Eternal Life, that they may know You the Only True God and Him Whom You sent, Jesus Christ." (St. John 17: 3). To the issue of Christ's identity as a Person, our Lord said, "And now glorify Me, O Father, with the glory that I have with You even before the world was made." (St. John 17:5).

Christ *is* the glory of God the Father. That He wants His glory to be made manifest to us reveals His full humanity (since He appears in human flesh). The glory that He has "even before the world was made" shows that He is True God.

The role of the Holy Spirit is to constantly reveal the fact that Christ is the True God. The greatest part of our commemoration of the Saints is that we acknowledge the fact that the Holy Spirit has guided their analysis of Holy Scripture so that there is no misinterpretation of God's teachings. It is the Holy Spirit that imparted wisdom to them and it is the Holy Spirit that continues to guide us in our lives with Godly wisdom, if only we seek it through prayer, worship and by studying the lives of the Saints and the Bible itself.

Commemoration of the Saints today is preparation for Pentecost Sunday, which will be our experience next Sunday. We will experience the hymns and prayers of the Divine Liturgy as a part of our very being—much like we experience our own breathing and the beating of our hearts. As we ask that the Holy Spirit descend upon us, our thoughts go to the Saints, as we ponder how the Holy Spirit enlightened them. We also know that we, too, can be given the same Divine wisdom for our lives.

Too often we cannot understand the answers to our prayers, because our souls are crowded with so many obstacles, such as guilt over our sins; resentment over some perceived unfairness; ambition for worldly possessions and glory, etc. We need to clean all of that out of our souls, if we are to know the answers to prayer. The prayers of Pentecost direct us to do just that. In so doing, we can find the grace of the Holy Spirit giving us new life in Christ; new hope for our future; new strength against our fears. Indeed, we always find Christ in each present moment, which always holds the balance of our lives in its hands. In every moment that we can experience the presence of Christ we also find Eternal Life and Paradise.

ANTIPHON I: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou..." (By the prayers of the Theotokos...)

Verse 1 – Oh, clap your hands, all you nations. Shout to God with the voice of rejoicing.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

<u>Verse 2-</u>For the Lord Most High is fearsome, a great King over all the earth.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas.

<u>Verse 3 —</u> He subdued the peoples under us and the nations under our feet

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

Chanter(s): Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

For, You did vanquish Hades and, uncorrupted by its touch, You came unto the Virgin Woman bestowing the gift of life, O You Who arose from the dead. Lord we give glory to You.)

<u>Hymn for the Holy Fathers</u> ... Yper-theh-doxasmenos iparcheis...(Supremely blessed are You, O Christ our God. You established the holy Fathers upon the earth as beacons, and through them You have guided us all to the true Faith, O greatly merciful One, glory be to You.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis... (Since you are a deliverer of captives and a defender of the poor; a physician for the sick and a noble attendant to kings, O Great among the Martyrs and Glorious George, intercede with Christ God that He may save our souls.)
