LIFE'S MEANING & POTENTIAL

In the Paschal Catechetical Sermon of St. John Chrysostom, which is read during the celebration of the Easter Divine Liturgy, we hear two themes: 1) there is no reason for anyone *not* to join in the celebration of Christ's Resurrection from the dead, and, 2) there is no reason for anyone to feel despair or worry.

First, St. John Chrysosotom says, "Whoever toiled from the first hour...whoever came after the third hour...whoever arrived after the sixth hour...whoever arrived only at the eleventh hour, do not be dismayed... for, the Master

receives the last even as the first..." In other words, the gates of God's Eternal Kingdom are open equally to all-both to the Apostles who followed our Lord from the very beginning, and to the thief hanging on his cross during the last moments before Christ breathed his last. Let no one think that it is ever too late to seek the salvation of his or her soul, as long as they live in this present life. There is no status, financial or legal impediment to Holy Baptism-only that one receives instruction in the Faith. Everyone is called to join in His Continued on page 2

THE WORDS "EASTER" and "PASCHA"

"Easter" is the word commonly used to refer to the celebration of the Resurrection from the dead of Jesus Christ our God. However, the word "Pascha" is liturgically more correct. The reason for this is that the word "Easter" is also associated with the Germanic idol-goddess, Ostara, who supposedly traveled through the heavens surrounded by Roman-inspired, baby-looking "putti." Pagan festivals ushering the season of Spring were associated with this.

The word "Pascha" refers to Passover. The Hebrew Passover marks the event of the Hebrew People leaving their bondage in Egypt, led by Moses, and "passing over" from slavery to the Promised Land. The Chosen People put the blood of a lamb on the door posts of their dwellings so that the "angel of death," as one of the plagues upon Pharaoh, (Ex. 12: 3-14) would *passover* their families. The Lamb of God is our Savior, by Whose Body and Blood we are rescued from death. With the Resurrection of our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ, the *permanent* Passover is that of Christ's Resurrection from the dead, by which all of humanity "passes over" from this present world to the Eternal Kingdom of God. The word "Pascha" is from the liturgical Greek, pronounced

"paw-skah." (See: Orthodox Study Bible, pg.78). +FR. THEODORE

Δηλαδη, οι πυλες της Αιωνιου Βασιλειας του Θεου ειναι ανοιχτες και για ολους – και για τους Αποστολους, οι οποιοι ακολουθουσαν τον Χριστον εξ αρχης, και για τον κακουργον κρεμαμμενον στον σταυρον του κατα τις τελευταιες στηγμες πριν <εξεπνευσεν> ο Χριστος. Ας μην νομιζει κανεις οτι ειναι ποτε αργα για να αναζητησει την σωτηριαν της ψυχης του οσο υπαρχει στην εδω ζωην.

Δευτερον, λεγει ο Αγ. Χρυσοστομος: <Μηδεις οδυρεσθω πταισματα, συγγνωμη γαρ εκ του ταφου ανετειλε. Μηδεις φοβεισθω θανατον, ηλευθερωσε γαρ ημας ο του Σωτηρος θανατος...>. Μαλιστα, οι κοσμικες δοκιμασιες και δυσκολιες δεν αξιζουν για να ενοχλησουν την ψυχην του ανθρωπου, αφου, <Ανεστη Χριστος και πεπτωκασι δαιμονες.>

Second, St. John also states: "No one need to grieve over sins; forgiveness has dawned from the tomb. Let no one fear death; the death of the Savior has freed us from it..." Indeed, the trials and tribulations that come upon us from the world around us are not of any worth over which to bring aggravation to our souls causing worry and anxiety. "Christ is Risen and the demons have fallen." Sins do weigh upon our souls, however. By saying, "no one need to grieve over sins," the word that is used in Greek, "otheerhestho," from the word "otheerhomeh," has the meaning of "grieving to despair," as if there is no hope. Yet, we should give special care to repent of our sins, because repentance in the assurance of God's forgiveness is the gift of Christ's Resurrection.

The joy that permeates St. John's Paschal Sermon is in the fact that every person born into the world is no longer a simple "caretaker of God's Garden," as is implied in the Book of Genesis with the creation of Adam and Eve, and, certainly, with Christ's Resurrection, each person is not destined to simply "exist" in God's Eternal Kingdom as something of a robot. The joy in the Resurrection of Christ is that we are now *joined* with God. We are co-creators, given everything that God has as His children: *inheritors* of God's identity and privileged to have the *potential* to do things that God does...and this is not mere "existence;" it is *Life* in His Kingdom. Thus, our lives in this present world are not simple "existences;" they are actual *lives*, meaningful to God and intertwined with the *meaning* of God's love. In Christ, God abides in us and we abide in Him.

Our individual and personal participation in the Resurrection of Christ from the dead *means* that we participate in God's glory as heirs, not as "servants" in the human sense. Our "servanthood" is the Servanthood of the Savior, Who is, at the same time, God Who, as St. Basil notes, "took on the form of a servant, becoming conformed to the fashion of our lowliness, so He could make us comformable to His glory." (St. Basil's Liturgy). Because our lives have *meaning*, there is every reason to live to our *potential*! In Christ our God, the life of each person has *meaning*, because the *potential* of each person is of God.

Keeping these thoughts in mind, as our Orthodox Church is always striving to keep them in our minds for us, serves to guide us to live out our lives sharing joy in God's love, assured that God will never call us to a task that we cannot handle, nor will any such task—especially our repentance—be meaningless in His eyes. The life of each one of us is God's Life and death is put to death.

ANTIPHON I: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou..." (By the prayers of the Theotokos...)

<u>Verse 1 – Sing</u> now to His name; give glory to His praise. Sing now to His name; give glory to His praise. *Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."*

<u>Verse 2—</u> Say to God, "How fearful are Your works; in the greatness of Your power Your enemies will lie to You."

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

Verse 3—Let all the earth worship You and sing to You; let them sing to Your name.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse -1 — May God be gracious to us, and bless us; may He cause His face to shine upon us. That we may know His way on the earth, Your salvation among all the Gentiles.</u>

Refrain: "Soson imas Yie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas Si, alleluia."

<u>Verse 2—</u>Let the peoples give thanks to You, O God; let all the peoples praise You. *Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who arose from the dead, we sing to You, Alleluia."*

<u>Verse 3 – May God bless us, and let all the ends of the earth be in fear of Him.</u> *Refrain: "Soson imas Yie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas Si, alleluia."*

Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.

People: "O Monogenis Ios ke Logos tou Theou..." (O Only-Begotten Son and Word of God...)

HYMNS FOR THE ENTRANCE WITH THE HOLY GOSPEL: ANTIPHON III

Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered, and let those who hate Him flee from before His face. As smoke vanishes, so let them vanish, as wax melts before the fire. So shall the sinners perish from the face of God. And let the righteous be glad. This is the day the Lord made; let us greatly rejoice and be glad therein.

<u>Hymn with the Entrance with the Holy Gospel: Christos Anesti</u>... (Christ is Risen from the dead; by death trampling down death and, to those in the tombs, He has bestowed life.) [Hymn for the Resurrection of Christ from the dead.)

<u>Instead of "Defte proskinisomen</u>," :En Ekklisias evlogheete ton Theon Kyrion ek pighon Israel...o Anastas ek nekron

Hymns after the Entrance with the Holy Gospel, Repeat the Hymn, Christos Anesti.

Prolavouse ton orthron... (They who were with Mary came before dawn and finding the stone rolled away from the tomb, they heard the angel say: 'Why do you seek the Living among the dead, Who dwells in the eternal Light? Behold, the grave clothes. Go in haste and declare to the world that the Lord is risen and has caused death to die; for He is the Son of God, the Savior of all humanity.)

Kontakion Hymn: **Ei ke en tafo katilthes...** (Through You, the deathless One, descended into the grave, You destroyed the power of Hades and, as Victor, You arose again, O Christ our God. You greeted the Myrrh-bearing Women, saying, 'Rejoice!' You did bestow peace upon Your Disciples and Resurrection upon the fallen.)

Instead of "Aghios o Theos:" "Osi eis Christon evaptistite, Christon enedhisasthe, Alleluia." (As many as have been baptized unto Christ, have put on Christ. Alleluia.)

READINGS: Epistle: Acts 1:1-8 / Gospel: St. John 1:1-17

The Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom is celebrated

Instead of "Axion Estin", "O Angelos evoh-a Keharitomeni..." (The Angel spoke to Her, Who is filled with grace, saying, O pure Virgin, rejoice. And I say again: rejoice; for Your son is risen from the tomb on the third day. Shine, shine, O new Jerusalem. For the glory of the Lord has risen upon You. Rejoice and be glad, O Zion, and You, O pure Theotokos, exalt in the Resurrection of Him, Whom You did bear.)

Communion Hymn: "Soma Christou..." (Receive the Body of Christ and taste Him, Who is the Fountain of Immortality. Alleluia.)


