#### **Holy Communion Order**

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

#### **ENLIGHTENMENT FROM GOD**

Metropolitan Anthony Bloom in his book entitled, *Living Prayer*, wrote the following about the blind man of today's Gospel passage: "He had used every human means to be able to see, but the blind man still remained blind. When Christ God appeared, he cried out with all of his soul, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!'... [In the same way we also reach the point of despair sometimes after we have tried, according to our own imperfect opinion, "everything."]

"If we turn ourselves toward God, realizing that only God remains, we have come to the point where we will say, 'I trust in You. I place my whole soul and my entire life into Your hands," then our despair will lead us to faith.

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"Despair is conducive to a new spiritual life when we have the courage to go deeper and farther, realizing that we have not despaired of the final victory, but of the means that we have used to reach it. Then we start on a brand new way. God can bring us back to one of the means that we

#### A DAILY MORNING PRAYER

In the Holy Tradition of the Orthodox Christian Church, prayer is central to everything that we do. Looking through one of the "official" Orthodox Christian prayer books used by the laity, as well as by monks and nuns, entitled *The Prosefchitarion* (Pro-sef-hee-ta-rion = "*The Prayer Book*"), we find this prayer to start off our day every day:

"O Lord, at every hour and in all places enlighten me to do all things that are well-pleasing to You. Grant me to greet the coming day in peace; help me in all things to rely upon Your Holy Will. Bless all of my dealings, and also all those who find themselves in my midst. Teach me to treat everything that happens throughout this day with peace of soul and with faith in You, so that, with firm conviction, I will accept that Your Will governs all. Guide my thoughts and feelings so that in all that I do and say I may lead others to know Your love and glory. Let me not forget that You will be with me in all unforeseen events, knowing that Your Will is to be done. Teach me to act with courage and with wisdom so that I may not embitter or embarrass anyone. Give me the strength to endure the fatigue of this day in the unseen warfare against temptations and deceptions that arise. Direct my will so that it is Your Will. Teach me to pray. Pray Yourself within me.

have already used, but now, together with God, we might use with success. There must always be a synergy between us and God - and then God will give us the intelligence; the wisdom; the power to do what is right and to accomplish the right goal." (pgs. 47 and 49-50).

The "right goal" is to do the Will of God. Fr. Anthony Coniaris, in his book, *Introducing the Orthodox Church*, offers these words from Arnold Toynbee: "There is a pendulum of greatness. Its movements are two: Jesus withdraws into God's presence through prayer, then returns strengthened and renewed to do God's will." (pg. 189). This is exactly our action through our personal prayers and our correct participation in the Divine Liturgy. The Divine Liturgy enlightens us and empowers us to do God's Will. The blind man of today's Gospel provides us with an example of this. After receiving his sight from our Lord, he became His disciple. As we are illumined through prayer and worship, we are to do likewise doing God's Will for others. For, indeed, the whole meaning (or "goal") of wellness in our lives is to do good deeds for others unto salvation and for God's glory.

If we study the Divine Liturgy closely, we note that, following the Nicene Creed, the priest calls the faithful to prayer as individuals "in community:" "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God the Father and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you...Let us lift up our hearts...Let us give thanks unto the Lord." In the prayer that follows, the priest gives thanks to our Lord on behalf of the faithful for, "doing all things to bring us to heaven...for benefits seen and unseen and for the Liturgy...even though [He] is surrounded by Archangels and Angels; the Cherubim and the Seraphim..." By calling to mind our Savior's words at His Last Supper, we subsequently, by the descent of the Holy Spirit, partake of Holy Communion so that, we "go forth in peace" in order that God, through us, will grant "peace to the world... [giving] "every good and perfect gift from above," so that the Name of the Lord may be blessed from "this time forth and forevermore." In short, then, the purpose of prayer is for us to work with God so that good deeds are performed for others with the goal of having all people praise the Name of our Lord in His Eternal Kingdom.

Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday: Ee Parthenos simeron ...((On this day the Virgin Maid goes to the grotto to give birth to the pre-eternal Word in an ineffable manner. Dance for joy, all the inhabited earth, on hearing. Glorify along with Angels and with the shepherds Him who willed that He appear as a newborn Child, the pre-eternal God.)




