PUTTING SIN TO DEATH

The excuses that we give as reasons for not praying; for not participating in worship; for not choosing our words carefully and for not behaving properly, are based on the idea that we do not need to repent from such sins that are considered to be "only human."

In his Epistle to the Colossians, St. Paul lists sins which are to be put to death, as he puts it, through repentance and the resolve to not commit these sins again.

Sin darkens our true humanity, because "little sins" and sins "that are only human" multiply and grow becoming *grave* sins, from which arise major conflicts and even wars.

"Sins of thought" are: evil desires; jealousy; lustfulness; wrath and hatred. "Sins of deed" are: gossip, hate speech, abuse and falsehood.

For us to put to death these "onlyhuman" sins, a total change of attitude towards God and our fellow

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SUNDAY OF THE HOLY FOREFATHERS

On the Sunday that occurs on or immediately after December 11th every year, we commemorate Christ's forefathers according to the flesh, both those that came before the Law, and those that lived after the giving of the Law.

Special commemoration is made of the Patriarch Abraham, to whom the promise was first given, when God said to him, "In thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed" (Gen. 22:18). This promise was given some two thousand years before Christ, when Abraham was seventy-five years of age. God called him and commanded him to forsake his country, parents, and kinsmen, and to depart to the land of the Canaanites. When he arrived there, God told him, "I will give this land to thy seed" (Gen. 12:7); for this cause, that land was called the "Promised Land," which later became the country of the Hebrew people, and which is also called Palestine by the historians. There, after the passage of twenty-four years, Abraham received God's law concerning circumcision. When Abraham was 100 years old and is wife, Sarah was 90, they became the parents of Isaac. Having lived 175 years altogether, he reposed in peace, a venerable elder of many years.

Οι δικαιολογίες που αναφέρουμεν ως λόγους γιά τους οποίους δεν προσευχόμεθα...δεν εκκλησιαζόμεθα...δεν προσέχουμεν τα λόγια μας και τις πράξεις μας, ριζόνονται στην γνώμην ότι δεν έχει ο άνθρωπος ανάγκην να μετανοήσει από <ανθρώπινες αμαρτίες.>

Στην επιστολήν του προς τους Κολασσαείς, ο Αγιος Παύλος αραδιάζει αμαρτίες που πρέπει να <θανατώσουμεν,> διά μέσων της μετανοίας και των προσπαθειών μας να μην ξανα-κάνουμεν αυτές τις αμαρτίες. Οι αμαρτίες τις οποίες ανέφερε ο Αγιος Παύλος θεωρούνται, ίσως, ως <ανθρώπινες> αμαρτίες – δηλ., αμαρτίες τις οποίες όλοι πράττουν. Η αμαρτία, όμως, αμαυρώνει την αληθινήν μας ανθρωπότηταν, διότι οι <μικρές> και <ανθρώπινες> αμαρτίες, ακόμη, πολλαπλασιάζονται και γίνονται μεγάλες αμαρτίες, από τις οποίες έρχονται ολόκληρες διχόνοιες και πολέμους.

Είναι <αμαρτίες διαλογισμών> και <αμαρτίες πράξεων.> Οι <αμαρτ- ιές διαλογισμών> είναι: η κακή επιθυμία, η ζήλια, η ακαθαρσία, ο θυμός, ο μίσος. Οι <αμαρτίες πρά-ξεων> είναι: η κουτσομπολιά, η άσχημη συζήτησις, η κατάχρησις, το ψεύδος.

Γιά να θανατώσουμεν αυτές τις αμαρτίες, είναι ανάγκη να αλλά-ξουμεν την ολόκληρην μας στά-σην προς τον Θεόν και προς τον συνάνθρωπόν μας. Αυτό γίνεται διά μέσου πραγματικής μετανοίας, η οποία περιλαμβάνει μιά ασκητικήν ζωήν, η οποία επίσης περιλαμβάνει μελέτην της Αγίας Γραφής και τα γραπτά των Αγίων...την καθημερινήν προσευχήν και την υπακοήν προς τις συμβουλές των πνευματικών αρχηγών μας και τις διδασκαλίες της Εκκλησίας. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

human being is needed. This happens through sincere repentance, which includes spiritual effort and involves study of Holy Scripture and the writings of the Church's Saints, as well as daily prayer, and obedience to the advice of those who are spiritually mature (priests, parents, elders), as well as obedience to the overall teachings of the Church.

Responding to our Lord's invitation to participate in His Heavenly Banquet (the Divine Liturgy) is a matter of understanding that sin prevents us from the blessing of this Banquet, which is indeed life itself. If we do not want to fully participate in the Divine Liturgy, how do we expect to participate in the Eternal Banquet? Rejecting His Kingdom is a matter of selling our souls in exchange for temporary benefits - and, to the extreme - selling our souls to evil forces. How many times have people committed terrible crimes over earthly territory, or for "the family," or for personal aggrandizement?!

The excuses offered in our Lord's Parable from today's Gospel passage involve the following "reasons" for rejecting God: 1. The importance of property; 2. the importance of laws and "tools" for status and prosperity; 3. the importance of "the family."

- 1."The piece of ground" is concern over possessions. The ground and the crops it yields are God's property, which will exist well after we leave this present life. as noted in the Parable of the rich man who wanted to build bigger barns.
- 2. "The five yoke of oxen" is concern over the law and our "tools of labor" that supposedly guarantee our social status and dreams of self-sufficiency -- the which give rise to various deceptive fantasies.
- 3. The "wife" is concern for "the family." By making "the family" more important than God, people lose spouses and children to the vices of this world.

Rejecting God in favor of these concerns turns us into idol-worshipers. In losing God, we lose our personal relationships and our moral compass. This is the spiritual death in this life to which sin leads us. In essence, as St. Paul suggests, either we allow sin to put *us* to death, or we put *sin* to death. Putting sin to death is done by working with Christ our God, Who is always inviting us to join Him at His Heavenly Banquet.

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

Hymn for the Holy Forefathers: En pisti tous Propatores...(By faith You justified the Forefathers, having through them betrothed to yourself the Church that came out of the nations. The saints are boasting in glory; for the glorious fruit, the Virgin who without seed gave birth to You, is from their progeny. At their entreaties, O Christ our God, save our souls.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis...(Since you are a deliverer of captives and a defender of the poor; a physician for the sick and a noble attendant to kings, O Great among the Martyrs and Glorious George: intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday: Ee Parthenos Simeron ...(On this day the Virgin Maid goes to the grotto to give birth to the pre-eternal Word in an ineffable manner. Dance for joy, all the inhabited earth, on hearing. Glorify along with Angels and with the shepherds Him who willed that He appear as a newborn Child, the pre-eternal God.)
