Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

DEFENDING ORTHODOXY

The words of St. Paul to Titus, which we heard during the reading of the Holy Epistle passage today, are words not only directed to Titus, but to all of us in our present society.

St. Paul tells us to avoid useless discussions about ideologies and laws, which have nothing to do with the teachings of Christ's Gospel. He says, "for a heretic, after trying to instruct him once or twice, have nothing more to do with him." (Titus 3:10).

The Saints of the Early Church would explain that a "heretic" was one who decided on his or her own which teachings of the Bible to observe and which teachings not to observe. However, a faithful Christian is responsible to always observe all the teachings of Christ our God. Whoever believes only in some of God's teachings causes division throughout the entire Christian community.

We live in a time when many of our faithful do not know the teachings of Continued on Page 2

SPIRITUAL WARFARE & THE TEACHINGS OF THE CHURCH --When we consider accurately the Orthodox Christian teaching and mentality, humanity is not depraved, nor is human nature itself sinful. The rules of the Church are geared to bring the best out of people through repentance, rather than to degrade or devalue them because of sins.

Let's look at St. Paul's words to the Romans: "We know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. For what I am doing, I do not understand. For what I will to do, that I do not practice; but what I hate, that is what I do. If, then, I do what I will not to do, I agree with the law that it is good. But now, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me." (Romans 7:14-17). Sin "dwells" in us as a result of our poor choices and the desire to be neglectful of God. We were not created to be sinful. According to Orthodox theologians, "The Orthodox Church rejects any teaching that Man has a 'sin-nature', or that Man's nature is depraved to the core...Sin is something distinct from our nature. Because we are created in the image of God, there is an indelible goodness in our nature that can never be undone. While we can become immersed in sin, we know that it is still not part of our nature,...Thus, sin is what we do, not what we are." (see The Orthodox Study Bible, pg. 1534). Otherwise, we could do nothing good.

This, then, is the principle for "spiritual warfare" to which St. Paul is alluding in his struggle to do what he knows he should, but often does not. We turn to our Savior Who enlightens us. +FR. THEODORE

Τα λογια του Αγιου Παυλου προς τον Τιτον, τα οποια ακουσαμεν κατα την αποστολικην αναγνωσιν, απευθυνονται, οχι μονον προς τον Τιτον, αλλα προς ολους μας της σημερινης εποχης.

Οι Πατερες της Εκκλησιας εξηγουσαν οτι <0 αιρετικος ανθρωπος> ειναι εκεινος ο οποιος διαλεγει μονος του ποιες διδασκαλιες του Χριστου θελει να τηρηση και ποιες δεν θελει να τηρηση. Ο πιστος Χριστιανος, ομως, ειναι υπευθυνος να τηρηση καθημερινως την ολοκληρην διδασκαλιαν του Χριστου. Οποιος πιστευει μονον σε μερικες διδασκαλιες χωριζει την κοινοτητα των πιστων.

Ζουμεν σε εποχην στην οποιαν υπαρχουν πολλοι οι οποιοι δεν εξευρουν καθολου την διδασκαλι—αν της Εκκλησιας μας. Μερικοι πιστευουν σε μαγειες και δεισιδαι—μονιες οι οποιες δεν εχουν καμιαν σχεσιν με την Ορθοδοξον Πιστιν. Αλλοι δεν πιστευουν στα Μυστη—ρια της Εκκλησιας οπως πρεπει. Και, ομως, λεγουν οτι ειναι Ορθο—δοξοι Χριστιανοι.

Σημερα καθως μνημονευουμεν τους Πατερες της Ζης Οικουμεν- ικης Συνοδου, ας ξανα-νεωσουμεν το ζηλον μας να μαθουμεν *ολες* τις διδασκαλιες της Εκκλησιας μας και ας κανουμεν καθε προσπα-θειαν να εφαρμοσουμεν τις διδασκαλιες της Εκκλησιας μας στις καθημερινες υποθεσεις μας. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

our Orthodox Church. There are some who believe in magic and in superstitions, which are not at all part of our Orthodox Faith. Others do not properly understand or believe in the Sacramental Life of the Church—and yet they say that they are Orthodox Christians. As we commemorate the Saints of the Seventh Ecumenical Council today, let us renew our zeal to learn *all* of the teachings of our Church and let us make every effort to live the Orthodox way of life.

Christians today face much the same heresies as did the early Christians. While the early Christians dealt with Gnosticism, Arianism and paganism; we deal with materialism, secularism and atheism on many levels. In his book entitled, Secular Humanism: An Orthodox Perspective, Fr. John Bockman writes: "Secular Humanism is at least in part a revival and extension into the present of the fifth-century heresy of Pelagianism, a fatal misconception of the relationship between God and man. To assert, as did Pelagius (c. 354-418 A.D.), that man has perfect freedom of will and can achieve righteousness by his own efforts is to contradict the fundamental truth that God is the giver of all good. The Pelagians rejected the Orthodox doctrine that the Son of God became flesh to save man, holding instead that man needs no Savior. Ultimately, the logic of Pelagianism effectively eliminates the need even for God." (pg.38-39).

In essence, the thinking of Pelagius was not much different from that of the ancient Greek agnostic, Protagoras, who coined the phrase: "Man is the measure of all things." It provides a basis to the secularism of our time. Secularism is a word which means that God is not part of our daily picture. "The world" is not God's world. Accordingly, we are not God's people. Hence, according to Secular Humanists, it is justifiable to remove God's teachings from the fabric of American life. It would seem that the maxim, "Man is the measure of all things," appears to be a popular doctrine of today.

We are called upon to counter and rebut such heresies. If we do not, we will fail to preach the truth of our Apostolic Orthodox Christian Faith. We can do this by learning about our Orthodox religion, by reading books related to the teachings of our Church; books explaining the meaning of our Orthodox practice. Our complacency and negligence in this regard require our repentance and our willingness to teach aright the Word of God's Truth.






