## **Holy Communion Order**

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

#### THE LIGHT OF CHRIST

St. Paul's conversion from persecutor of Christ to Apostle of Christ reveals the truth of Christ's Resurrection from the Dead. Also, it verifies in fact that He is the Light of the world.

Liturgically, this reality is proclaimed as the priest passes through the Royal Gate of the Altar and imparts the Paschal Light to the faithful, lighting their candles as the hymn is chanted: "Come receive the Light from the Unwaning Light and glorify Christ Who is Risen from the dead." Through the action of the priest in imparting this Light to the faithful

and, through this simple hymn, our Church seeks to draw Her people into the *experience* of Christ's Resurrection from the dead. Indeed, the *living and personal experience* of Christ's Resurrection serves to convert a person to the fullness of the truth. This is very evident in the life of St. Paul and it is St. John Chrysostom who makes note of this.

In his "Homily 19: On the Acts of the Apostles," St. John comments on the conversion of St. Paul, from being the great persecutor of Christians, known to all at the time as *Continued on page 2* 

# THE GOSPEL PASSAGE FOR THE SERVICE OF THE RESURRECTION OF OUR SAVIOR, JESUS CHRIST

"When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back —it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, he is not here; see the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you." And they went out and fled from the tomb; for trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to any one, for they were afraid."

--St. Mark 16: 1-8

Η μετατροπή του Αγ. Παύλου από το να είναι διωγμός του Χριστού στο να είναι Απόστολος του Χριστού αποκαλύπτει την αλήθειαν της Αναστάσεως εκ των νεκρών του Χριστού. Επίσης, διαπιστώνει το γεγονός ότι ο Χριστός είναι το Φως του κόσμου.

Απο λειτουργικήν άποψην, αυτή η πραγματικότης ανακυρήσσεται καθώς ο ιερεύς περνά από την Ωραίαν Πύλην και μεταδίδει το Φως του Πάσχα, φωτίζοντας τα κεριά των πιστών καθώς ψάλλει: <Δεύτε λάβετε Φῶς ἐκ τοΰ άνεσπέρου φωτός καί δοξάσατε Χριστόν τον Άναστάντα έκ νεκρῶν.> Διά μέσου αυτής της δράσεως του ιερέως και αυτού του απλού ύμνου, η Εκκλησία μας επιδιώκει να προσελκήσει τους πιστούς της στην εμπειρίαν της Αναστάσεως. Μάλιστα, η προσωπική και ζωντανή εμπειρία της Αναστάσεως του Χριστού επιτρέπει την μετατροπήν του ανθρώπου προς την πληρότηταν της αληθείας. Αυτό είναι πολύ εμφανές στην ζωήν του Απ. Παύλου (Πραξ. 9: 3-9), και ο Αγ. Ιωάννης ο Χρυσόστομος το σημειώνει, λέγοντας: <Τώρα ο Αγιος Παύλος (ο πρώην Σαούλ) μετατρέπεται και είναι πεπεισμένος περί της Αναστάσεως του Χριστού] Και ποιός τον έπεισε – μάλιστα, όχι μόνον τον έπεισε –αλλά αμέσως τον ενέπνευσε μέχρι σημείον που αναζητούσε τον Αναστημένον Χριστόν; Και πως έτσι που τόσο ήθελε να πάει στην κόλασην ακόμη γιά να δοξάσει τον Χριστόν; Η αλήθεια περί της Αναστάσεως είναι φανερή. (Η Πλήρης Συλλογή Ομιλιών του Αγίου Ιωάννου του Χρυσοστόμου. Toronto, Canada, σελ. 1666). Ας δοξάσουμεν και εμείς τον Αναστημένον Χριστόν ακολουθώντας το παράδειγμα του Αγίου Παύλου.

+Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

Saul, to becoming St. Paul, an Apostle of Christ. His conversion event is recorded in the Book of Acts (9: 3-9): "As he [St. Paul, formerly known as Saul,] journeyed he came near Damascus and suddenly a light shone around him from heaven. Then he fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?' And he said, 'Who are You, Lord?' Then the Lord said, 'I am Jesus, Whom you are persecuting. It is hard for you to kick against the goads.' So he, trembling and astonished, said, 'Lord, what do You want me to do?'"

St. John's words are sharp and clear: "Here is a man [Saul, who later became known as St. Paul], who is so frantic as even to shed blood and cast men into prison, who now all at once he believes! It was not enough that he had never been in Christ's company. He had been warring against the believers with vehement hostility: he left to none the possibility of going beyond him in fury: none of them could be so violent. But when he was blinded [having fallen to the ground] then he saw the proofs of Christ's Sovereignty and loving kindness: then, he answered, saying, 'Lord what do you want me to do? [This man] would not have been changed had this not happened so that all would be bound to believe...He had no intercourse with any of the believers; it was at Damascus that he was converted, or rather before he came to Damascus that this happened to him...[And now, converted and convinced of the Resurrection of Christ], Who convinced him – and not only convinced, but all at once inspired him to such ardent zeal for the Risen Christ? Wherefore was it that he wished even to go to hell itself for Christ's sake? The truth of these facts is manifest." (Complete Works of St. John Chrysostom, publ. in Toronto, Canada, pg. 1666).

The Risen Christ is indeed the Light of the world and He continues to speak to all of us. Can each of us now, like St. Paul, ask Him in prayer, saying, "Lord, what do You want me to do?" We can begin by glorifying Christ through worship and by living a life-style of Christ-like love and forgiveness, in imitation of St. Paul. Our Church gives us the words for us to loudly sing with joy: "It is the Day of the Resurrection, let us be resplendent in this Festival. Let us embrace one another and even those who do not love us, saying, 'All is forgiven in the Resurrection.' And we exclaim [to all the world]: Christ is Risen from the dead, by death trampling upon death and to those in the tombs, bestowing life." (Doxastikon of Pascha).

"To the Apostles did Jesus present Himself alive after His passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days, and speaking of the kingdom of God. And while staying with them He charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, He said, 'you heard from Me, for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit.'"

Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered, and let those who hate Him flee from before His face. As smoke vanishes, so let them vanish, as wax melts before the fire. So shall the sinners perish from the face of God. And let the righteous be glad. This is the day the Lord made; let us greatly rejoice and be glad therein.

<u>Hymn with the Entrance with the Holy Gospel: Christos Anesti</u>... (Christ is Risen from the dead; by death trampling down death and, to those in the tombs, He has bestowed life.) [Hymn for the Resurrection of Christ from the dead.)

**Instead of "Defte proskinisomen,"** :En Ekklisias evlogheete ton Theon Kyrion ek pighon Israel...o Anastas ek nekron

Hymns after the Entrance with the Holy Gospel, Repeat the Hymn, Christos Anesti.

**Prolavouse ton orthron...** (They who were with Mary came before dawn and finding the stone rolled away from the tomb, they heard the angel say: 'Why do you seek the Living among the dead, Who dwells in the eternal Light? Behold, the grave clothes. Go in haste and declare to the world that the Lord is risen and has caused death to die; for He is the Son of God, the Savior of all humanity.)

**Kontakion Hymn: Ei ke en tafo katilthes...** (Through You, the deathless One, descended into the grave, You destroyed the power of Hades and, as Victor, You arose again, O Christ our God. You greeted the Myrrh-bearing Women, saying, 'Rejoice!' You did bestow peace upon Your Disciples and Resurrection upon the fallen.)

Instead of "Aghios o Theos:" "Osi eis Christon evaptistite, Christon enedhisasthe, Alleluia." (As many as have been baptized unto Christ, have put on Christ. Alleluia.)

READINGS: Epistle: Acts 1:1-8 / Gospel: St. John 1:1-17

## The Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom is celebrated

Instead of "Axion Estin", "O Angelos evoh-a Keharitomeni..." (The Angel spoke to Her, Who is filled with grace, saying, O pure Virgin, rejoice. And I say again: rejoice; for Your son is risen from the tomb on the third day. Shine, shine, O new Jerusalem. For the glory of the Lord has risen upon You. Rejoice and be glad, O Zion, and You, O pure Theotokos, exalt in the Resurrection of Him, Whom You did bear.)

**Communion Hymn: "Soma Christou..."** (Receive the Body of Christ and taste Him, Who is the Fountain of Immortality. Alleluia.)


