Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

REJECTING THE INVITATION

The invitation to the Heavenly Banquet is the opportunity for us to have Eternal Life. Our participation in the Heavenly Banquet is on two levels: 1) in this present life, in the Divine Liturgy, and, 2) in the next life, in the Eternal Kingdom. In this life, the Heavenly Banquet is also a "spiritual clinic," preparing us for eternity with God.

Yet, *denial* of the fact that we are in need of God's guidance is one of the biggest obstacles to finding the path leading to this Banquet. At heart, the implication

in our Lord's Parable is that the rich man is an important figure (God), who loves His people so much that He prepares a banquet for them and invites them to it. The banquet is itself everlasting life.

The reason for which the invited guests rejected this invitation is that they were in denial of many realities. They were in denial that they needed God; they were in denial of the fact that the banquet was their opportunity to enjoy life to the fullest. Their denial was based on their perception *Continued on page 2*

BREAD AND WINE

"A great Russian poet, though not a faithful believer, once said, 'Every time the priest celebrates the Divine Liturgy, he holds the whole world in his hands as if it were like an apple.' This is a reality, not simply a symbol. Our world sustains life. In accordance with the chemistry pertaining to the growth of things, bread is the 'soul-less' staff of life. Our very lives depend on bread. The 'soul-less' world becomes our alive bodies, our actual lives. If we are to consider something to be a mystery, this whole world is supported, first and foremost, as the result of this on-going transformation [from a simple wheat plant into a human life]. When we offer bread and wine and place them on the Holy Altar, not only do we place before us the image of our offering with the offering of Christ, which He made 2,000 years ago, but we place before us this offering as being the reality of the physical basis of our human lives, as it was even in the beginning...

"God created the world and gave it to human beings so that they could eat and drink -- [survive, live and rejoice with gratitude]. The world is God's gift to humanity and it exists not for His own pleasure, but so that it can be transformed by us and become life itself, to be returned with thanksgiving as a gift to God... and only through Christ can the dark, pre-historical ocean become the living water of new life -- Holy Baptism."

Η πρόσκλησίς μας για τον Επουράνιον Δείπνον (τον Μυστικόν Δείπνον) του Κυρίου είναι η ευκαιρία γιά να κληρονομήσουμεν την Αιώνιον Ζωήν. Ωστόσο, η άρνησις της πραγματικότητος ότι χρειαζόμεθα τις ευλογίες του Θεού ως καρποί της μετανοίας είναι ένα από τα μεγαλύτερα εμπόδια επάνω στον δρόμον που οδηγεί προς τον Παράαδεισον.

Η συμμετοχή μας στον Αγιον αυτόν Δείπνον είναι σε δύο επίπεδα: 1) στην παρούσαν ζωήν, διά μέσου της Θ. Λειτουργίας και, 2) στην επόμενην ζωήν, στην Αιώνιον Βασιλείαν του Χριστού. Σε αυτήν την επίγειον ζωήν ο Μυστικός Δείπνος είναι επίσης μιά <πνευματική κλινική> προετοιμάζοντάς μας γιά την αιωνιότηταν με τον Κύριον. Δυστυχώς, οι προσκεκλησμένοι επισκέπτες προς τον Δείπνον, σύμφωνα με την Παραβολήν του Κυρίου απέρριψαν την πρόσκλησίν των με βάσην στην γνώμην ότι τα υλικά και σωματικά υπάρχοντά των είχαν μεγαλύτερη αξίαν από την πρόσκλησην που έλαβαν γιά να συμμετέχουν στον Δείπνον του Κυρίου.

Αλλά, η χάρις του Μυστικού Δείπ-νου είναι η συγχώρησις των αμα-ρτιών μας. Η συγχώρησις από τον Θεόν είναι ευκαιρίαν να ασπασθούμεν την ευχαριτημένην ζωήν εν Χριστώ. Ο Σταυρός είναι η πρόσκλησίς μας διά του Οποίου έχουμε την ευκαιρίαν να παραδεχώμεθα, αντί να αρνούμεθα, την πραγματικότηταν ότι έχουμεν αμαρτίες, και να μετανοήσουμεν τις αμαρτίες μας διά της αγάπης του Χριστού.

that their lands and oxen are all they needed in order to meet the "demands" of the world in pleasing a "wife" - and, by extension, raising a family. Ironically, these guests were also in denial of the fact that their hopes and dreams were subject to the whims of Roman taxation, which is why they were waiting for the Messiah in the first place.

Being in denial gives rise to fantasies that offer fleeting comforts. Fantasies are what keep our Coachella Valley casinos going. Indeed, gamblers fantasize about winning the jackpot with only the throw of the dice. The reality is that jackpots are never enough to buy the love for which people crave and too often jackpots are never enough to eventually avoid bankruptcy. Yet, tell a gambler to stop gambling and he or she will probably insist that they have no problems. The same is true with alcoholics and addicts who live in denial that their lives are unmanageable.

Jackpots and material things do not define our value. However, the invitation to the Heavenly Banquet is confirmation of our inherent value. Christ is the God Who finds us--you and me-worthy enough to die for. In this, not only are our false ideas and misbehaviors of the past forgotten, but Christ our God welcomes us now as equals in dignity, gracing us with His divine energies made evident through the miracles of many of our Saints -- men and women of every race, age and nationality.

Forgiveness by God is the opportunity that we have to embrace a meaningful life. The Cross is the opportunity to accept, rather than to deny, our need for God's Wisdom and, with Christ's love, to acquire lasting peace and happiness. The Cross is the invitation to the Heavenly Banquet and the opportunity of a life time.

EPISTLE: 2 Timothy 1:8-18 — Timothy, my son, do not be ashamed then of testifying to our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel in the power of God, who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not in virtue of our works but in virtue of his own purpose and the grace which he gave us in Christ Jesus ages ago, and now has manifested through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. For this gospel I was appointed a preacher and apostle and teacher, and therefore I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that Day what has been entrusted to me. Follow the pattern of the sound words which you have heard from me, in the faith and love which are in Christ Jesus; guard the truth that has been entrusted to you by the Holy Spirit who dwells within us. You are aware that all who are in Asia turned away from me, and among them Phygelos and Hermogenes. May the Lord grant mercy to the household of Onesiphoros, for he often refreshed me; he was not ashamed of my chains, but when he arrived in Rome he searched for me eagerly and found me - may the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that Day and you well know all the service he rendered at Ephesos.

Therefore cease not interceding for us who loyally honor your blessed contest of martyrdom.)




