Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

PROPER GIVING

Over the past several years studies indicate that we were made by our Creator to follow Christ - that it is in our biology. A few years ago a post from Psychology Today pointed out the following: "A 2007 study published in the Journal of Science found donating to a charity activates neural activity in areas of the brain to reward that are linked cessing." (Psychology Today, Nov. 22, 2017, "Giving is Good for You"). In his book, Medicine, Religion, and Health, Herold G. Koenig cited a study, saying,

"Helping others was significantly correlated with better mental health, even after controlling for age, gender, stressful life events, income,..." (pg. 143).

So, in reference to today's Gospel passage, when Jesus asked the ruler of the synagogue to give to the poor and to follow Him, it was a request made on the basis of divine love for this man. The Creator knows what is best, because we were created to give and to follow Christ our God and Savior.

"HOLY, HOLY, LORD OF SABBAOTH" -- During the Divine Liturgy, just before the Holy Gifts are sanctified and become the very Body and Blood of Christ our God, the Prayer of Thanksgiving is read, in which God is praised and we offer thanks for all that has been accomplished for our salvation...even though He is "surrounded by thousands of Archangels and tens of thousands of Angels, the Cherubim and the Seraphim, six-winged, many-eyed, soaring with their wings." This part of the Divine Liturgy is taken directly from the Bible.

In his Epistle to the Hebrews, St. Paul notes that liturgical worship is not only done on earth, but is done in Heaven ("Thy Will be done on earth as it is in Heaven..."). In other words, the earthly place of worship is to be a "a copy and shadow of the heavenly things" (Hebrews 8:5). In the Book of Revelation, St. John the Evangelist writes: "I was in the Spirit on the Lord's Day" and he heard the same Angelic hymn that the Prophet Isaiah heard: "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty" (Revelation 4:8 and Isaiah 6: 1-3).

The hymn, "Holy, Holy, Holy" is sung just prior to the consecration of the Holy Gifts, because Holy Communion is our personal encounter on earth and at the same time in Heaven with the True God of the Old and New Testaments, Who is Jesus Christ our Savior.

Πολλές ψυχολογικές έρευνες δείχνουν σήμερα ότι ο Δημιουργός μας εδημούγησε έτσι ώστε να ακολουθήσουμεν τον Σωτήραν μας Χριστόν, διά Του Οποίου γνωρίζομεν την ψυχικήν μας ανάγκην να προσφέρουμεν έργα αγάπης στους συνανθρώπους μας.

Οπως ακούσαμεν από την σημερινήν περικοπήν εκ του κατά Λουκάν Ευαγγελίου, ο Χριστός επαρεκάλησε έναν πλούσιον άνθρωπον να δώσει τα υπάρχοντά του στους πτωχούς και να Τον ακολουθήσει. Διά μέσου αυτού του ανθρώπου, ο Χριστός ζητά από τον καθέναν μας να Τον ακολουθήσουμεν, διότι εάν τα έργα μας δεν σχετίζονται με το κίνητρο της ευχαριστίας μας προς τον Θεόν, κινδυνευώμεθα να κάνουμεν <καλά έργα> για λάθος λόγους, μολυσμένους με την υπερηφάνειαν.

Ενα παράδειγμα <δικαίας δωρεάς> είναι ο Αγιος Νικόλαος, τον οποίον θα μνημονεύουμεν τις 6 Δεκεμβρίου. Εδωσε με μυστικό τρόπον τεράστιες ποσότητες από τα πλούτη του με τον σκοπόν ότι οι δέκτες των δώρων του θα αισθανόνταν ότι τα δώρα ερχόνταν αποκλειτικός από τον Χριστόν. Στην ουσίαν, όμως, ο,τι έδωσε ο Άγιος Νικόλαος το έδωσε στο <πνεύμα> να <μην εξεύρει το αριστερό χέρι το τι κάνει το δεξί,> έτσι ώστε να τιμήσουν όλοι τον Χριστόν, παρά αυτόν.

Τα κίνητρά μας προέρχονται από μέσα από το πλαίσιον της πίστε— ώς μας και της αγάπης μας γιά τον Χριστόν. Διά της πίστεως και της αγάπης μας εν Χριστώ τα έργα που είναι γιά τους ανθρώπους αδύνατα είναι στην πραγματικότηταν δυνατά επειδή <τά ἀδύνατα παρά ἀνθρώποις δυνατά παρά τῷ Θεῷ.> (Λκ. 18:27).

our Creator to be charitable, we would be foolish to assume that our ability to give is the result of our own greatness. There is wisdom in our Lord's request for the ruler to "follow Him." Through this ruler, Christ our God asks each of us to follow Him. At the same time, unless our giving is related to the motive of giving thanks to God in all that we do, we are in danger of giving for the wrong reasons, tainted with pride.

An example of "righteous giving" is St. Nicholas, commemorated on December 6th. He gave vast amounts of his wealth in secret, because he wanted to have recipients of his charity assume that their gifts were strictly from Christ our God. His "secret" was finally exposed by the poor father of 3 daughters who, had they not received ample monies, would have been lured into a life of sin, rather to marry honorably. St. Nicholas, among many Saints (St. Nectarios, for example), gave in the spirit of "the left hand not knowing what the right hand does," so that, instead of themselves being honored, people would honor Christ.

Yet another example for us to follow is that of St. Paul. His personal encounter with the risen Christ was a blessing for which he would be forever grateful and which is expressed as the divine love defined in his First Epistle to the Corinthians (13: 4-8). It is a love, as St. Paul says, that "does not seek its own" -- and, consistent with this understanding, we hear the words of St. Paul today from his Epistle to the Ephesians: "By grace you have been saved through faith; and it is not your own doing, it is the gift of God: not because of works, lest anyone should boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them." (Ephesians 2: 6-10).

As Thanksgiving and Christmas loom into our future this year, let us remember to live for Christ in every aspect of our lives, so that our material "gift-giving" is not undermined by self-serving motives. Pure motives come only from our willingness to follow Christ with love based on faith which says, that, while many things may be impossible for us, "they are possible with God." (Luke 18: 27).

<u>Verse 1</u>--Great is the Lord and exceedingly praiseworthy.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

Verse 2- Glorious things were said concerning you, O city of God. God is known in her palaces.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas.

Verse 3- As we heard, so we saw.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

Chanter(s): Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1-</u> The Most High sanctified His tabernacle. Holiness and majesty are in His holy place.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Verse 2 - This is the gate of the Lord; the righteous shall go in through it.</u>

Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who Arose from the dead; we sing to You, Alleluia."

<u>Verse 3 -</u> Holy is Your temple, wondrous in righteousness.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Doxa Patri ke Yio ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous aonas ton aonon. Amin.</u> "O Monogenis Yios ke Logos tou Theou..."

ANTIPHON III- The rich among the people shall entreat your favor. All her glory as the King's daughter is within, adorned and embroidered with golden tassels. The virgins behind her shall be brought to the King.

<u>Sunday Resurrection Hymn</u>: Angelike dynameis (Tone 6)... (When the angelic powers appeared at Your tomb and those who guarded You became as though dead and standing by Your sepulcher was Mary seek-ing Your pure and sacred body. For, You did vanquish Hades and, uncorrupted by its touch, You came unto the Virgin Woman bestowing the gift of life, O You Who arose from the dead. Lord we give glory to You.)

<u>Hymn for the Presentation of the Theotokos</u>...Simeron tis evdhokias Theou...(Today is the prelude of God's good pleasure, and the proclamation of humanity's salvation. In the temple of God, the Virgin is presented openly, and in herself she announces Christ to all. Let us, then, with a great voice cry aloud to her: "Rejoice, you are the fulfillment of the Creator's dispensation.")

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis... (As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of kings, bearer of trophies are you, O Great Martyr George, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday: O katharotatos nah-ohs... (The Savior's most pure and immaculate temple, the very precious bridal chamber and Virgin, who is the sacred treasure of the glory of God, on this day is introduced into the House of the Lord, and with herself she brings the grace in the divine Spirit. She is extolled by the Angels of God. A heavenly tabernacle is she.)

EPISTLE - Eph. 2:4-10

Brethren, God who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up with him, and made us sit with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God: not because of works, lest any man should boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.




