#### LIVING THE LITURGY

Today's Gospel passage tells us that God is Jesus Christ is God - "The Life and Resurrection" of all people in the world. This fact is what propelled the Holy Apostles to preach the Gospel to the whole world. For the Apostles, the word "preach" is not confined to verbal exhortations; it involves worship, and, worship, in turn, involves a life-style based on a world-view, according to which, the "world" includes God's Eternal Kingdom. Their thoughts, words and deeds are embodied in the Sacra-

ment of Holy Communion.

The Divine Liturgy is "God-centered work," coming from the Greek words for "divine" and "work." By extension, the Divine Liturgy, far from being a "performance" is a life-style. In his book, The Apostolic Gospel, Fr. Theodore Stylianopoulos notes, "St. Paul envisions life as a complete whole. The new life is marked by definite features: the redemptive paradigm of cross and resurrection; the centrality of love; a profound sense of holiness; the principle of mutual edification; and fervent prayer and worship, including Continued on page 2

#### Holy Communion Order

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

WHAT DOES GOD WANT ME TO DO? — This question often arises from the deepest part of our souls, especially when we find ourselves at "cross-roads" in our lives. Way back in 1992 a publication appeared from the "Documents in Preparation for the Tenth All American Council of the Orthodox Church in America," with these words of advice: "Discernment of God's Will must be approached from two perspectives, personal and corporate. Each one is essentially "of the Church." We can make no decision touching upon our own life or the life of another person that does not have consequences for the entire Body of Christ. On both the personal and the communal level, discerning God's Will has more to do with an attitude of heart than with knowledge or rational understanding. We cultivate the attitude of our heart by actively devoting ourselves to the spiritual life — prayer, Scripture reading, repentance, and seeking guidance. If we honestly follow this path, the fruits of the Spirit increase in us and we are conformed to the mind of Christ (Phil 1:2)...

"[Often] we pray...and yet God seems to remain silent. God's apparent silence can be men most appropriately by assuming a silence of our own. Inner silence is the necessary condition for prayer, repentance, and the 'purity of heart' that enables us to 'see' God and 'hear' His word, as the psalmist says, 'I have calmed and quieted my soul...(Ps 131:2)." +FR. Παυλος συνοψιζει τον τροπον ζωης του Χριστιανου, λεγοντας, <Χριστω συνεσταυρωμαι, ζω δε ουκετι εγω, ζη δε εν εμοι ο Χριστος. (Γαλ. 2:20). Η λειτουργικη εκφωνησις που μεταφερει το νοημα αυτου που λεγει ο Αγιος Παυλος ειναι, <Τα Σα εκ των Σων, Σοι προσφερωμεν κατα παντα και δια παντα.> Δηλαδη, μια ζωη αφιερωμενη στον Θεον, δια μεσου της οποιας προσφερουμεν ολες τις ευλογιες Του προς το καθε καλο για ολους ειναι η ζωη της Θειας Λειτουργιας, δια της οποιας κληρονομουμεν την αιωνιον ζωην.

Η Θ. Λειτουργια ειναι κατα βαθος η εκπληρωσις του σκοπου της ζωης μας – η ενωνις με τον Θεον. Δια μεσων της προσευχης και της λατρειας διαμορφωνουμεν τις ψυχες μας ετσι ωστε να κανουμεν τα εργα του Θεου. notably the rites of Baptism and the Lord's Supper." (pg. 69). In saying this, Fr. Stylianopoulos properly emphasizes that the Divine Liturgy is a matter of *living the Bible*, which involves *all* aspects of our daily lives:

- 1) "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who lives, but Christ lives in me." (Galatians 2:20). The Liturgical words that convey the meaning of St. Paul's words are, "We offer to You these Gifts from Your own Gifts in all and for all" ("Thine own of Thine own...") in all that we do and for all people everywhere.
- 2) "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging symbol...Though I have all faith, but have not love, I am nothing." (1 Corinthians 13:1 -2). The Liturgical words that convey the meaning of these words are, "Let us love one another, that with one mind we may confess..."
- 3) "For God did not call us to uncleanness, but to holiness." (1 Thessalonians 4:7). In the Divine Liturgy we hear these words, "Let us attend! Holy Gifts for the holy people of God."
- 4) "Let no one seek his own, but each one the other's well-being." The Divine Liturgy conveys the meaning of these words thus: "Let us commit ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ our God" and "lay aside our ["personal"] earthly cares" so that all of us can "receive the King of all" into our lives.

With the reminder from today's Gospel passage that Christ is God, Who conquered death for our Eternal Salvation, we express our gratitude through a "life-style" of prayer and worship. Through the experiences of prayer and worship, we begin to mold our minds and souls in such a way so as to perform deeds of God's love and mercy to others. Spiritual life is work on our "inner selves" for the purpose of giving the Life of Christ, from within us "outwardly" to others around us.

#### EPISTLE—2 Corinthians, 6:1-10 —




