THE JOY OF HEAVEN ON EARTH

The devil can actually surpass our personal spiritual efforts. If we are proud that we can maintain the Orthodox Christian fasting discipline, be assured that the devil maintains a fasting discipline, as well. If we would take pride living a chaste life, even as virgin monks or nuns, we would be humbled knowing that even the devil is already a virgin. If we believe that Christ is God, it is, in itself, no cause for pride; for even the devil believes that Christ is the True God. In fact, the devil and his demons

are found, as we note from today's Gospel, to speak to Christ, acknowledging Him as True God and seeking His help, allowing them to enter into the swine.

Therefore, in what way do demons differ from humans? It is exactly in the fact that we have the innate capacity to love and to express the virtue of love. It is this capacity that stands as the most important feature of our souls, the Image of God within us; for, God is love, according to St. John (1 John 4:8).

THE SAINTS COMMEMORATED TODAY: ST. GERASIMOS & ST. ARTEMIOS

Saint Gerasimos was from the Peloponnesus, the son of Demetrius and Kale, of the family of Notaras. He was reared in piety by them and studied the Sacred writings. He left his country and went throughout various lands, and finally came to Cephalonia, where he restored a certain old church and built a convent around it, where it stands to this day at the place called Omala. He finished the course of his life there in asceticism in the year 1570. His sacred relics, which remain incorrupt, are kept there for the sanctification of the faithful.

Saint Artemios lived during the years of Saint Constantine the Great, and was appointed by him to be Governor of Alexandria; later, he was honored with the rank of patrician. During the reign of Julian the Apostate, in the year 361, Artemios appeared before the Emperor and censured him for his apostasy. For this, he endured many torments and was finally beheaded.

Ο διάβολος μπορεί πραγματικά να υπερέχει τα πνευματικά μας έργα. Εάν είμεθα υπερήφανοι στο ότι μπορούμεν να νηστεύουμε, ο διάβολος νηστεύει, επίσης. Εάν είμεθα υπερήφανοι γιά την αγνίαν μας ή γιά την παρθενίαν μας, ο διάβολος είναι παρθένος ήδη. Εάν έχουμεν πίστην, ο διάβολος πιστεύει, επίσης, αφού τα δαιμόνιά του αναγνώρισαν τον Χριστόν ως Θεό, όπως καταλαβαίνουμεν από την σημερινήν Ευαγγελικήν περικοπήν που τα δαιμόνια εζήτησαν τον Κύριον να τους στείλει στους χοίρους. Και...με αυτό, καταλαβαίνουμεν ότι μπορεί ο διάβολος και τα δαιμόνιά του να ζητήσουν γιά <τα συμφέροντα τους>, επίσης.

Επομένως, τι είναι που χωρίζει τους ανθρώπους από τα δαιμόνια; Ακριβώς, είναι η έμφυτη ικανότης να αγαπάμε και την αρετήν να εκφράσουμεν την αγάπην γιά τον Θεόν και γιά άλλους. Αυτό είναι το πιό σπουδαίο στοιχείον της ψυχής, η Εικόνα του Θεού μέσα μας. Ο Θεός είναι η αγάπη, όπως το λέγει ο Αγιος Ιωάννης. (1 Ιωάν. 4:8). Μάλιστα, τα δαιμόνια αναγνωρίζουν την αλήθειαν οτι ο Χριστός είναι ο Ιδιος ο Θεός, αλλά δεν έχουν αγάπη! Εζήτησαν από τον Ιησούν την απόρριψήν Του και την άδειαν να μπουν στους χοίρους.

Η Θ. Λειτουργία είναι η ένωσίς μας με τον Θεόν. Είναι η αγάπη του Θεού γιά εμάς διά του Μονογενή Του Υιού και είναι η αγάπη μας γιά τον Θεόν. < Οὔτως ἡγάπησε ὁ Θεός τόν κόσμον...> ώστε να κληρονομήσουμεν την Αιώνιον Βασιλείαν. Ο Παράδεισος είναι μιά ζωή συνεργασίας με τον Θεόν. Και η χαρά της ζωής είναι να έχουμεν την τιμήν και την ευκαιρίαν να ευχαριστήσουμεν τον Κύριον. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

Indeed, the demons acknowledge that Christ is God, but they have no love. Their request of Jesus was a request asking in essence to be rejected by Him and to enter into the swine, which they destroyed. We must remember that God is love, and the fact that we are able to love tells us of the divine, immortal quality of our being. As God is eternal, so it is that "love never ends."

The Divine Liturgy is our union with God. It is God's love for us in the Person of His Only-Begotten Son and our love for God. "God so loved the world..." so that the Kingdom of Heaven can be ours. St. Irenaeus reminds us: "Neither shall God ever cease to benefit and enrich us, and [we who are so enriched] are grateful towards our Creator and, at the same time, vessels of God's goodness and the instruments of God's doxology." (Migne P.G, 829). Metropolitan Anthony Bloom adds: "We should recognize in the situation in which we are...the presence of the divine will, and it should be neither flight nor rebellion, but a movement guided by God, which begins with the kingdom of heaven that is within us and develops into the kingdom on earth." (Living Prayer, pg. 29). Hence, we can fully understand St. Paul's words: "[We] will be enriched in every way for generosity." (2 Corinthians 9:11).

Some say that generosity is the trademark of inner peace and joy. St. Paul would be referring to the "divine joy" in God's love, saying, "God loves the cheerful giver." (2 Corinthians 9:8). Enrichment is God's love for us; generosity is our love for God and others, expressed out of gratitude to God for enriching us. Living our lives in the context of enrichment from God's blessings; gratitude for God's blessings, and generosity in sharing God's blessings is a lifestyle that brings us cheerfulness in Christ.

In sum, Paradise is a life of being co-workers with God and the *cheerfulness* of *being alive--* i.e., to have the *honor* and the *opportunity* to be grateful to our Lord by giving to others of His blessings and a taste of "heaven on earth."

And therefore he pours out healings to those who honor him.)

<u>Hymn for St. Artemios the Martyr</u> ...O Martys Sou Kyrie...(Your Martyr, O Lord, was worthily awarded by You the crown of incorruption, in that he contested for You our immortal God. Since he possessed Your power, he defeated the tyrants, dashing the demons' powerless displays of defiance. O Christ God, at his fervent entreaties, save our souls.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis... (As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of kings, bearer of trophies are you, O Great Martyr George, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

<u>Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday</u>: Prostasia ton Christianon...(O Protection of Christians that never falls, intercession with the Creator that never fails, we sinners beg you, do not ignore the voices of our prayers. EPISTLE -2 Cor. 9:6-11... Brethren, the point is this: he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything and may provide in abundance for every good work. As it is written, "He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures for ever." He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your resources and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way for great generosity. GOSPEL-Luke. 8:26-39... At that time, as Jesus arrived at the country of the Gadarenes, there met him a man from the city who had demons; for a long time he had worn no clothes and he lived not in a house but among the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him, and said with a loud voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beseech you, do not torment me." For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many a time it had seized him; he was kept under guard, and bound with chains and fetters, but he broke the bonds

and was driven by the demon into the desert.) Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion"; for many demons had entered him. And they begged him not to command them to depart into the abyss. Now a large herd of swine was feeding there on the hillside; and they begged him to let them enter these. So he gave them leave. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and were drowned. When the herdsmen saw what happened, they fled, and told it in the city and in the country. Then people went out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had gone, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind; and they were afraid. And those who had seen it told them how he who had been possessed with demons was healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gadarenes asked him to depart from them; for they were seized with great fear; so he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but he sent him away, saying, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him.
