Holy Communion Order

- 1. Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiv-ing.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

NOW IS THE ACCEPTABLE TIME

In today's Gospel passage we heard the word "talents." It is the word that our Lord used when delivering His parable to the Disciples about the wise use of one's resources. In actuality, the word "talents" is a synonym for the word "blessings." The message from today's readings from Scripture is for us to maximize our blessings *now*! *Now* is the "acceptable time of the Lord," as St. Paul says in his Second Epistle to the Corinthians (2 Corinthians 6:1-2). That is: *"It is time for the Lord to act."* The Lord

acts through us! There are two purposes for God's blessings: 1) God's blessings provide us with the *opportunities* to do His Will and to, consequently, find our salvation, and, 2) God's blessings are "treasures" to be *shared* with others for their salvation.

The "acceptable time" to share these blessings is now. That is, the opportunity to do God's work is at this present moment. There is no excuse to wait for tomorrow, or to wallow over the errors of yesterday. Each day is itself the *opportunity* that we have

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THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST IN THE TEMPLE & THE RIGHT TO LIFE Metropolitan Hierotheos of Nafpaktos reminds us that the Feast Day of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple (which was celebrated yesterday) is a reminder of our personal union with Christ our True God. As our Savior is presented into the Temple, so too is every human being presented to God. Through the Holy Spirit, the life of Christ in human history is intertwined with each of our lives in the present and into the future. His death and Resurrection is at the same time our death and resurrection to Eternal Life with Him. Hence, the Orthodox Church has set forth the "Service of the Forty-Day Blessing for New-born Children." (A more extensive understanding of this issue is in the February *Voice.*)

At the heart of this Church Service is gratitude to God. We acknowledge that every human being who comes into the world is from God. As such, we offer prayers of thanksgiving for the birth of a child, knowing that God loves the new-born child and has a purpose for its life in the world. The celebration of our Savior's Incarnation, Baptism, and Presentation into the Temple (February 2nd) challenges every Orthodox Christian to stand up in prayer, asking our Savior to enlighten our people so that they repent by stopping to *encourage* the practice of abortion, as well as physician-assisted suicide and the taking of human life at any stage. Let us all pray for increased faith and love for God. +FR. THEODORE

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Στην σημερινήν Ευαγγελικήν περικοπήν ακούσαμεν την λέξην <τάλαντα.>Είναι η λέξις που ο Κύριος εχρησιμοποίησε όταν ομίλησε στους Μαθητάς Του σχετικά με την σωστήν χρήσην των μέσων που έχουμεν στην διαθεσήν μας γιά να πράξουμεν καλά έργα. Στην πραγματικότηταν, η λέξις <τάλαν- $\tau \alpha > έχει το ίδιο νόημα με την λέξη$ <ευλογίες.> Αυτό που μαθαίνουμεν από τις σημερινές περικοπές των Αγίων Γραφών είναι να μεγιστοποιήσουμεν τις ευλογίες μας αυτήν την στιγμήν!> Αυτή η στιγμή είναι <ὄ καίρος τοῦ ποιήσαι τῷ Κυρίφ.>

Υπάρχουν δύο σκοπούς γιά τις ευλογίες του Θεού: 1) οι ευλογίες του Θεού παρέχουν σε εμάς τις ευκαιρίες να κάνουμεν το θέλημά Του και, συνεπώς, να σώσουμεν τις ψυχές μας, και, 2) οι ευλογίες του Θεού είναι θησαυροί που μοιράζονται με τους άλλους γιά να σωθούν αυτοί.

Αυτός <Ό καιρός του ποιήσαι τῶ Κυρίω> είναι η οποιαδήποτε στιγμή της ζωής μας και η κάθε στιγμή της ζωής μας. Μάλιστα, η ευκαιρία να κάνουμεν το έργον του Θεού είναι αυτήν την στιγμήν. Δεν υπάρχει λόγος να περιμένουμεν γιά αύριο, ή να θρηνήσουμεν γιά τα χθεσινά λάθη. Κάθε ημέρα είναι ιδιαίτερη ευκαιρία να κάνουμεν όλα που διδάσκει ο Κύριος και γιά να μοιραζόμεθα τις ευλογίες Του. Γιά να μην μοιρασθούμεν τις ευλογίες που μας δίνει ο Θεός, είναι το ίδιο με το να σπαταλήσουμεν τα αγαθά του Κυρίου. Οι υπηρέτες που σπαταλούν τις ευλογίες του Κυρίου δεν υπηρετούν κανέναν! Ο,τι κάνουν είναι άχρηστο. Ας προσφέρουμεν τις καλύτερες προσπάθειές μας γιά να είμεθα καλοί υπηρέτες του Κυρίου. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

to share His blessings. For us not to share God's blessings is the same thing as wasting them. The basic reason for why we do not want to share blessings with others is our lack of faith in God. Also, we fall into the temptation of judging God, accusing Him for not being fair. But Christ our God gives blessings to us in accordance to what He wants us to do for Him and others as His servants. Not sharing God's blessings is a form of "wickedness," rendering our service to the Lord as "useless."

As to our inherent *worth* as human beings, each of us is priceless; for, Christ our True God died for the salvation of every one of us. As to our usefulness, it is a matter of our response to the blessings that Christ grants to us. When we approach the Holy Chalice, each of us is named as "the servant of God." But, we must keep in mind that a servant serves. Our identity is tied into what we do - and what we do is a matter of our choice...our use of Free Will. Dr. Henry Cloud and Dr. John Townsend argue in favor of using our Free Will to accept responsibility for our salvation. "We live in a culture of blame...[In the Parable of the Talents, we note that] the Master gives three people different amounts of resources to invest...But the third...blamed the Master for not giving him what he thought he needed to make it work, so he did nothing with what had been entrusted to him...Neither what God had given this man nor what he had not given him was the issue. The issue was just one thing: What had he done with what was given to him?" (It's Not My Fault, pgs. 7 & 18).

Because he incorrectly perceived the intentions of the Master, the "wicked servant" chose not to share his blessings with others. Incorrect perceptions distract us from our service to Christ. In the book, *Our Thoughts Determine our Lives*, Elder Thaddeus of Vitovnika counsels us to have Christ's love as our motive for everything. "Every task should be performed from the heart, for it is not for people that we are laboring, but for God...We have been given complete freedom, but we, in our foolishness, often have many useless desires." (pg. 97).

Let us begin *using blessings to bless others so that God's blessing can be multiplied.* This is the path of wellness! As Archbishop Anastasios of Albania once said, *"We find ourselves by offering ourselves."* Indeed, spiritual life is not a private matter. It is a matter of *"committing ourselves and one another and our whole lives to Christ our God."* +FR. THEODORE

<u>Verse 2-</u> My tongue is the pen of a swift-writing scribe. *Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."*

<u>Verse 3</u>— You are more beautiful than the sons of men.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen. *Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."*

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1-</u> Gird Your sword upon Your thigh, O Mighty One, in Your splendor and Your beauty. *Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O en anggales tou dhike-ou Symeon vastachtheis, psallontas si alleluia."*

<u>Verse 2 –</u> Stretch Your bow, and grant prosperity, and reign, because of truth and goodness. *Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who was held in the arms of righteous Symeon, we sing to You, Alleluia."*

<u>Verse 3 -</u> Your arrows are sharp, O Mighty One. The peoples shall fall under You. Your throne, O God, is forever and ever; Your royal scepter is a scepter of uprightness. Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O en aggales tou dhike-ou Symeon vastachtheis, psallontas si alleluia."

Doxa Patri ke Io ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous eonas ton eonon. Amin People: "O Monogenis Ios ke Logos tou Theou..." (O Only-Begotten Son and Word of God...)

ANTIPHON III: Listen, O daughter, behold and incline your ear, and forget your people and your father's house. The rich among the people shall entreat your favor. I will remember your name from generation to generation.

<u>Sunday Resurrectional Hymn</u>: Efrenestho ta ourania (Tone 3)...(Let all things above in heaven rejoice and let all things below on earth be glad. With all the might and strength of His arm, an eternal deed the Lord did per-form. Beneath His feet, He has trampled down death by death and First Born of the dead has He become. From the womb of Hades has He delivered us and to all the world has granted His great redeeming mercy.)

<u>Hymn for the Feast of the Presentation</u>: Chere ke charitomenie Theotoke... (Lady full of grace, rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, for Christ our God, the Sun of righteousness has risen from you and He illumined those in darkness. And you, righteous Elder, be glad in heart, receiving in your embraces the One who liberates our souls and bestows on us the Resurrection.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis... (As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of Kings, bearer of trophies are you O Great Martyr George. Intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

<u>Sunday Kontakion Hymn</u>: O mitran aghiasas to toko Sou...(You sanctified the virginal womb by Your birth, O Lord, and blessed the hands of Symeon fittingly, O Christ God; and even now You came and saved us. Give peace to our Nation in time of strife and empower our leaders, so loved by You, the only One Who loves humanity.)
