- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.

FROM THE MASTER'S TABLE

Faith, humility and love were among the greatest virtues of the Canaanite Woman of today's Gospel passage. These virtues are interwoven in her personality, through which a miracle occurred. St. John Chrysostom would say that it was because of her that her daughter was healed.

Love is both a passive and an active "verb." It is passive in the sense that it works to make us wise. It is active in the sense that it makes us work to do things that are good. Through love, we are able

to understand other people; to feel their pain and experience their joys. As St. Paul once said, through love, one is able to "be all things to all people." The Canaanite Woman loved her daughter so much that her daughter's pain was at the same time her own pain. In asking our Lord to heal her daughter, the Canaanite woman's words were: "Help me!"

In her love, she sought out every possible means to bring healing to her daughter. Exhausted of every other hope, this woman - an idol worshiper

ST. HARALAMBOS

Today we commemorate St. Haralambos the Holy Priest-Martyr. St. Haralambos was a priest of the Christians in Magnesia, the foremost city of Thessaly, in the diocese having the same name. He contested during the reign of Alexander Severus (222-235), when Lucian was Proconsul of Magnesia. At the time of his martyrdom the Saint was 103 years of age.

When news of his preaching reached the authorities of the area, the proconsul Lucian and military commander Lucius, St. Haralambos was arrested and brought to trial, where he confessed his faith in Christ and refused to offer sacrifice to idols. Despite his advanced age, he was tortured mercilessly. They lacerated his body with iron hooks, causing his skin to fall apart. The saint had only one thing to say to his tormentors: "Thank you, my brethren, for scraping off the old body and renewing my soul for new and eternal life."

St. Haralambos is commemorated on February 10th, with the exception when this date falls on the Saturday of the Souls preceding Lent or on Clean Monday (the first day of Lent), in which case the feast is celebrated on February 9th.

Η πίστις, η ταπεινοφροσύνη και η αγάπη ήσαν αρετές της Χαναναίας Γυναικός της σημερινής Ευαγγελικής περικοπής. Αυτές οι αρετές εσυνενώθηκαν στην προσωπικότητάν της διά μέσου της οποίας έγινε ένα θαύμα, σύμφωνα με τον Αγ. Ιωάννην τον Χρυσόστομον.

Η αγάπη είναι και παθητικό και ενεργό ρήμα. Είναι παθητικό με την έννοιαν ότι λειτουργεί γιά να μας κάνει σοφούς. Είναι ενεργό με την έννοια ότι μας κάνει να κάνουμεν καλές πράξεις. Διά μέσου της αγάπης μπορούμεν να κατανοήσουμεν άλλους ανθρώπους και να αισθανθούμεν τους πόνους των και να βιώσουμεν τις χαρές των. Είναι ο Αγ. Παύλος που είπε ότι, διά μεσου της αγάπης, ο άνθρωπος μπορεί να είναι <τα πάντα τοίς πάσιν.> Η Χαναναία αγαπούσε την κόρη της τόσο πολύ ώστε ο πόνος της κόρης της ήταν ταυτοχρόνως ο δικός της πόνος. Ζητώντας από τον Κύριον να θεραπεύσει την κόρην της, ο λόγος της Χαναναίας ήταν: <Κύριε, βοήθει μοΐ!>

Το θαύμα της ιάσεως της κόρης της Χαναναίς έγινε σύμφωνα με το Θέλημα του Θεού. Αλλά, έγινε επίσης ως αποτέλεσμα της ενώσεως της με τον Παντοδύναμον Θεόν. Τα θαύματα γίνονται διά μέσου της προσευχής μας, η οποία αποτελείται από την πίστη μας στον Θεόν, την ταπεινοφροσύνην μας ενώπιον του Θεού και την αγάπην μας γιά τον Θεόν και για τον πλησίον μας. Αυτός είναι ο λόγος γιά τον οποίον ο Αγ. Ιωάννης ο Χρυσόστομος είπε: <Δείτε πως συνέβαλε αυτή η γυναίκα στην θεραπείαν της κόρης της; Το είπε ο Χριστός: Ω Γύναι! Μεγάλη σου ή πίστις! Γενηθήτω σοῖ ὡς θέλεις.> (Ματθ. 15: 28).

herself, summoned her last ounce of faith in the "Son of David" -- a title synonymous with "Messiah." Obviously having heard that Jesus is the Messiah of the Jewish people, she considered Him to be a "god." However, idol-worshipers were not worthy of the Messiah. The Messiah was to be sent only to "the lost children of Israel." She was no more important to anyone than a simple dog. With what right does she cry after Jesus causing trouble with His Disciples?!

At some point, her love pushed her to reach out with faith. But, her faith in idols made her unworthy to seek the Lord, for, after all, it is impossible for anyone to "serve two masters." Realizing that her false gods were of no use, she humbled herself before Christ our True God. So, she agreed that she was of no more importance to anyone than a dog and her prayer was not important to the Lord. "It is not fair to take the children's bread and to cast it to the dogs," He said. Her response is in essence a confession of faith that Jesus Christ is the One True God - the Master. "But even the dogs eat from the crumbs that fall from their Master's table." This confession of faith, based on her love for her daughter and her humility before God is the energy that makes for the miracle.

This miracle was not only for the benefit of the Canaanite Woman and her daughter. Our Savior does not give blessings to people for "private use." God's blessings have a catch! God's blessings make us useful to others, which in itself further blesses us with meaning and purpose in life. Accepting God's blessings allows Him to use us for blessing others. This may mean that our personal agendas take second place for a while. That's right...in humility we are used by God. But, that is okay for those who are humble before the Lord, as was the Canaanite Woman.

Indeed, this miracle took place according to the Will of Christ our God. But, this miracle also occurred as the result of the faith, love and humility of the Canaanite Woman. This *energy* of prayer is the result of our union with Almighty God, which can only happen through faith *in* God; humility *before* God, and love *for* God and for others.

On this point, let's go back to St. John Chrysostom. Regarding the Canaanite Woman, St. John Chrysostom's full statement about her is this: "See how this woman contributed not a little to the healing of her daughter? For to this purpose...did Christ say, 'O Woman! Great is your faith. (Therefore), Let it be as you want.' (St. Matthew 15: 28)." Nicene and Post-Nicene Fathers, Vol 10; "On the Gospel of St. Matthew," Homily 52, pg. 323).

Verse 3 - The Lord prepared His throne in heaven, and His Kingdom rules over all.

Refrain: "Tes presvies tis Theotokou, Soter, soson imas."

Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Refrain: "By the prayers of the Theotokos, Savior, save us."

ANTIPHON II: "Soson imas Ie Theou..." (Save us, O Son of God...)

<u>Verse 1-</u> Praise the Lord, O my soul! I shall praise the Lord while I live; I shall sing to my God as long as I exist.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

<u>Verse 2 -</u> Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob; his hope is in the Lord his God.

Refrain: "Save us, O Son of God, Who arose from the dead, we sing to You, Alleluia."

Verse 3 - The Lord shall reign forever; your God, O Zion, to all generations.

Refrain: "Soson imas Ie Theou, O Anastas ek nekron, psallontas si alleluia."

Doxa Patri ke Io ke Aghio Pnevmati ke nin ke aei ke eis tous eonas ton eonon. Amin

People: "O Monogenis Ios ke Logos tou Theou..." (O Only-Begotten Son and Word of God...)

ANTIPHON III: This is the day the Lord made; let us greatly rejoice and be glad therein.

<u>Sunday Resurrectional Hymn</u>: To fedron tis anastaseos (Tone 4)...((When the tidings of the Resurrection from the glorious angel was proclaimed unto the women disciples and our ancestral sentence also had been abolished, to the Apostles with boasting did they proclaim that death is vanquished ever more and Christ our God has Risen from the dead and granted to the world the Great Mercy.)

Hymn for St. Haralambos: Ohs steelos aklonitos...(A pillar unshakable are you in Christ's holy Church, and, as your own name denotes, an ever radiant lamp, all-blessed Haralambos, shining throughout the whole world by your feats as a martyr, driving away the darkness of the worship of idols. With confidence, therefore, pray to Christ, entreating Him to save our souls.)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton ehmaloton eleftherotis... (As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of Kings, bearer of trophies are you O Great Martyr George. Intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

<u>Sunday Kontakion Hymn</u>: Prostasia ton Christianon...(A Protection of Christians unshamable; mediation with the Creator immovable. We sinners beg You: do not despise the voices of our prayers, but anticipate, since You are good, and swiftly come unto our aid as we cry out to You with faith: Hurry to intercession; and hasten to supplication, O Theotokos, Who defends at all times those who honor You.)
