SUNDAY OF THE PHARISEE & THE PUBLICAN

PREPARING TO BE HUMBLE

There is a reason for why this week ahead of us is a "fast-free" week. It is the week of the Pharisee and the Publican, which is the beginning of the liturgical season known as the Triodion. The Triodion is a season which spiritually prepares us for Great Lent. We prepare for Lent by humbling ourselves before God. During this week of the Pharisee and the Publican, our Church seeks to keep us from being like Pharisees. Observing the discipline of fasting can easily cause us to develop Pharisaical pride. Before we can fast properly, we must acquire humility.

Indeed, it is a season to learn to be humble, which we cannot learn from our accomplishments, but rather from our love and faith in Christ our God. Fr. Alexander Schmemann, in his book entitled, *Great Lent*, writes that God is Himself humble! For anyone who knows God, it is evident that humility is a divine quality that completely fills heaven and earth. Unfortunately, it is nearly impossible for people today to comprehend humility and understand that everything that is perfect and good contains the quality of humility. (See pgs. 18-19).

Sanctify our souls, purify our bodies, correct our thoughts, cleanse our minds and deliver us from danger, evil and distress. Surround us with Your Holy Angels, so that guided and guarded by their might, we may all attain to the unity of the Faith and to the full knowledge of Your unapproachable glory.

For to You is due all glory, honor and worship: to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, both now and forever and unto the ages of ages. Amen.

Υπάρχει λόγος για τον οποίο αυτή η εβδομάδα είναι εβδομάδα χωρίς νηστεία. Είναι η εβδομάδα του Φαρισαίος και του Τελώνα, που είναι η αρχή της λειτουργικής περιόδου του Τριωδίου. Το Τριωδιο είναι μια εποχή που μας προετοιμάζει πνευματικά για την Μεγάλη Τεσσααρακοστή. Προετοιμαζόμαστε για τη Τεσσαρακοστή, ταπεινώνοντας τους εαυτούς μας ενώπιον του Θεού. Κατά τη διάρκεια της εβδομάδας του Τελώνου και του Φαρισαίου, η Εκκλησία επιθυμεί να μας προστατεύσει από την υπερηφάνειαν του Φαρισαίου. Κρατώντας μια πειθαρχία νηστείας μπορεί εύκολα να γίνει μια αιτία για την υπερηφάνειαν. Πριν απο την νηστεία, πρέπει να είμεθα ταπεινοί.

Σίγουρα, είναι μια εποχή για να μάθουμε ταπεινότητα, την οποία δεν μαθαίνουμε από τα επιτεύγματά μας, αλλά από την αγάπη και την πίστη μας στον Χριστόν. Ο Π. Αλέξανδρος Schmemann, στο βιβλίο του, HΜεγάλη Τεσσαρακοστή, γράφει ότι Ο Θεός ο Ιδιος είναι ταπεινός! Σε όποιον γνωρίζει τον Θεό, είναι προφανές ότι η ταπεινότητα είναι στην πραγματικοτηταν μια θεϊκή ποιότητα, που γεμίζει εντελώς τον ουρανό και την γη. Δυστυχώς, είναι σχεδόν αδύνατο για τον σύγχρονο άνθρωπο να καταλάβει την ταπεινότηταν. Δεν καταλαβαίνει ότι όλα όσα είναι τέλεια και υπέροχα κατέχουν την ποιότητα της ταπεινότητας. (σελ. 18-19).

Ας όλα όσα κάνουμε — ακόμη και την νηστεία — να γίνουν με ταπεινότητα, πράγμα που σημαίνει ότι τα κάνουμε με αγάπη και πίστη στον Χριστό που είναι ο Ιδιος ταπεινός.

especially) fasting — is to be accomplished with humility, which means that we do whatever we do with love and faith in Christ.

Our Savior both defines and personifies the virtue of humility. St. John of the Ladder explains: "[Humility is known] only to those who have learned it by experience...a name and gift from God. Learn from Me (He says) indwelling -- from My illumination and action in you; for, 'I am meek and humble in heart and in thought and in spirit...'(St. Matth. 11:29)." (Ladder of Divine Ascent," Step 25, pg. 191). From Christlike humility spring the other virtues of Christ: love, mercy and forgiveness. Through forgiveness there is the opportunity for repentance, made evident from one's on-going greater spiritual maturity; inner peace; love and mercy towards others.

To the extent that we turn to our Savior and follow Him, we become like Him. Asking for God's forgiveness grants us the power to forgive. In turn, forgiving others attracts God's forgiveness all the more. The same can be said about seeking God's mercy. In humbling himself before our Lord, the Publican was *justified* because of the *relationship* with God that would work from within him. Acts of *love* and *mercy* with faith in Christ bring *justification* to our lives.

This *interworking* of our request for God's mercy and our ability to then give God's mercy is seen in Psalm 50. Like the Publican, King David prayed: "Have mercy on me, O Lord...cleanse me from my sin." His prayer does not stop with having been given mercy by God, but he continues to express how he will also be a co-worker with God: "Create a clean heart within me; cast not Your Holy Spirit from me," and, "I will teach transgressors Your ways and the ungodly will turn back to You...Open my lips and my mouth will declare Your praise." Truly, the acceptable sacrifice to God, is not found in the Law, or from tithes, or in "not being like others," as the Pharisee would say, but, in "a broken and humble heart" like the Publican. This is because it is from Christ-like love and humility that mercy is born, since God is Himself both humble and merciful.

The Triodion season, then, is a time for us to seek *humility* by developing a *relationship* with our Lord Whose *mercy* is evident from all of His great gifts and from His constant forgiveness of our sins. In turn, we can also become loving and merciful toward others, despite any of our so-called "self-powered" accomplishments. +FR. THEODORE

And you, righteous Elder, be glad in heart, receiving in your embraces the One who liberates our souls and bestows on us the Resurrection.*)

<u>Hymn for St. George</u>: Os ton echmaloton eleftherotis...(As the one who sets the captives free and the protector of the poor; as physician to the sick and the champion defender of kings, bearer of trophies are you, O Great Martyr George, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.)

<u>Kontakion Hymn for this Sunday</u>: O Mitran Parthenikin...(You sanctified the virginal womb by Your birth, O Lord, and blessed the hands of Symeon fittingly, O Christ God; and even now You came and saved us. Now, give peace to our Nation in time of war, and empower our Leaders, so loved by You, the only one who loves humanity.)

Instead of Axion Estin, the following: Theotoke ee elpis...(Theotokos, as the hope of us Christians, one and all, guard and shelter and protect those who put their hope in you. O believers, come let us perceive a type in the law, and the shadow and the letter. * Every male that opens the womb shall be holy to God. So the unoriginate Father's firstborn Logos and Son, who is the firstborn of the Mother who knew not man, we magnify.)

Communion-Potirion sotiriou...(I will take up the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord. Alleluia.)




