PRESERVING THE "GOOD SOIL"

Some souls are like good soil. Other souls are like a hard stone. Still other souls are being choked by the "thorny" cares of the world. The Word is Christ our God, Who, at the same time, is the "enfleshment" of the Bible. Also, the Church is collectively referred to as "The Body of Christ". As members of the Church, we are the ones who must do all we can to plant the seeds of faith in the souls of our children and others.

In reality, however, we preach and teach God's Will to the people around

us -- young and old alike. However, preaching and teaching are words. Unless we offer living examples of God's love for our children to see, the words they hear will not make sense. Then they become confused and frustrated. Their souls' "good soil" begins to erode with anxiety.

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Vivid examples are required, which also serve as living sermons. We can no longer talk about forgiveness. Forgiveness needs to become a visible reality. We can no longer talk about self-

SUNDAY OF THE SEVENTH ECUMENICAL COUNCIL

On the Sunday that falls on or immediately after the eleventh of this month, we chant the Service to the 350 holy Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council, who gathered in Nicaea in 787 under the holy Patriarch Tarasius and during the reign of the Empress Irene, to refute the Iconoclast heresy, which had received imperial support beginning with the Edict issued in 726 by Emperor Leo the Isaurian.

Iconoclasm was the movement led by those who sought to take down Holy Icons from the churches and force people to destroy the Icons that they had in their homes. They believed that Icons were a form of idolatry. Many of the holy Fathers who condemned Iconoclasm at this holy Council later died as Confessors and Martyrs for the holy Icons during the second assault of Iconoclasm in the ninth century, especially during the reigns of Emperors Leo the Armenian and Theophilus.

St. Luke the Evangelist is noted for having drawn an Icon of the Holy Mother of God and Ever-Virgin Mary. Thus, this Council upheld Apostolic Tradition. The presence of the Holy Icons in our churches and our homes expresses our faith, as Orthodox Christians, that Jesus Christ, the Only-Begotten Son of the Living God -- "True God of True God" -- was Incarnated by the Virgin Mary and the Holy Spirit and became Man for our salvation.

Ο Λόγος είναι ο Χριστός ο Θεός μας, ο Οποίος, ταυτόχρονα, είναι η «ενσάρκωση» της Αγίας Γραφής. Επίσης, η Εκκλησία αναφέρεται συλλογικά ως «Το Σώμα του Χριστού». Ως μέλη της Εκκλησίας, οι γονείς είναι αυτοί οι οποίοι που θα κάνουν τα παντα γιά να φυτέψουν τους σπόρους της πίστεως στις ψυχές των παιδιών μας.

Στην πραγματικότητα, όμως, κηρύττουμε και διδάσκουμε το θέλημα του Θεού σε όλους γύρω μας - στους νέους και στους ηλικιωμένους. Ωστόσο, το κήρυγμα και η διδασκαλία είναι μόνον λόγια. Όσο δεν προσφέρουμε ζωντανά παραδείγματα της αγάπης του Θεού γιά να τα δουν τα παιδιά μας με τα μάτια τους, τα λόγια που ακούνε δεν θα έχουν νόημα. Γίνονται μπερδεμένοι και απογοητευμένοι. Οι εύθραυστες ψυχές τους, δημιουργημένες με «καλό χώμα» σκληραίνονται και αναζητούν τα κοσμικά αγαθά.

Απαιτούνται ζωντανά παραδείγματα, τα οποία γίνονται επίσης ζωντανά κηρύγματα. Δεν μπορούμε πλέον να ομιλούμε για συγχώρεση. Πρέπει να πραγματοποιήσουμεν την συγχώρεση. Δεν μπορούμε πλέον να ομιλούμε γιά το αυτοέλεγχο. Πρέπει να ασκήσουμε πραγματικά την έλεγξη του εαυτού μας. Δεν φθάνει πλέον να ομιλούμε για προσευχή. Πρέπει να προσευχηθούμε στην πραγματικότηταν. Αυτός είναι ο μόνος τρόπος που έχουμε για να «μαλακώουμε» τις ψυχές που σκληραίνονται σαν πέτρες και πνίγονται από κοσμικές ανησυχίες. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

control. We need to actually control ourselves. It is no longer enough to talk about prayer. We must really pray. This is the only way we have to "soften" the souls that have been harden into stone and are now choked with worldly cares.

As individual families who are part of God's larger Family (i.e., the Church) we are each called to be examples of Christ's love so that our youth can learn by seeing the Orthodox Christian life-style "up close" in action -- but, especially with the spirit of humility. St. John Chrysostom states, "...One's own virtue is not enough for salvation, but the virtue of those for whom we are responsible is also required." (On Marriage & Family Life, trans. by Catherine Roth and David Anderson, pg. 72)

Chrysostom's words inspire all of us to do our part to maintain the fresh, "good soil" of our children's souls:

"Even at their age they are exposed to all sorts of folly and bad examples from popular entertainments. Our children need remedies for all these things! We are so concerned with our children's schooling; if only we were equally zealous in bringing them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord!...Give them a pattern to imitate; from their earliest years, let us teach them to study the Bible...Let us raise our children in such a way that they can face any trouble, and not be surprised when difficulties come; let us bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord...When we teach our children to be good, to be gentle, to be forgiving (all these are attributes of God), to be generous, to love their fellow men, to regard this present age as nothing, we instill virtue in their souls and reveal the image of God within them." (On Marriage & Family Life, pgs. 67 & 71).

Indeed, children are born with "good soil" in their souls. Helping them preserve such "good soil" will translate into the recovery of any lost "good soil" in our own souls. Therefore, let us not be hardened and choked by worldly desires and weak faith. Let us commit ourselves to always be learning about the spiritual Tradition of our Church so as to express tangibly the life-saving love of our Savior. +FR. THEODORE

Do your best to speed Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their way; see that they lack nothing. And let our people learn to apply themselves to good deeds, so as to help cases of urgent need, and not to be unfruitful. All who are with me send greeting to you. Greet those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.

GOSPEL - St. Luke 8:5-15

The Lord said this parable: "A sower went out to sow his seed; and as he sowed, some fell along the path, and was trodden under foot, and the birds of the air devoured it. And

some fell on the rock; and as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some fell into good soil and grew, and yielded a hundredfold." And when his disciples asked him what this parable meant, he said, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of God; but for others they are in parables, so that seeing they may not see, and hearing they may not understand. Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. The ones along the path are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, that they may not believe and be saved. And the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear the word, receive it with joy; but these have no root, they believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. And as for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bring forth fruit with patience." As he said these things, he cried out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."
