ways: 1) through endurance, and, 2) by action. In today's Epistle passage from 2 Corinthians, St. Paul explains this:

"As servants of God we commend ourselves in every way:

through great endurance, in 1. afflictions, 2. hardships, 3. calamities, 4. beatings, 5. imprisonments, 6. tumults, 7. labors, 8. watching, and, 9. hunger;

by 1. purity, 2. knowledge, 3. forbearance, 4. kindness, 6. the Holy Spirit, 7. genuine love, 9. truthful speech, and, 10. the power of

God." (vs. 4-7)

Commitment is made evident in two As the footnote in the Orthodox Study Bible states regarding St. Paul, "His life demonstrates the paradox of God's strength working in human weakness, of renouncing the world in order to master it. The day of salvation is now, always the present moment in the period before Christ's return." (pg. 1579).

> In essence, then, we need to accept the fact that, on a daily basis, we need to endure the imperfections of the world around us. Yet, anger and depression do not allow us to endure anything.

Όπως αναφέρει η υποσημείωση στο Orthodox Study Bible, σχετικά με τον Άγ. Παύλο, «Η ζωή του δείχνει ένα παράδοξο πράγμα όπου η δύναμις του Θεού λειτουργεί στην ανθρώπινη αδυναμία, και όταν οι άνθρωποι αποκηρύσσουν τον κόσμο, τον κυριαρχούν. Η ημέρα της σωτηρίας είναι τώρα, πάντα η παρούσα στιγμή της περιόδου πριν από τη Δεύτερη Παρουσία του Χριστού. "(σελ. 1579).

Στην ουσία, λοιπόν, πρέπει να αποδεχθούμε το γεγονός ότι, σε καθημερινή βάση, πρέπει να υπομείνουμε τις ατέλειες του κόσμου γύρω μας. Ωστόσο, ο θυμός και η κατάθλιψη δεν μας επιτρέπουν να υπομείνουμε τίποτα. Το μόνο που συμβαίνει είναι ότι κάνουμε τα πράγματα χειρότερα. Μόνο με τον Χριστό μπορούμε να αντέξουμε. Ωστόσο, για να είμεθα μαζί Του, πρέπει να έχουμε πίστη, από την οποία αγωνιζόμεθα γιά να καθαρίσουμε τις σκέψεις μας και να αναζητήσουμε τη σοφία του Θεού, που είναι ο καρπός της προσευχής με τη χάρη του Αγίου Πνεύματος.

Ενεργώντας σύμφωνα με τις εντολές του Κυρίου μας, ενώ εξακολουθούμε να αντιμετωπίζουμε δοκιμασίες, αποδεικνύουμε τη δέσμευσή μας στον Κύριον και, με αυτόν τον τρόπο, Τον δοξάζουμεν. Με μια τέτοια νοοτροπία οι Άγιοι έχουν εμπνεύσει γενιές ανθρώπων και θαύματα έχουν γίνει τόσο στην εποχή τους, όσο και στη δική μας.

Πολλές φορές ερωτάμε: «Τι θα κερδίσω εγώ αν κάνω καλό;" Ο κακός υπηρέτης του σημερινού Ευαγγελίου είχε την ίδια στάση. Ας προσευχηθούμε να μην έχουμε ποτέ τέτοια στάση, αλλά να παραδοθούμε στον Θεό την κάθε ημέρα. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

All that happens is that we make things worse. Only with Christ our God can we endure. However, to be with Him we are asked to have faith, from which we struggle to purify our thoughts; seek the wisdom of God through prayer by the grace of the Holy Spirit; be kind and patient with ourselves and others; and act according to the truth of the Gospel. By acting as our Lord commands, while still facing trials and tribulations, we give evidence of our commitment and, in this way, we give Him glory.

With these thoughts held firmly in their minds, the Saints of our Church have inspired generations of people and miracles have occurred both in their own life-times, as well as in ours. With these thoughts in their minds, our Saints show a peaceful way of life and they offer volumes of good deeds for the benefit and salvation of others. While God gave St. Paul and the other Saints the talents that they needed to *endure* and *act* for God's glory, they multiplied their talents by imparting them to others, sharing God's blessings, as others shared God's blessings with still others. If only our society could be filled with such people!

We live in a world in which freely sharing God's blessings with others is not the norm. Too many times we find ourselves in the habit of asking, "What's in it for me?" This question emanated from the heart of the wicked servant of today's Gospel passage. It is almost as if when we do not gain some personal advantage from someone, we become cold-hearted ourselves — and, sometimes our coldness is directed at God, of Whom (figuratively) the wicked servant judged to be "A hard man, ...and I was afraid..." (St. Matthew 25:25).

Ironically, the wicked man projected his own wicked frame of mind onto to God and judged God, rather than himself. Let us pray to never fall into such a "spin" in our thinking. Rather, let us truly "commend ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ our God."

EPISTLE—2 Corinthians 6:1-10

Brethren, working together with him, then, we entreat you not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, "At the acceptable time I have listened to you, and helped you on the day of salvation." Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We put no obstacle in any one's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, tumults, labors, watching, hunger; by purity, knowledge, forbearance, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

GOSPEL—St. Matthew 25:14-30

The Lord said this parable: "A man going on a journey called his servants and entrusted to them his property; to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. He who had received the five talents went at once and traded with them; and he made five talents more. So also, he who had the two talents made two talents more. But he who had received the one talent went and dug in the ground and hid his master's

money. Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. And he who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me five talents; here I have made five talents more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master.' And he also who had the two talents came forward, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me two talents; here I have made two talents more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master.' He also who had received the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not winnow; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' But his master answered him, 'You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sowed, and gather where I have not winnowed? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to him who has the ten talents. For to every one who has will more be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who has not, even what he has will be taken away. And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness; there men will weep and gnash their teeth." As he said these things he cried out: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!"
