PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE- Rom. 6:18-23

Brethren, having been set free from sin, you have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms, because of your natural limitations. For just as you once yielded your members to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now yield your members to righteousness for sanctification. When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. But then what return did you get from the things of which you are now ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the return you get is sanctification and its end, eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GOSPEL - St. Mathew 8:5-13

At that time, as Jesus entered Capernaum, a centurion came forward to him, beseeching

him and saying, "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, in terrible distress." And he said to him, "I will come and heal him." But the centurion answered him, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I am a man under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, 'Come,' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this,' and he does it." When Jesus heard him, he marveled, and said to those who followed him, "Truly, I say to you, not even in Israel have I found such faith. I tell you, many will come from east and west and sit at table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven, while the sons of the kingdom will be thrown into the outer darkness; there men will weep and gnash their teeth." And to the centurion Jesus said, "Go; be it done for you as you have believed." And the servant was healed at that very moment.

ST. ANTHONY OF KIEV -- Along with the commemoration of the 45 Martyrs of Nikopolis in Armenia, we commemorate today St. Anthony of Kiev. He was tonsured as a monk in the Monastery of Esphigmenou on the Holy Mountain, Athos. From there, in 1013, he was sent by his abbot to Kiev. This was two years before the death of St. Vladimir, Great Prince of Kiev. Many were attracted to his way of life, and, when the number of followers grew, a church in honor of the Dormition of the Theotokos was built, thus laying the foundation of what was to become the renowned Kiev Caves Lavra. Refusing the abbotship, St. Anthony entrusted this to his disciples. He reposed in peace in 1073 at the age of ninety.

THE GIFT OF LIFE

The miracles of our Savior all have the *sanctification* of human life as their purpose. An example of this is from today's Gospel from which we learn that our Lord healed the paralyzed servant of a centurion in response to his faith in Him. The evidence of the centurion's faith becomes an example for all of us. The miracles show our Lord's love for us as we continue to live in this present world, with the promise that we will also abide with Him in His Kingdom beyond this present world.

The miracles of the raising from the dead of Lazarus, Jairus' daughter, and the widow's son at Nain are testimonies that Christ is True God. His gift of life is a gift that is to last for eternity, but which begins in this present world in which we live. Lazarus, Jairus' daughter and the widow's son were raised from death back to life in this present world. Thus, our lives in the present are valuable to God because each person is to be a vessel of God's loving energy in order for *all of creation* to reflect the glory of God.

The tremendous value that God places on each individual gives meaning to each of our lives. The biggest concern of our Church regarding the present-day issues of abortion, capital punishment and physician-assisted suicide, is that we should never lose sight of the fact that our own lives, as well as those of all people are gifts from God. At the same time, our lives are meant to eternally be *with* God. As such, we are each a gift in the lives of others. This is true for all human life -- the lives of the born and preborn; the sinner and the saint; the believer and unbeliever; the old and the young; male and female of every race and nationality.

St. Paul, through today's Epistle passage, warns us not to be slaves to sin -- i.e., "slaves unto ourselves." Instead, he urges us to be "slaves to God" and receive blessings in this life and the inheritance of Eternal Life. +FR. THEODORE

Τα θαύματα του Χριστού δείχνουν ότι η ζωή μας στον παρόντα κόσμο είναι πολύτιμη για τον Θεό, γιατί ο καθενας είναι ένα «δοχείο» της στοργικής ενεργείας του Θεού, προκειμένου όλη η δημιουργία να αντανακλά τη δόξα του Θεού. Είναι το απόλυτο νόημα της καθημερινής ζωής μας!

Το μεγαλύτερο ενδιαφέρον της Εκκλησίας μας σχετικά με τα σημερινά ζητήματα της αμβλώσεως, της θανατικής ποινής και της υποβοηθούμενης υπό γιατρού αυτοκτονίας, είναι ότι δεν πρέπει ποτέ να παραβλέπουμε την αλήθεια ότι η δική μας ζωή και οι ζωές όλων των ανθρώπων -- γεννημένων και προγεννημένων, αμαρτωλοί και άγιοι, πιστοί και άπιστοι, γέροι και νέοι κάθε φυλής και εθνικότητος -- είναι δώρα του Θεού, ο Οποίος είναι ο Δωρητής της Ζωής.

Ο Άγιος Παύλος μας προειδοποιεί να μην γίνουμε δούλοι της αμαρτίας ή, με άλλα λόγια, «δούλοι του εαυτού μας», αφού η αμαρτία οδηγεί στον θάνατο. Αντίθετα, ας είμεθα «δούλοι του Θεού», ώστε να έχουμε ευλογίες σε αυτή τη ζωή και να έχουμε ως κληρονομιά την Αιώνιον Ζωή.


ANNOUNCEMENTS
