Holy Communion Order

- 1. Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

FORGIVENESS YIELDS PEACE

His All-Holiness, Patriarch Bartholomew, in His Catechetical Homily at the Opening of Holy and Great Lent for this year, offers educational and inspiring thoughts as we begin the Lenten Season. He writes, "Nothing in the life of the believer is fragmentary or an end in itself. Life in Christ is holistic and undivided. Repentance, humility, prayer, fasting, good deeds – all of these are intertwined and orient the believer to the Eucharist of the Church, the eschatological mystery of the Kingdom. Ascetic struggles are the begin-

ning, the 'narrow gate' that leads us to the Holy of Holies. In our tradition, there is never 'asceticism for the sake of asceticism.' Ascetic discipline is always a journey; it is fulfilled when it becomes part of the Church, when it leads us to communion of the Sacred Mysteries, which in turn incorporate us into the movement of the Church toward the Kingdom. Let us remind you of the example of St. Mary of Egypt, who is honored on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. After forty years of harsh ascetic struggle and unceasing prayer, she sought to partake at Continued on page 2

GREAT LENT, ORTHODOX CHRISTIAN SPIRITUAL LIFE and THE HOLY SACRAMENTS.

"There is no Orthodox spirituality without participation in the Divine Eucharist, through which as believers we become one body, a communion of persons, the community of life, participants of the 'common salvation' in Christ the Savior, who is the 'common good.' Therefore, fasting is submission and obedience to the rule of the Church, a communal experience. Holy and Great Lent is an invitation for us to discover the Church as a place and way of sanctification and sanctity, as a foretaste and image of the splendid radiance, of the fullness of life and of the complete joy in the eschatological Kingdom. Experientially and theologically it is impossible for us to comprehend the spirit of Holy and Great Lent if we do not perceive it as a journey toward Pascha. The entire period of fasting preserves the 'paschal perception' of life. Gloomy asceticism is a perversion of the Christian experience; it is the ignorance of the imminent grace and future Kingdom; it is life 'as if Christ never came,' without expectation of the resurrection of the dead and of life in the age to come."

Καθώς ξεκινάμε την εκτέλεση της Θείας Λειτουργίας, καλούμεθα να προσευχηθούμε για την άνωθεν ειρήνη -- την ειρήνην που προέρχεται από την προσωπική μας σχέση με τον Θεό. Η επόμενη αναφορά είναι για την παγκόσμια ειρήνη. Εάν καταβάλλουμε κάθε προσπάθεια να ζούμε σύμφωνα με τις Εντολές του Θεού, οι προσευχές μας γίνονται μια ζωντανή έκφραση της αγάπης του Θεού για όλους -- και σε αυτό το πλαίσιο, οι προσευχές δεν είναι απλά «λόγια απόγνώσεως», αλλά πραγματικές εκφράσεις της ζωογόνου αγάπης του Χριστού για όλους τους ανθρώπους επί της γης.

Αν δεν έχουμε αγάπη, τότε δεν μπορούμε να συγχωρήσουμε κανέναν, ούτε τον εαυτόν μας. Και, αν δεν συγχωρούμε, πώς θα τολμήσουμε να προσευχηθούμε; Διότι, ο ίδιος ο Θεός μας είπε ότι συγχωρούμεθα όπως συγχωρούμε εκείνους που μας αδικούν. Αυτή η ρήτρα στην Προσευχή που μας έδωσε ο Κύριός μας από την καρδιά Του σημαίνει ότι η συγχώρεση είναι το κλειδί για τη σωτηρία, που είναι η ζωή στη Βασιλεία του Θεού εδώ στη γη όπως και στον ουρανό.

Ας ζήσουμε σύμφωνα με την Εντολή του Σωτήρος μας να αγαπάμε τον πλησίον μας, που σημαίνει ότι πρέπει να συγχωρούμε τον πλησίον μας, συνειδητοποιώντας ότι η δική μας συγχώρεση και σωτηρία είναι συνυφασμένη με αυτή του πλησίον μας. Μια τέτοια ουράνια ειρήνη μεταξύ μας και του πλησίον μας θα κυματίσει σε όλη την κοινότητα και οι άλλες προσευχές μας για το καλό του κόσμου θα λάβουν σίγουρα απάντηση -»υπέρ της ειρήνης του σύμπαντος κόσμου.» +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

the hands of St. Zosimas in full knowledge that Holy Communion is the source of life and medicine of immortality."

Hence, as we begin the celebration of the Divine Liturgy, we are each summoned to pray for *heavenly peace* -- the peace that comes from our personal relationship with God. The next petition is for *world peace*. If we make every effort to live according to God's Commandments, our prayers become a living expression of God's love for everyone -- and in that context, prayers are not simple "words of desperation," but real expressions of Christ's life-giving love for everyone.

If we do not have love, then we cannot forgive. And, if we do not forgive, how do we dare to pray? For, our God Himself said that we are forgiven "as we forgive those who trespass against us." This clause in the Prayer that our Lord gave to us from His own heart means that forgiveness is the key to salvation, which is life in God's Kingdom here on earth as it is in heaven.

Amidst the fears that we are encountering with war being headlined in the news, and remembering that only two years ago nearly to the date, our world was closed due to a pandemic, let us live according to our Savior's Commandment to love our neighbor, which means that we are to forgive our neighbor, realizing that our own forgiveness and salvation is interwoven with that of our neighbor. Such heavenly peace between us and our neighbor will ripple throughout the community and our other prayers for the good of the world will most assuredly be answered, indeed, "for the peace of the whole world." +FR. ST. GEORGE PARISH LENTEN RETREAT


