Holy Communion Order

- 1. Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

THE LENTEN PRAYER

The Lenten Prayer of St. Ephraim the Syrian speaks volumes with regard to the essence of the Orthodox Christian frame for mind. It speaks to our Free Will, strongly implying that we are free to choose the things for which we pray. The benefit of choosing to pray for the virtues that enliven our souls, is peace with God and with our neighbor, which, by extension, brings peace to our homes; our community, and ideally, to the whole world.

We specifically pray for Christ to help

us to avoid one kind of "spirit" and to embrace another kind of "spirit." "Spirit," in this context, means a certain kind of motive, passion, temptation, inspiration, or desire. We pray for our Lord to take us away from the "spirit" of idolatry, vanity, sloth, anxiety, greed, and pride. We pray that our Lord helps us to develop the "spirit" of patience, sincerity, humility and love. The prayer teaches us that the best way to avoid evil is to pursue good -- and that we must pray for God to help us do all that is good.

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF GREAT LENT -- The Epistle reading for today is taken from Hebrews 11:24-26 and 11:32-40. After the righteous of the Old Testament are mentioned, the Epistle says: And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us. The Gospel lesson is John 1: 43-51, and it ends with a explanation of the "something better" of the Epistle: "You will see greater things than these." And He said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, hereafter you shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man." This reality is depicted through the Holy Icons, which give a vision into heaven.

Accepting Icons means to accept this fact. That is the way the Christians of the 8th and 9th centuries viewed this issue and the 7th Ecumenical Council in 787 A.D. decreed that Icons are to be used in prayer and worship – venerated as statements of faith, but not worshiped as idols. In 843 A.D. the Empress, St. Theodora once and for all affirmed the decree of the 7th Ecumenical Council with a public display of Icons through the streets Constantinople on the first Sunday of Great Lent. Every year, on the first Sunday of Lent, such as today, we commemorate this event as the "Sunday of Orthodoxy" with the Procession of Icons. +FR. THEODORE

Η Ευχή του Αγ. Εφραίμ του Σύρου, η οποία ακούεται συχνά κατά την Μ. Τεσσαρακοστή, ομιλεί σχετικά με την ουσία του Ορθόδοξου Χριστιανικού νοοτροπία. Ομιλεί για την Ελεύθερη Βούλησή μας, υπονοώντας έντονα ότι είμεθα ελεύθεροι να επιλέγουμε τα «πράγματα» για τα οποία προσευχόμεθα. Το όφελος από την επιλογή της προσευχής για τις αρετές που ζωντανεύουν τις ψυχές μας είναι οτι κερδίζουμεν την «εν Χριστω» ειρήνη και την πνευματικην ειρηνη με τον πλησίον μας, η οποία ειρηνη, κατ' επέκταση, φέρνει ειρήνη στα σπίτια μας, στην κοινότητά μας, και ιδανικά, σε ολόκληρο τον κόσμο.

Προσευχόμεθα συγκεκριμένα πως ο Χριστός θα μας βοηθήσει να αποφύγουμε ένα είδος «νοοτροπίας» και να αγκαλιάσουμε ένα άλλο είδος «νοοτροπίας». «Νοοτροπία», σε αυτό το πλαίσιο, σημαίνει ένα ορισμένο είδος κινήτρου, πάθους, πειρασμού, έμπνευσης, ή επιθυμίας. Προσευχόμεθα πως ο Κύριός μας θα μας απομακρύνει από το «πνεύμα» της ειδωλολατρίας, της ματαιοδοξίας, της νωθρότητας, του άγχους, της απλησίας, και την υπερηφάνεια. Προσευχόμεθα πως ο Κύριός θα μας βοηθήσει να αναπτύξουμε το «πνεύμα» της υπομονής, της ειλικρίνειας, της ταπεινοφροσύνης, και της αγάπης. Η Ευχη του Αγ. Εφραίμ μας διδάσκει ότι ο καλύτερος τρόπος για να αποφύγουμε το κακό είναι να επιδιώκουμε το καλό -- και ότι πρέπει να προσευχόμεθα να μας βοηθήσει ο Θεός να κάνουμε ό,τι είναι καλό.

Ας ζήσουμε όλη την περίοδο της Τεσσαρακοστής, και όλη μας τη ζωή, συμφωνα με τις θείες αρετές του Κυρίου και Σωτήρος μας. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ Finally, we pray for two "things" that make the difference between salvation and damnation. The one is the vision of our own personal faults and sins. While this may seem as unpleasant and difficult as an abdominal surgery, the only way we can find peace in our souls is for us to cut away the our bad habits; our prejudices; our anger, and our vanity. Like restoring health to the body by cutting away unhealthy tissue, cutting away our faults and sins through repentance restores health to the soul. In essence, we pray for the grace and ability to repent of our sins; for, without repentance, we are lost.

The second "thing" for which we pray, but which is coupled with the first, is the wisdom to not condemn our fellow human being. There are two reasons for this: 1) by trying to condemn our fellow human being, we fail to give attention to the things we need to do in order to repent, and, 2) by trying to condemn another person, we commit another serious sin by taking upon ourselves the "persons" of God and thereby making ourselves "judges" rather than allowing our Lord to be the Righteous Judge.

Orthodox Christians are asked to condemn sin, not people. We must begin by condemning the sins that we ourselves commit and, instead, practice the virtues that oppose sins. Sins include abuse, lust, greed, and discrimination; the opposing virtues include respect, charity, and love for God. Let us live this Lenten season, and our whole lives, with the divine virtues of our Lord and Savior. In this way we will emulate our Lord and the Saints through whose images we receive many blessings, as we observe this Sunday of Orthodoxy. +FR. THEODORE

EPISTLE - Hebrews 11:24-26, 32-40

Brethren, by faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to share ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. He considered abuse suffered for the Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he looked to the reward. And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign enemies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated - of whom the world was not worthy - wandering over deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had Son of man."


ANNOUNCEMENTS


