#### **Holy Communion Order**

- Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

#### THE CROSS OF REPENTANCE

On the Third Sunday of Great Lent, we are called by our Holy Church to venerate the Holy Cross of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ. The first two Sundays of Lent proclaimed our Faith that God became Man so that we can become like God, being united with His energy of love.

From the Cross, God's energy of love continues to flow to us. To this day, the Sign of the Cross is enough to terrify demons. Such is the power and the love of our God. God's powers are infinitely greater than our own, which in itself makes us humble. Throughout His earthly ministry, every time God performed His miracles, through which He proclaimed His infinite love, people gratefully wanted to follow Him and, "picking up their crosses," they ultimately give their lives for Him.


In essence, they repented of sins. To repent of our selfishness, hatred, prejudices, and delusions is the cross of repentance. But this cross is one given *Continued on page 2* 

SERVICE OF THE VENERATION OF THE HOLY CROSS -- Following the Prayer, "Save, O Lord Your people and bless Your inheritance..." (following Holy Communion), the choir / chanters sing: "Aghios o Theos, Aghios Ischyros, Aghios Athanatos, eleison imas." "Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy upon us." as the priest carries in procession the tray holding the Holy Cross, which is decorated with many flowers and/or basil plants. The procession includes the deacon and Altar Boys as it continues around the interior of the church temple. When the procession arrives at the center of the church, in front of the Holy Altar, the priest raises the tray with the Holy Cross high and exclaims: "Wisdom! Let us attend!" The priest then sets the Holy Cross on a table arranged for this service and censes the Holy Cross as he proceeds around the table and chants: "Soson Kyrie ton laon Sou"... "Save, O Lord, Your people and bless Your inheritance, granting victory to the faithful over adversaries and, by Your Cross, protecting Your commonwealth." This hymn is repeated twice by the choir/chanters. Then, as the priest and deacon venerate the Holy Cross, the priest chants: "Ton Stavron Sou proskinoumen, Despota"... "We venerate

Proverbs - "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to act." (Proverbs 3:27)

Your Cross, O Master, and we glorify Your Holy Resurrection."

This hymn is also repeated twice by the choir/chanters.

Την Τρίτη Κυριακή της Μεγάλης Τεσσαρακοστής η Εκκλησία μας παρακαλεί να να προσκυνήσουμε τον Τίμιο Σταυρό του Θεού και Σωτήρος μας Ιησού Χριστού. Οι δύο πρώτες Κυριακές της Μεγάλης Τεσσαρακοστής εδιακήρυξαν την Πίστη μας ότι ο Θεός έγινε Άνθρωπος για να γίνουμε όμοιοι με τον Θεό, ενωμένοι με την ενέργεια της αγάπης Του.

Από τον Σταυρό, η ενέργεια της αγάπης του Θεού συνεχίζει να μας σώσει. Μέχρι σήμερα, το Σημείο του Σταυρού τρομοκρατήσει τους δαίμονες. Τέτοια είναι η δύναμη και η αγάπη του Θεού μας. Οι δυνάμεις του Θεού είναι απείρως μεγαλύτερες από τις δικές μας, η οποία αλήθεια μας κάνει ταπεινούς. Σε όλη τη διάρκεια της επίγειας διακονίας Του, κάθε φορά που ο Θεός έκανε τα θαύματά Του, μέσω των οποίων εδιακήρυξε την απέραντη αγάπη Του, οι άνθρωποι ήθελαν με ευγνωμοσύνη να Τον ακολουθήσουν και, τελικά, να προσφέρουν τη ζωή τους προς δόξαν Αυτού.

Ουσιαστικά εμετανόησαν για τις αμαρτίες τους. Το να μετανοήσουμε για τον εγωισμό, το μίσος, τις προκαταλήψεις και τις απάτες μας είναι ο σταυρός της μετάνοιας. Αλλά αυτός ο σταυρός είναι ένας που προέρχεται από την αγάπη μας για τον Θεό και που, ταυτόχρονα, προσφέρει την ψυκική μας χαρά. Ο Thomas Hopko, στο βιβλίο του, Η Σαρακοστιανή Ανοιξη, γράφει τα εξής: «[Εμείς] πρέπει να σηκώσουμε τον Σταυρό στη ζωή [μας]. Πρέπει να συνσταυρωθούμε με τον Χριστό για να μοιραστούμε τη δόξα Του με άλλους και να βιώσουμε, ακόμη και σε αυτόν τον κόσμο, την ομορφιά και τη δύναμη -- την ειρήνη και τη χαρά -- της Βασιλείας του Θεού». +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

to God out of gratitude and which, and the same time, gives us joy. Fr. Thomas Hopko, in his book, *The Lenten Spring*, writes the following: "[We] must take up the Cross in [our] own lives. We must be co-crucified with Christ in order to share His glory, and to experience, even in this world, the beauty and power; the peace and joy of the Kingdom of God." (pg. 146)

Through the Cross we inherit the Kingdom of God. Thus, the Cross is the central theme of the Divine Liturgy, which is our expression of gratitude to God; for, it is from the Cross that we partake of Christ's Body, which was broken for us, and His Blood, which was shed for us. While the Cross is Christ's victory over death, our heart-felt repentance is the cross that we carry for victory over sin. We carry our cross of repentance with the divine help of the Cross of Christ.

The Cross teaches us that God loves each one of us. God's love is Eternal Life itself. We venerate the Cross of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ, because we are grateful. We are grateful, because, through His love, we can repent of sins and turn to our God, Who forgives us and Who is always there to guide us in the life of His glorious Resurrection.

Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen"

EPISTLE - Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:1-6

Brethren, since we have a high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. Because of this he is bound to offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not take the honor upon himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed

by him who said to him, "Thou art my Son, today I have begotten thee"; as he says also in another place, "Thou art a priest for ever, after the order of Melchizedek."

GOSPEL - St. Mark 8:34-38; 9:1

The Lord said: "If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? For what can a man give in return for his life? For whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."

#### 2022 Stewardship Report

#### Comments:

- -As of this week, **86 Pledge Cards** have been turned into the office totaling **\$128,640** in pledges. For comparison, a year ago as of March 25th we had 87 stewards totaling \$110,715 in pledges.
- -Jan/Feb 2022 (\$43,366) vrs. 2021 (\$41,275) increased +5%, which is good! We need to achieve \$25,000 this March in stewardship income to beat last year's 1st quarter.
- -By the end of 2021 we had 113 stewards, totaling \$146k, so we can expect to receive about 30 more stewards pledges this year.
- -Our 2022 stewardship goal should be to achieve a minimum of \$165k this year, especially with the loss of festival income & now the rental income from the property next door. If we can achieve total steward numbers of 115-120 then we **should** beat our total stewardship from last year.
- -Thank You to all who have promptly turned in your pledge cards! We are grateful for your support of St. George!
