PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE -Hebrews 7:26-28; 8:1-2

Brethren, it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, unstained, separated from sinners, exalted above the heavens. He has no need, like those high priests, to offer sacrifices daily, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did this once for all when he offered up himself. Indeed, the law appoints men in their weakness as high priests, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever. Now the point in what we are saying is this: we have such a high priest, one who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven, a minister in the sanctuary and the true tent which is set up not by man but by the Lord.

GOSPEL - St. Luke 10:25-37

At that time, a lawyer stood up to put Jesus to the test, saying, "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read?" And he answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and

with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." And he said to him, "You have answered right; do this, and you will live." But he, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him, and departed, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he was; and when he saw him, he had compassion, and went to him and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine; then he set him on his own beast and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, 'Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back.' Which of these three, do you think, proved neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed mercy on him." And Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM — Today we commemorate **St. John Chrysostom** (347-407). He was Archbishop of Constantinople, serving as a notable Christian hierarch and preacher from the fourth and fifth centuries in Syria and Constantinople. He is famous for his eloquence in public speaking, his philanthropy, and for the Divine Liturgy attributed to him. Collections of his inspiring and educational sermons are available in both print and online editions. The Orthodox Church commemorates him as one of the Three Great Hierarchs, along with St. Basil the Great and St. Gregory the Theologian on January 30th every year.

Liturgical Notes for Today

At the Entrance of the Gospel: **1) Entrance Hymn:** "O faithful let us sing a hymn of praise and worship to the Logos, Who is coeternal with the Father and the Spirit, Who was born of the Virgin for our salvation. Of His own free will, He went upon the Cross in the flesh, and suffered death to raise the death through His glorious Resurrection."/Tov Συναναρχον Λογον...; **2)** "The grace of Your words illuminated the universe like a shining beacon. It amassed treasures of munificence in the world. It demonstrated the greatness of humility, teaching us by your own words; therefore, O Father John Chrysostom, intercede to Christ the Logos for the salvation of our souls."/ Η του στοματος σου...; **3) Hymn for St. George. 4) Kontakion Hymn:** "Today the most pure temple of the Savior, the precious bridal chamber and Virgin, the sacred treasure of the glory of God enters this house of the Lord bringing with Her the grace of the Divine Spirit. The angels of God praise Her. She is the heavenly tabernacle."/O Καθαρωτατος ναος...

OUR "WOUNDED HEALER"

In today's Epistle passage, St. Paul notes that our Lord is our "High Priest," Who offers Himself willingly as a sacrifice for our lives. In today's Gospel, we hear about the "Good Samaritan." This outsider "Samaritan" is Christ our God Who takes upon Himself the burden of caring for the man who was beaten on the road to Jericho. This "man" represents all of us who are beaten up by the trials and temptations in this present life.

Let us remember that our Lord ascended the Cross with wounds all over His Sacred Body — each wound spiritually representing the wounds that we endure in body and soul as we go through life. Truly, our Lord participates in our wounds, as well as in our death, which means that the wounds of Christ our God heal our wounds and His death gives us life. Christ is with us in our pain and with us in our trials. We are not alone! In His presence, we find healing peace and strength.

As Christ endures our wounds with us, we are called to help heal the spiritual and even the physical wounds of one another. This begins with prayer; for, we are all created to be like God in the Spirit of love. In this reality, we can understand the prayer of the Divine Liturgy, recalling the words of our Lord, "Where two or three are gathered together in My Name, I am in the midst of them." Gathering together in the Lord's Name, i.e., participating together in the Divine Liturgy, places each of us in the presence of Christ our God — our "Wounded Healer." +FR. THEODORE

Στην σημερινήν Ευαγγελικήν περικοπήν, ακούμε για τον «Καλόν Σαμαρείτη». Αυτός ο ξένος «Σαμαρείτης» είναι ο Χριστός που παίρνει επάνω Του το βάρος να βοηθήσει τον άνθρωπο που ξυλοκοπήθηκε στην οδό προς την Ιεριχώ. Αυτός ο «άνθρωπος» αντιπροσωπεύει όλους εμάς που έχουμε χτυπηθεί από τις δοκιμασίες και τους πειρασμούς σε αυτή την παρούσαν ζωή.

Μάλιστα, ο Κύριος ανέβηκε επάνω στον Σταυρό με πληγές σε όλο Του το Ιερό Σώμα – κάθε πληγή αντιπροσωπεύει κατά πνευματικό τροπό τις πληγές που εμεις υπομένουμε σωματικώς και ψυχικώς καθώς περνάμε από αυτήν την επίγειον ζωή. Πραγματικά, ο Κύριός υπομένει μαζί μας τις πληγές μας, καθώς και το θάνατό μας, πράγμα που σημαίνει ότι οι πληγές του Χριστου ιατρεύουν τις πληγές μας και ο θάνατός Του μας δίνει ζωή. Ο Χριστός είναι μαζί μας στον πόνο μας και μαζί μας στις δοκιμασίες μας. Δεν είμεθα εγκαταλελειμμένοι! Στην παρουσία Του, βρίσκουμε θεραπευτική ειρήνη και ενίσχυση.

Καθώς ο Χριστός υπομένει τις πληγές μας μαζί μας, καλούμεθα να βοηθήσουμε ο ένας τον άλλον προς την θεραπείαν των πνευματικών και σωματικών πληγών μας. Αυτό χρειάζεται προσευχή, γιατί, όλοι μας είμεθα πλασμένοι να ομοιάσουμεν τον Θεό εν Πνεύματι αγάπης. Archiepiscopal Encyclical for National Philoptochos Sunday

November 13, 2022

Commemoration of the Parable of the Good Samaritan (8th Sunday of Luke)

Unto...the entirety of the Christ-named Plenitude of the Holy Archdiocese of America:

Is there no balm in Gilead, is there no physician there? (Jeremiah 8:22)

Beloved Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We celebrate National Philoptochos Sunday on the day that we remember the parable of the "Good Samaritan," when mercy and unconditional compassion are manifest as the highest Christian virtues. A stranger was robbed and wounded, left for dead. And another stranger, a Samaritan, changes the course of the man's life. He refuses to pass by, as did the so-called religious figures in the parable. The Samaritan answers the question that the Prophet Jeremiah poses: "Is there no balm in Gilead?" And he answers in a resounding "Yes, there is!"

So it is also with our Philoptochos societies from coast to coast. They apply the balm of love and compassion to all who come their way, and particularly to the vital philanthropic ministries of the Mother Church of Constantinople. Especially in this year when the Balıklı Hospital has experienced such a devastating fire, I encourage all of you to be generous with Philoptochos, who never fail to provide for these charitable causes.
