TOWARD THE HEALING OF OUR SOULS

The ultimate evil is death itself, the cause of which is sin (estrangement from God through thoughts, words and deeds). In today's Gospel, the young man who died was the only son of a widow. Our Savior chose this occasion to emphasize His own ministry for the salvation of humanity. Just as the widow wept because her only son had died, so the whole world weeps at the loss of loved ones. Even the Most Holy Theotokos wept at the foot of our Lord's Cross. However, by raising the young man back to life, our Lord tells us that He is our Life-Giving God, Who Himself will conquer death by His own death, and raise us to life with Him in His Holy Resurrection. As the widow's sorrow turned to joy with the life of her son, so the sorrow of the Holy Theotokos (and of all of humanity) will turn to joy with the Resurrection of Christ our God.

In that death is the result of sin, St. Paul urges us to "cleanse ourselves of every defilement of soul and body." (2 Corinthians 7:1). I like what we read in the Orthodox Study Bible regarding these words: "An escape from filthiness requires more than thinking repentant thoughts. For, we are enmeshed in a spiritual war zone, entrenched in patterns of sin that become habitual. Often, darkness becomes imprinted in our souls and bodies so that even our wills are bypassed and we sin automatically. To <u>cleanse ourselves</u> means that, by the promises of God, we embark on a sustained struggle for holiness. This cleansing includes genuine sorrow for our sins, confession, and repentance. It means a willful avoidance of sin-arousing situations, reconciliation with those we have wronged, the resolute practice of Christian virtue, and cleaving to God through faith and prayer. It calls us to participation in the holy Sacraments...It is the Holy Spirit Who cleanses us from every stain and heals our infirmities..."

Το απόλυτο κακό είναι ο ίδιος ο θάνατος, αιτία του οποίου είναι η αμαρτία (αποξένωση από τον Θεό μέσω σκέψεων, λόγων και πράξεων). Κατά την σημερινή Ευαγγελική περικοπή, γνωρίζομεν το περιστατικό της αναστάσεως ενός νεαρού — υιός μιάς χήρας. Ο Ιησούς εδιάλεξε αυτή την ευκαιρία για να τονίσει τη δική Του διακονία προς σωτηρίαν της ανθρωπότητος. Όπως η χήρα έκλαψε επειδή απέθανε ο μόνος υιός της, έτσι και όλος ο κόσμος κλαίει για την απώλεια αγαπημένων προσώπων. Ωστόσο, αναστώντας τον νεαρό στι ζωή, ο Χριστός διδάσκει ότι είναι ο Ιδιος ο Ζωοδόχος Θεός μας, ο Οποίος ενίκησε τον θάνατο με τον δικό Του θάνατο για να μας αναστήσει στη ζωήν της Αιωνίου Βασιλείας Του. Όπως η λύπη της χήρας μετατράπηκε σε χαρά με τη ζωή του υιού της, έτσι και η λύπη της Υπεραγίας Θεοτόκου (και όλης της ανθρωπότητος) θα μετατραπεί σε χαρά με την Ανάσταση του Χριστού.

Ο Άγ. Παύλος μας προτρέπει να «καθαρίσουμε τους εαυτούς μας από κάθε μόλυσμα ψυχής και σώματος». (2 Κορ. 7:1). Οι Ορθόδοξοι θεολόγοι γράφουν στο Orthodox Study Bible: «Η απόδραση από τη βρωμιά απαιτεί περισσότερα από το να σκέπτεσαι μετανοιωμένες σκέψεις. Διότι, βρισκόμεθα μπλεγμένοι σε μια πνευματική εμπόλεμη κατάσταση, εδραιωμένη σε πρότυπα αμαρτίας που γίνονται συνηθισμένα. Συχνά, το σκοτάδι αποτυπώνεται στις ψυχές και τα σώματά μας, έτσι ώστε ακόμη και η δική μας θέληση παρακάμπτεται και αμαρτάμε αυτόματα. Το να καθαρίσουμε τον εαυτό μας σημαίνει ότι, με τις υποσχέσεις του Θεού, ξεκινάμε έναν διαρκή αγώνα για αγιότητα. Αυτή η κάθαρση περιλαμβάνει γνήσια θλίψη για τις αμαρτίες μας, εξομολόγηση και μετάνοια. Σημαίνει ηθελημένη αποφυγή καταστάσεων που προκαλούν αμαρτία, συμφιλίωση με αυτούς που αδικήσαμε, αποφασιστική άσκηση της χριστιανικής αρετής και προσκόλληση στον Θεό μέσω της πίστεως και της προσευχής. Μας καλεί να συμμετάσχουμε στα ιερά Μυστήρια...Το Άγ. Πνεύμα είναι που μας καθαρίζει από κάθε κηλίδα και θεραπεύει τις ασθένειές μας...» +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ




OUR THEME FOR THE YEAR: UNDERSTANDING THE DIVINE LITURGY




