

PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE - Titus 3:8-15

Titus, my son, the saying is sure. I desire you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to apply themselves to good deeds; these are excellent and profitable to men. But avoid stupid controversies, genealogies, dissensions, and quarrels over the law, for they are unprofitable and futile. As for a man who is factious, after admonishing him once or twice, have nothing more to do with him, knowing that such a person is perverted and sinful; he is self-condemned. When I send Artemas or Tychicos to you, do your best to come to me at Nicopolis, for I have decided to spend the winter there. Do your best to speed Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their way; see that they lack nothing. And let our people learn to apply themselves to good deeds, so as to help cases of urgent need, and not to be unfruitful. All who are with me send greeting to you. Greet those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.

GOSPEL - St. Luke 8:5-15

The Lord said this parable: "A sower went out to sow his seed; and as he sowed, some fell along the path, and was trodden under foot, and the birds of the air devoured it. And some fell on the rock; and as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some fell into good soil and grew, and yielded a hundredfold." And when his disciples asked him what this parable meant, he said, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of God; but for others they are in parables, so that seeing they may not see, and hearing they may not understand. Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. The ones along the path are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, that they may not believe and be saved. And the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear the word, receive it with joy; but these have no root, they believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. And as for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bring forth fruit with patience." As he said these things, he cried out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

THE 7th ECUMENICAL COUNCIL — The doctrines of the Orthodox Church are inspired by the Holy Spirit as the Patriarchs and faithful gather for Ecumenical Councils, having as their template the Apostolic Council of Jerusalem described in the Book of Acts (15:1-31). The 7th Ecumenical Council was held in Nicea in 787 A.D., and decreed that Holy Icons are to be placed in churches and in homes to be help-aids for prayer. Holy Icons are justified, since God became Man & so-journed with humankind — as all are in God's Image and Likeness. +FR. TED

Liturgical Notes for Today

At the Entrance of the Gospel: 1) Entrance Hymn: "O Savior, Your tomb was sealed by the Jews with a stone; soldiers kept watch over Your sacred Body. Yet, You rose on the third day, giving life to the world. Wherefore, the powers of heaven cried out to You, O Giver of Life: 'Glory to Your Resurrection; glory to Your Kingdom; glory to Your dispensation, Who alone is the Loving One."/Του Λιθου σφραγισθεντος...; 2)"You are greatly glorified, O Christ our God, Who established the Fathers as luminaries upon the earth, and through them led us all to the True Faith, O Most Compassionate, glory to You./Υπερδεδοξασμενος... ;3) Hymn for St. George. 4) Kontakion Hymn: "Champion of Christians put not to shame, advocate before the Maker always steadfast, do not spurn sinners' voices raised in prayer. THE STRUGGLE

In today's Gospel, we heard our Savior's Parable about of "The Sower and the Seeds." In our current times, unfortunately, God's Word has become just "one more ideology" among others. Especially now, we live in a "culture of science." However, we must realize that science itself can be used against us by the devil in order to turn us away from God. As Orthodox Christians, we know that with love for God, the purpose of science is to glorify God, not for us to "play god." By "playing god," it seems easier to deny the existence of sin, so that we can be "free" to do whatever we want, justifying our actions by virtue of our environment, or by virtue of our mental and physical conditions, rather than allowing our conscience to be our guide.

In the culture of Orthodox Christianity, many saints lived in hostile environments and were also afflicted with weakness or with passions of lust, greed, laziness, or anger, to which they admitted.* Rather than justifying misbehavior, they offered prayers like that in our Divine Liturgy: "I believe and confess that You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God, Who came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the first... Make me worthy to partake of Your Precious Body and Blood...unto remission of sins and life everlasting..." In their humility, their ultimate goal was to praise God with all of their soul, rather than to disobey God for any reason. They showed that the soul can rule the body! In their struggles, they would fall, yet they rose up again and again -- and, through continued repentance, over years, in our Lord's good time, sinners have become saints.

Orthodoxy is a life-style of struggle against imperfections, passions, and temptations. Yet, because we are all called to struggle against our temptations and passions, knowing that each person struggles according to his or her ability, there is no room to condemn anyone -- nor are we to give up on ourselves. It is the sin that is condemned, not the person. There is always hope for salvation; for, God is ready to forgive our sins. +FR. THEODORE *Examples: Prophet Moses (speech impediment), Sts. Mary of Egypt (lust), Moses the Ethiopian (greed), John Cassian (anger), Paul (thorn in the flesh)

Στην σημερινή Ευαγγελική περικοπή, ακούσαμε την Παραβολή του Σωτήρος μας για τον «Σπορέα και τους Σπόρους». Στη σημερινή εποχή μας, δυστυχώς, ο Λόγος του Θεού έχει γίνει απλώς «μια ακόμη ιδεολογία» μεταξύ άλλων. Ειδικά τώρα, ζούμε σε μια «κουλτούρα της επιστήμης». Ωστόσο, πρέπει να συνειδητοποιήσουμε ότι η ίδια η επιστήμη μπορεί να χρησιμοποιηθεί εναντίον μας από τον διάβολο για να μας απομακρύνει από τον Θεό. Ως Ορθόδοξοι Χριστιανοί, γνωρίζουμε ότι με την αγάπη για τον Θεό, σκοπός της επιστήμης είναι να δοξάζει τον Θεό, όχι εμείς να «παίζουμε σαν θεοί». Με το να «παίζουμε σαν θεοί», φαίνεται πιό εύκολο να αρνηθούμε την ύπαρξη της *αμαρτίας*. Θέλουμε να είμεθα «ελεύθεροι» να κάνουμε ό,τι θέλουμε, δικαιολογώντας τις πράξεις μας λόγω του περιβάλλοντός μας ή των ψυχικών και σωματικών μας συνθηκών, αντί να επιτρέπουμε στη συνείδησή μας να είναι ο οδηγός μας.

Στόχος των αγίων ήταν να δοξάσουν τον Θεό με όλη τους την ψυχή, αντί να ατιμάσουν τον Θεό για οποιονδήποτε λόγο. Έδειξαν ότι η ψυχή μπορεί να κυβερνήσει το σώμα! Στους αγώνες τους ενάντια στους πειρασμούς και τα πάθη, θα έπεφταν, ωστόσο σηκώνονταν ξανά και ξανά -- και, μέσω της συνεχούς μετάνοιας, καθώς περνούσαν τα χρόνια, στην καλή ώρα του Κυρίου, οι αμαρτωλοί έγιναν άγιοι.

Η Ορθοδοξία είναι ένας τρόπος ζωής αγώνος ενάντια στις ατέλειες, τα πάθη και τους πειρασμούς μας. Συνέγεια στην επόμενη σελίδα ---->

Ωστόσο, επειδή όλοι καλούμεθα να αγωνισθούμε ενάντια στους πειρασμούς και τα πάθη μας, γνωρίζοντας ότι ο καθένας αγωνίζεται σύμφωνα με τις δυνατότητές του, δεν υπάρχει λόγος να καταδικάσουμε κανέναν -- ούτε να απελπιζόμεθα για τη δική μας σωτηρία. Είναι η αμαρτία που καταδικάζεται, όχι ο άνθρωπος. Υπάρχει πάντα ελπίδα για την σωτηρία μας, γνωρίζοντας ότι ο Θεός είναι έτοιμος να συγχωρήσει τις αμαρτίες μας. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ


