PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE -- Galatians 1:11-19

Brethren, I would have you know that the gospel which was preached by me is not man's gospel. For I did not receive it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through a revelation of Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my former life in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it; and I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people, so extremely zealous was I for the traditions of my fathers. But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son to me, in order that I might preach him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with flesh and blood, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me, but I went away into Arabia; and again I returned to Damascus. Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas, and remained with him fifteen days. But I saw none of the other apostles except James the Lord's brother.

GOSPEL -- St. Luke 16:19-31

The Lord said, "There was a rich man, who was clothed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazaros, full of sores, who

desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man's table; moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried; and in Hades, being in torment, he lifted up his eyes, and saw Abraham far off and Lazaros in his bosom. And he called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy upon me, and send Lazaros to dip the end of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in anguish in this flame.' But Abraham said, 'Son, remember that you in your lifetime received your good things, and Lazaros in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in anguish. And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been fixed, in order that those who would pass from here to you may not be able, and none may cross from there to us.' And he said, 'Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they also come into this place of torment.' But Abraham said, 'They have Moses, and the prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham; but if some one goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to them, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced if some one should rise from the dead.'"

Sts. Zenobios & Zenobia --Today we commemorate Sts. Zenobios & Zenobia. These Saints were from Aegae in Cilicia, brought up in piety by their parents. Zenobios was a physician, and healed many freely by the power of God; because of his virtue he was consecrated Bishop of Aegae. With his sister he was taken by Lysias the Governor, and after many tortures they were beheaded, about the year 290, during the reign of Diocletian. -- Taken from www.goarch.com.

At the Entrance of the Gospel: 1) **Entrance Hymn**: "Let the heavens rejoice and the earth be glad, for the Lord with His mighty arm has created a dominion. He has conquered death by death and become the first born of the dead. He has delivered us from the depths of Hades and has granted the world great mercy." / Ευφραινεσθω τα ουρανια...; **2)** "For their struggles, O Lord, Your martyrs received the crown of immortality from You our God. Armed with Your might, they defeated the tyrants. They also crushed the arrogance of demons. By their intercessions, O Christ our God, save our souls." / Οι Μαρτυρες Σου,Κυριε...**3) Hymn for St. George**. **4) Kontakion Hymn**: "Champion of Christians put not to shame, advocate before the Maker always steadfast, do not spurn sinners' voices raised in prayer. In your goodness respond to bring help to us who devoutly petition you. Hasten you intercession and urgently make entreaty; for you unfailingly defend, Theotokos, those who honor you."/Προστασια των Χριστιανων...

THE GREAT CHASM

There are many things that cannot co-exist, nor can they even come close to co-existing or "bordering" each other. Among those things, oil and water, even if they appear in the same glass, are "miles" apart, and can never come to oneness. Also, and more apropos to today's Gospel message, sin and virtue, as well as Heaven and hell, cannot co-exist. Thus, when we heard the Lord's Parable about the Rich Man and Lazarus today, Father Abraham's words to the rich man who was condemned to hell ring true -- "between us and you a great chasm has been fixed…"

One of the tricks of the devil is to make us think that we can always "have it both ways" -- that we can be good Christians, while not living a Christian life-style that is reflective of our prayers; that we can be self-centered (as was the rich man) and still be entitled to have love from God and others. The reality is, however, that there exists a great chasm between self-centeredness and Christ-centeredness; between faith in God and atheism; between obedience and disobedience when it comes to the life of the Church. The rich man's self-centeredness rendered him all alone, while the righteous Lazarus was in blessed company along with "Father Abraham."

Yes, self-centeredness gives way to loneliness. Christ-centeredness gives way to peace, contentment and holiness. Indeed, God gave us free will. But, just because we can choose, doesn't guarantee happiness or blessedness. Choice always has the consequence of either guilt or inner peace. If we choose as God wills we find fulfillment, since we are, after all, created in His Image and Likeness. +FR. THEODORE

Υπάρχουν πολλές πραγματικότητες που δεν μπορούν να συνυπάρξουν, ούτε να πλησιάσουν στο να συνυπάρξουν ή να «συνορευθούν» μεταξύ τους. Ανάμεσά τους, υπάρχουν το λάδι και το νερό. Ακόμα κι αν εμφανίζονται στο ίδιο ποτήρι, δεν μπορούν ποτέ να ενοποιηθούν. Επίσης, και περισσότερο ανάλογα με το σημερινό μήνυμα της Ευαγγελικής περικοπής: η αμαρτία και η αρετή, καθώς και ο Παράδεισος και η κόλαση, δεν μπορούν να συνυπάρχουν. Έτσι, όταν ακούσαμε την Παραβολή του Κυρίου για τον Πλούσιο και τον Λάζαρο σήμερα, τα λόγια του Πατρός Αβραάμ προς τον πλούσιο που καταδικάστηκε στην κόλαση δηλώνουν την αλήθεια: «μεταξύ ημών και υμών χάσμα μέγα εστήρικται...»

Μία από τις απάτες του διαβόλου είναι να μας κάνει να πιστεύουμε ότι μπορούμε να είμθα καλοί Χριστιανοί, ενώ δεν χρειάζεται να ζούμε σαν καλοί Χριστιανοί. Ωστόσο, η πραγματικότητα είναι ότι υπάρχει ένα μεγάλο χάσμα μεταξύ του «εγω-κεντρισμού» και του «Χριστο-κεντρισμού,» και επίσης μεταξύ των ανθρώπων που έχουν πίστη στον Θεό και εκείνων που είναι άθεοι. Χάσμα υπάρχει μεταξύ υπακοής και ανυπακοής όταν πρόκειται για τη πνευματική ζωή. Η «εγω-κεντρικότητα» του πλούσιου τον έκανε ολομόναχο, ενώ ο δίκαιος Λάζαρος είχε μια «ευλογημένη παρέα» με τον Πατέρα Αβραάμ.

Πράγματι, ο Θεός μας έδωσε το αυτεξούσιον. Αλλά, μόνο και μόνο επειδή μπορούμε να κάνουμε επιλογές, ούτε η ευτυχία, ούτε η ευλογία είναι εγγυημένα. Η επιλογή έχει πάντα ως συνέπεια την ενοχή, από τη μια πλευρά, ή την εσωτερική γαλήνη, από την άλλη. Αν επιλέξουμε όπως θέλει ο Θεός ευρίσκουμε πνευματική γαλήνη, αφού τελικά είμεθα πλασμένοι κατ' εικόνα και καθ' ομοίωσιν του Θεού. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

Archiepiscopal Encyclical for the Feast of the Holy Unmercenaries, Saints Cosmas and Damian

October 30, 2022

Unto ...the entirety of the Christ-named Plenitude of the Holy Archdiocese of America:

O holy Unmercenaries and Wonderworkers, visit our infirmities. Freely have you received, freely give unto us. (Apolytikion, Plagal of the Fourth Mode)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Holy Saints Cosmas and Damian are the best example to all of us, as we consider the work of our National Philoptochos on behalf of the benevolent and philanthropic ministries of the Ecumenical Patriarchate. By definition, an ἀνάργυρος — which literally means, "one who refuses silver" — is the exact opposite of a φιλάργυρος, a "lover of silver," the appellation given to the Betrayer of the Lord who took the thirty pieces.

And it is the character of the Philoptochos, giving away the monies that it receives, not hoarding or heaping up "treasures on earth" (Matthew 6:19), which is the character that makes miracles happen in our midst. In all its philanthropies and charitable works, Philoptochos creates the conditions where people rise above their circumstances, and exceed themselves to become the image of God, in which they were created.

Philoptochos knows the truth of our Divine Liturgy: $T\grave{\alpha}$ o\grave{\alpha} \grave{\epsilon}\kappa $t\~{\omega}v$ o $\~{\omega}v$ — Your own of Your own — that everything we have comes from God, and when we return it to Him in thanksgiving, there is transformation. This is what the last part of the Apolytikion of the Patrons Cosmas and Damian means. These words echo the command of Christ to His disciples (Matthew 10:8); these words are the foundation of generosity in the Church.

Therefore, I exhort every parish and parishioner to heed our faith and this consummate teaching of goodness and beneficence. Our Philoptochos Societies are extending their hands in order to the support of the needs of the Mother Church. Especially after the fire at the Balıklı Hospital, which serves so many of our brothers and sisters in the $\Pi \dot{o} \lambda \eta$, let us help to fill the hands of our Philoptochos Sisters with the means to do good in this world. Through the intercessions of the Holy Unmercenaries and Wonderworkers Cosmas and Damian. Amen!



Dr. Tibbs' presentations are fast-moving, interactive, visually interesting, and accessible!




