PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

EPISTLE -- 2 Timothy 3:10-15

Timothy, my son, you have observed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, my persecutions, my sufferings, what befell me at and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank Antioch, at Iconion, and at Lystra, what persecutions I endured; yet from them all the Lord rescued me. Indeed all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, while evil men and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceivers and deceived. But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom to his house justified rather than the other; you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings which are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

GOSPEL - St. Luke 18:10-14

The Lord said this parable, "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, I give tithes of all that I get.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."

THE TRIODION

Today is the Sunday of the Publican (Tax-Collector) and the Pharisee. This Sunday every year marks the beginning of a short liturgical season of the Greek Orthodox Church, which is known as "The Triodion." The Triodion (Greek: Tri -oh-dhi-ohn) is the liturgical book used by the Orthodox Church. The book contains the rubrics for the fasting period preceding Easter and for the weeks leading up to Great Lent. The "Kanonion Hymns for weekday Orthros Services in the Triodion contain only three odes and so are known as "triodes" after which the Triodion takes its name. The Triodion season begins with a week in which there is no fasting, including on Wednesdays and Fridays, which are normally kept as fast days throughout the year (with few exceptions). +FR. Liturgical Notes for Today

At the Entrance of the Gospel: 1) **Entrance hymn**: "Savior, Your tomb was sealed by the Jews with a stone. Soldiers kept watch over Your—sacred Body. Yet, You rose on the third day, giving life to the world. Wherefore, the powers of heaven cried out to You, O Giver of Life, "Glory to Your Resurrection, O Christ; glory to Your Kingdom; glory to Your dispensation who alone are the Loving One."/Του λίθου σφραγισθέντος…

- 2) "Hail Virgin Theotokos full of Grace, for Christ our God, the Sun of Righteousness, has dawned from You, granting light to those in darkness. And you, O Righteous Elder, rejoice, taking in your arms, the Deliverance of our souls, Who grants us Resurrection."/Χαίρε κεχαριτωμένη Θεοτόκε Παρθένε...
- 3) "Since you are a deliverer of captives..." [Hymn of St. George]/Ως των αιχμαλώτων ελευθερωτής...
- 4) **Kontakion:** "Your birth sanctified a Virgin's womb and fittingly blessed the hands of Symeon. You have now come and saved us O Christ, our God. In troubled times, as the only loving One, give peace to Your commonwealth and strength to those in civil authority, whom You love."/Ο μητραν παρθενικην αγιασας...

THE PERILS OF PRIDE

Today we heard the Parable of our Lord about the Pharisee and the tax-collector (Publican). The *pride* of the Pharisee was exposed at the very moment when he passed judgment upon the tax-collector, which cancelled any good that he might have had accomplished through fasting and tithing. Pride draws us into comparing ourselves with others, often causing depression for not feeling "good enough," or causing us to consider ourselves to be even better than others, and, thus, we fall into the nets of self-righteousness and the condemnation of others. Depression and self-righteousness often lead to a multitude of conflicts with others, giving way to the perils of anger and/or hatred.

The *humility* of the tax-collector was the beginning of his salvation. Humility is made up of love for God, along with faith in God's mercy. Love for God means that we want to be with God in everything we do. It also means that we have faith in God's mercy, guiding us in our words and actions, and protecting us from evil — both from the evil that can come from within us via anger or hatred, as well as from the evil that comes at us from the forces of the world. Our Lord's mercy is also His forgiveness.

If depression and self-righteousness leading to anger or hatred are the perils of pride, faith in the mercy of our God and Savior Jesus Christ, leading to forgiveness, peace and love is the reward of humility. +FR. THEODORE

Σήμερα ακούσαμε την Παραβολή του Κυρίου μας γιά τον Φαρισαίο και τον Τελώνη. Η υπερηφάνεια του Φαρισαίου αποκαλύφθηκε ακριβώς τη στιγμή που εκαταδίκασε τον Τελώνη, η οποία καταδίκη ακύρωσε κάθε καλό που θα ερχόταν από τη νηστεία και τις θρησευτικές προσφορές του. Η υπερηφάνεια μας κάνει να συγκρίνουμε τους εαυτούς μας με τους άλλους, που μερικές φορές μας κάνει να πέφτουμε σε κατάθλιψη επειδή δεν νιώθουμε «αρκετά καλοί», ή μας κάνει να θεωρούμεν τον εαυτόν μας ως ακόμα καλύτεροι από τους άλλους. Έτσι πέφτουμε στα δίχτυα της αυτοδικίας και της καταδικήσεως των άλλων. Η κατάθλιψη και η αυτοδικία συχνά οδηγούν σε ένα πλήθος συγκρούσεων με τους άλλους, δίνοντας τη θέση τους στις ζημιές από τον θυμό ή/και από το μίσος.

Η ταπεινοφροσύνη του Τελώνου ήταν η αρχή της σωτηρίας του. Η ταπεινοφροσύνη αποτελείται από αγάπη γιά τον Θεό, μαζί με πίστη στο έλεος του Θεού. Αγάπη γιά τον Θεό σημαίνει ότι θέλουμε να είμεθα με τον Θεό σε ό,τι κάνουμε. Σημαίνει επίσης ότι έχουμε πίστη στο έλεος του Θεού — ότι θα μας καθοδηγεί στα λόγια και στις πράξεις μας, και θα μας προστατεύει από το κακό — τόσο από το κακό που μπορεί να προέλθει από μέσα μας μέσω θυμού ή μίσους, όσο και από το κακό που μπορεί να μας έλθει από τις δυνάμεις του κόσμου. Το έλεος του Θεού είναι και η συγχώρεσις των αμαρτιών.

Εάν η κατάθλιψη και η αυτοδικία που οδηγούν σε θυμό ή μίσος είναι οι ζημιές από την υπερηφάνεια, η πίστη στον Κύριο που οδηγεί σε συγχώρεση των αμαρτιών, ειρήνη και αγάπη είναι η ανταμοιβή από την ταπεινόφροσυνη. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

The good news is we are expecting +6,000 visitors at our Festival on February 18th and 19th with good weather. This will amount to over 18,000 transactions at our booths.

The 2023 St George Festival will accept Credit / Debit Cards only for payment to improve transactional efficiency, eliminate manual bookkeeping and reduce the security concerns related to handling large amounts of cash.

We are using CLOVER Electronic Registers to process all transactions. These registers are like today's smartphones – ICON driven and intuitive after a short training session. I highly recommend Chairman and Cashiers attend at least 1 Hands On class to be comfortable with the new machines. See or contact Nick Latkovic with questions.

As with any new technology, there will be questions during the festival. We will have a roaming "Help Desk" team to assist cashiers with questions during the hours of operation.




