PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE - 1 Timothy 4:9-15

Timothy, my son, the saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance. For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all men, especially of those who believe. Command and teach these things. Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. Till I come, attend to the public reading of scripture, to preaching, to teaching. Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you by prophetic utterance when the council of elders laid their hands upon you. Practice these duties, devote yourself to them, so that all may see your progress.

GOSPEL - St. Luke 19:1-10

At that time, Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. And there was a man named

Zacchaios; he was a chief collector, and rich. And he sought to see who Jesus was, but could not, on account of the crowd, because he was small of stature. So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him, for he was to pass that way. And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaios, make haste and come down; for I must stay at your house today." So he made haste and came down, and received him joyfully. And when they saw it they all murmured, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner." And Zacchaios stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have defrauded any one of anything, I restore it fourfold." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. For the Son of man came to seek and to save the lost."

ST. TIMOTHY THE APOSTLE—The Apostle Timothy, who was from Lystra of Lycaonia, was born of a Greek (that is, pagan) father and a Jewish mother. His mother's name was Eunice, and his grandmother's name was Lois (II Tim. 1:5). He became the disciple of the Apostle Paul when the latter first preached there, and he followed St. Paul during the whole period of the Apostle's preaching. Afterwards, Timothy was consecrated by him as first Bishop of the church in Ephesus. Under the supervision of John the Evangelist, who governed all the churches in Asia, he completed his life as a martyr in the year 97. He was stoned to death by the heathens, because, as some surmise, he opposed the festival held in honor of Artemis (Diana). The Apostle Paul's First and Second Epistles to Timothy were written to him. —From Archdiocese website: www.goarch.com

Liturgical Notes for Today

At the Entrance of the Gospel:

- 1) Entrance hymn: "By Your Cross, O Christ our God, You destroyed death. You opened paradise to the thief. You transformed the lament of the Myrrh-bearing women, and You commanded the Apostles to proclaim You are risen, granting the world Your great mercy." /Κατέλησας τω Σταυρώ...
- 2) "O Apostle Timothy, thoroughly schooled in goodness and temperate in all things, a good conscience reverently adorns you. You drew forth from the Chosen Vessel the unrevealable. You kept the faith and completed the straight path. Intercede to Christ our God to save our souls."/Χρηστότητα εκδιδαχθείς και νηφών...
- 3) "Since you are a deliverer of captives..." [Hymn of St. George]/Ως των αιχμαλώτων ελευθερωτής...
- 4) **Kontakion:** "Your birth sanctified a Virgin's womb and fittingly blessed the hands of Symeon. You have now come and saved us O Christ, our God. In troubled times, as the only loving One, give peace to Your commonwealth and strength to those in civil authority, whom You love."/Ο μήτραν παρθενικήν αγιάσας...

THE EXAMPLE OF ZACCHAEUS

In today's Gospel passage, we have before us the example of Zacchaeus. Being a tax-collector, Zacchaeus committed the sins of betrayal and theft. He betrayed the Chosen People of God by collecting taxes from them in order to support the Roman Empire. He also defrauded the people from whom he collected taxes. None the less, Zacchaeus provides for each of us the example of repentance.

According to the Law, Zacchaeus was worthy of death. People who knew Zacchaeus had given up on him to such a degree that they condemned Jesus for wanting to be a guest at Zacchaeus' house. As such, Christ teaches us that repentance brings Christ into our "spiritual homes."

This same Gospel passage is read at the House Blessing Service for our faithful. Like with Zacchaeus, Jesus seeks to be the guest in our homes. But, like Zacchaeus, we need to repent of our sin of betrayal against our Lord and our fellow human beings, as well of our sin of self-centeredness. Just as we welcome any guest to our home by cleaning it and straightening it up, it would be a mistake for us to consider welcoming Christ into our home without cleaning up our souls —meaning that we set our motives aright and seek to do all that is according to His Will.

Repentance of sins gives a strong message of hope for everyone, because our Savior always shows that, with our repentance, He forgives our sins. In turn, by way of our example, we can give a strong message of faith and love for our Lord, God and Savior, Jesus Christ. +FR. THEODORE

Στη σημερινή Ευαγγελική περικοπή, έχουμε μπροστά μας το παράδειγμα του Ζακχαίου. Ό Ζακχαίος διέπραξε πολλες αμαρτίες. Επρόδωσε τον λαο του Θεού εισπράττοντας φόρους για να υποστηρίξει τη Ρωμαϊκή Αυτοκρατορία. Επισης, εξαπάτησε και τους ανθρώπους από τους οποίους εισέπραττε φόρους. Παρόλα αυτά, ο Ζακχαίος παρέχει στον καθένα μας το παράδειγμα της μετάνοιας.

Σύμφωνα με το Νόμο, ο Ζακχαίος έπρεπε να πεθάνει. Οι άνθρωποι που εγνώριζαν τον Ζακχαίο τον εκαταδίκασαν και εκαταδίκασαν και τον Χριστό που εζήτησε από τον Ζακχαίο την φιλοξενίαν του. Ωστόσο, ο Χριστός μας διδάσκει ότι η μετάνοια φέρνει τον Χριστό στο «ψυχικο μας σπιτι.»

Αυτή η ίδια Ευαγγελική περικοπή διαβάζεται όταν ο ιερέας εκτελεί την ακολουθία του Αγιασμού για να ευλογήσει ενα καινούριο σπίτι των ενοριτών. Όπως και με τον Ζακχαίο, ο Ιησούς ζητά να είναι φιλοξενούμενος στα σπίτια μας. Όμως, σαν τον Ζακχαίο, χρειάζεται να μετανοήσουμε για τις αμαρτίες μας, όπως σαν την προδοσία εναντίον του Κυρίου και των συνανθρώπων μας, καθώς και για την αμαρτία του εγωκεντρισμού μας. Ακριβώς όπως καλωσορίζουμε οποιονδήποτε επισκέπτη στο σπίτι μας και το καθαρίζουμε και το τακτοποιούμε, θα ήταν λάθος να καλωσορίσουμε τον Χριστό στο σπίτι μας χωρίς να καθαρίσουμε τις ψυχές μας, και να επιδιώκουμεν ό,τι είναι σύμφωνα με το θέλημα του Θεού. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ


