THE LADDER



EPISTLE— Romans 2:10-16

Brethren, glory and honor and peace for every one who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek. For God shows no partiality. All who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law. For it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law who will be justified. When Gentiles who have not the law do by nature what the law requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law. They show that what the law requires is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness and their conflicting thoughts accuse or perhaps excuse them on that day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus.

GOSPEL-St. Matthew 4:18-23

At that time, as Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Immediately they left their nets and followed him. And going on from there he saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left their boat and their father, and followed him. And he went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and preaching the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every infirmity among the people.

UNDERSTANDING THE BIBLE THROUGH THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

Yesterday's Gospel passage, St. Matthew 7:1-8, reminds us of Jesus' words, "Judge not, that you be not judged...First remove the plank from your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye." This leads us to today's Epistle passage, with these words, "[Gentiles] show that what the law requires is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness and their conflicting thoughts accuse or perhaps excuse them on that day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus." (Romans 2:15-16). Thus, we are not allowed to condemn other people, but we are responsible to be examples of a virtuous way of life in reflecting God's love. In this respect, we resemble the Apostles, who, as we heard in today's Gospel passage, left everything behind and followed Jesus throughout His ministry.

As Orthodox Christians, we are called to follow Jesus by living the life of the Church, guided by the Holy Spirit. Love means that we defend the teaching of our Lord. It does not mean that we compromise His teachings by agreeing that teachings and practices which are contrary to God's Law are in any way virtuous, or helpful in this present life, or beneficial for life in God's Eternal Kingdom. We must be vigilant in defending our Faith, first by following our Lord in living the life of the Church, and, second, by discerning the mentality of our age so that we are not deceived into accepting falsehood as truth. The life of the Church is itself the "guiding rule" by which we can discern whether behaviors, both those performed by us as individuals, as well as those that are popularized by society, are virtuous or sinful — and, in doing so, we are to urge our loved ones and others to avoid sins and cling to virtues. +FR. Η χθεσινή περικοπή, εκ του Ευαγγελίου κατά Ματθαίον, 7:1-8, μας θυμίζει τα λόγια του Ιησού, «Μὴ κρίνετε, ίνα μὴ κριθὴτε· ...ἐκβαλε πρώτον τὴν δοκὸν εκ του οφθαλμού σου, καὶ τότε διαβλέψεις εκβαλείν τὸ κάρφος εκ του οφθαλμού του αδελφού σου.» Αυτό μας οδηγεί στη σημερινη περικοπή εκ της Επιστολής του Αγ. Παύλου, που έγραψε, «Όταν γὰρ τα έθνη τὰ μὴ νόμον έχοντα φύσει τὰ του νόμου ποιή, ούτοι νόμον μὴ έχοντες εαυτοίς εἰσι νόμος, οίτινες ενδείκνυνται τὸ έργον του νόμου γραπτὸν εν ταις καρδίαις αυτών συμμαρτυρούσης αυτών της συνειδήσεως καὶ μεταξὺ αλλήλων τῶν λογισμών κατηγορούντων ἡ καὶ απολογουμένων - εν ημέρα ότε κρινεί ὁ Θεὸς τὰ κρυπτὰ των ανθρώπων κατὰ τὸ ευαγγέλιόν μου διὰ Ἰησού Χριστού.» (Ρωμ. 2:15-16). Έτσι, δεν επιτρέπεται να καταδικάζουμε ἀλλους ανθρώπους, αλλά εἰμεθα υπεύθυνοι να εἰμεθα παραδείγματα ενάρετου τρόπου ζωής αντανακλώντας την αγάπη του Θεού. Από αυτή την ἀποψη, μοιάζουμε με τους Αποστόλους, οι οποίοι, όπως ακούσαμε στη σημερινή περικοπή του Ευαγγελίου, ἀφησαν τα πάντα πίσω και ακολούθησαν τον Ιησού στην διακονία Του.

Ως Ορθόδοξοι Χριστιανοί, καλούμεθα να ακολουθήσουμε τον Χριστό ζώντας τη ζωή της Εκκλησίας, καθοδηγούμενοι από το Άγιο Πνεύμα. Αγάπη σημαίνει ότι υπερασπιζόμεθα την διδασκαλία του Κυρίου μας. Δεν σημαίνει ότι συμβιβαζόμεθα με τις διδασκαλίες Του συμφωνώντας ότι οι πολλές σημερινές διδασκαλίες και πράξεις που αντιτάσσουν τον Νόμο του Θεού ακόμα είναι ενάρετες, ή βοηθητικές στην εδώ μας ζωή, ή ωφέλιμες για την Αιώνιον Ζωή. Πρέπει να είμεθα σε εγρήγορση στην υπεράσπιση της πίστεώς μας, πρώτα ακολουθώντας τον Χριστό δια μέσου της ζωής της Εκκλησίας και, δεύτερον, διακρίνοντας τη νοοτροπία της εποχής μας, ώστε να μην εξαπατηθούμε να δεχθούμε το ψέμα ως αλήθεια. Η ζωή της Εκκλησίας είναι η ίδια ο «κανόνας» με τον οποίο μπορούμε να διακρίνουμε εάν οι συμπεριφορές, τόσο αυτές που κάνουμε ως άτομα όσο και εκείνες που διαδίδονται από την κοινωνία, είναι ενάρετες ή αμαρτωλές — και κάνοντας αυτό, πρέπει να παροτρύνουμε τους αγαπημένους μας και τους άλλους να αποφεύγουν τις αμαρτίες και να προσκολλώνται στις αρετές. + Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ


