THE VENERATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE - Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:1-6 Brethren, since we have a high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. Because of this he is bound to offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not take the honor upon himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was

appointed by him who said to him, "Thou art my Son, today I have begotten thee"; as he says also in another place, "Thou art a priest for ever, after the order of Melchizedek."

GOSPEL - St. Mark 8:34-38; 9:1

The Lord said: "If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? For what can a man give in return for his life? For whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."

SERVICE OF THE VENERATION OF THE HOLY CROSS — Following the Prayer, "Save, O Lord Your people and bless Your inheritance..." (following Holy Communion), the choir / chanters sing: "Aghios o Theos, Aghios Ischyros, Aghios Athanatos, eleison imas." "Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy upon us." as the hierarch/priest carries in procession the tray holding the Holy Cross, which is decorated with many flowers and/or basil plants. The procession includes the deacon and Altar Boys as it continues around the interior of the church temple. When the procession arrives at the center of the church, in front of the Holy Altar, the hierarch/priest raises the tray with the Holy Cross high and exclaims: "Wisdom! Let us attend!" He then sets the Holy

Cross on a table arranged for this service and censes the Holy Cross as he proceeds around the table and chants: "Soson Kyrie ton laon Sou"... "Save, O Lord, Your people and bless Your inheritance granting Your rulers to prevail over adversaries, and protecting Your commonwealth by Your Cross." This hymn is repeated twice by the choir/chanters. Then, as the priest and deacon venerate the Holy Cross, the priest chants: "Ton Stavron Sou proskinoumen, Despota"... "We venerate Your Cross, O Christ, and Your Holy Resurrection we praise and glorify." This hymn is also repeated twice by the choir/chanters.

Liturgical Notes for Today

At the Entrance of the Gospel: 1) **Entrance hymn**: "By Your Cross, O Christ our God, You destroyed death. You opened Paradise to the thief. You transformed the lament of the Myrrh-bearing Women and You commanded the Apostles to proclaim You are risen, granting the world Your great mercy." Κατέλησας τω Σταυρώ...

- 2) "Lord, save Your people and bless Your inheritance, granting Your rulers to prevail over adversaries, and protecting Your commonwealth by Your Cross." $/ \Sigma \omega \sigma ov K \upsilon \rho i \varepsilon \tau ov \lambda a \dot{\sigma} v \Sigma ov ...$
 - 3) "Since you are a deliverer of captives..." [Hymn of St. George]/Ως των αιχμαλώτων ελευθερωτής...
- 4) **Kontakion:** "To You Theotokos, invincible Defender, having been delivered from peril, I, Your city, dedicate the victory festival as a thank offering. In Your irresistible might, keep me safe from all trials, that I may call out to You, 'Hail Unwedded Bride!'"/ $T\eta \ \Upsilon \pi \epsilon \rho \mu \dot{\alpha} \chi \omega$...
- 5) Liturgy of St. Basil. Instead of "Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal...", we chant, "We venerate Your Cross, O Christ, and Your Holy Resurrection, we praise and glorify."

THE POWER OF THE CROSS IS THE POWER OF REPENTANCE

On page 15 of our Divine Liturgy books, just before Psalm 50, we see a prayer that is read by the priest in preparation of the Great Entrance with the Holy Gifts: "Having beheld the Resurrection of Christ, let us worship the Holy Lord Jesus, the only sinless One. We venerate Your Cross, O Christ, and Your Holy Resurrection we praise and glorify; for You are our God, we know no other; it is Your Name we invoke. Come, all you faithful, let us worship Christ's Resurrection; for behold, through the Cross joy has come to all the world. Ever blessing the Lord, let us praise His Resurrection. For in enduring the Cross for us, He destroyed death by death."

As Christ our God saves us by way of enduring His Cross, which we venerate today, we unite ourselves in His love by way of enduring our cross. Our cross is the cross of our repentance from sins. Repentance requires sacrifice of our own will in order to honor God. Sins are born from willing that our names be glorified. Virtues are born from willing that the Name of Christ is glorified; for, Christ is our God, Who, by way of His own flesh has sanctified our flesh so that we are able to be united with the energies of God's eternal love. His Resurrection from the dead is, therefore, our resurrection from the dead, as well. It follows, that Christ is God. There is no other god who gives us eternal life.

The Resurrection of Christ our God is the reason for us to forgive the sins of those who have offended us and to seek forgiveness from those whom we have offended, understanding, of course, that offending others is intricately related to our tendency to offend God. By venerating the Cross of our Lord, we summon from within us our own "cross" of repentance, which gives the ultimate meaning to the word "forgiveness." The Cross of our Savior is, in essence, the gift of repentance — that "second chance" that is so precious for our peace of mind and our ultimate salvation in Christ. +FR. THEODORE

Στην σελίδα 15 του βιβλίου μας διά του οποίου παρακολουθούμε την εκτέλεσην της Θ. Λειτουργίας, ευρίσκομεν μιά προσευχή που ο λειτουργός διαβάζει προς προετοιμασίαν της Μ. Εισόδου: «Ανάστασιν Χριστού θεασάμενοι, προσκυνήσωμεν Άγιον Κύριον Ιησούν Χριστόν, τον μόνον αναμάρτητον. Τον Σταυρόν σου, Χριστέ, προσκυνούμεν και την Αγίαν Σου Ανάστασιν υμνούμεν και δοξάζομεν. Συ γαρ ει Θεός ημών, εκτός Σου άλλον ουκ οίδαμεν. Το όνομά Σου ονομάζομεν. Δεύτε πάντες οι πιστοί, προσκυνήσωμεν την του Χριστού Αγίαν Ανάστασιν. Ιδού γαρ ήλθε διά του Σταυρού χαρά εν όλω τω κόσμω. Διά παντός ευλογούντες τον Κύριον, υμνούμεν την Ανάστασιν Αυτού. Σταυρόν γαρ υπομείνας δι΄ ημάς θανάτω θάνατον ώλεσεν.»

Καθώς ο Χριστός μας χαρίζει την αιώνιον σωτηρία μέσω του Σταυρού, ενωνόμεθα με τον Χριστό μέσω του δικού μας «σταυρού», που είναι ο «σταυρός της μετανοίας». Η μετάνοια απαιτεί από εμάς μια θυσία της δικής μας θελήσεως προς δόξαν του Θεού. Ο Χριστός δια μέσου της σαρκός Του ηυλόγησε την σάρκα μας για να ενωθούμε με την ενέργεια της θεϊκής Του Αγάπης. Επομένως, η Ανάστασις του Χριστού εκ των νεκρών είναι και η προσωπική μας ανάστασις εκ των νεκρών. Πράγματι, δεν υπάρχει άλλος θεός!

Η Ανάστασις του Χριστού εκ των νεκρων είναι ο λόγος για να συγχωρηθούμε και να συγχωρήσουμεν άλλους. Προσκυνώντας τον Σταυρό σήμερα, φέρνουμε στον εαυτό μας τον «σταυρό της μετανοίας». Η μετάνοια μας δίνει την απόλυτη σημασία της λέξεως «συγχώρεση». Ο Σταυρός του Σωτήρος μας είναι στην ουσίαν το δώρο της μετάνοιας — το πολύτιμο δώρο της αιώνιου εν Χριστώ ειρήνης. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ

APRIL OUTREACH PROJECT


During the month of April, we are collecting **nonperishable food** to benefit families in need.






