### PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE— Hebrews 6:13-20

Brethren, when God made a promise to Abraham, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore to himself, saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, having patiently endured, obtained the promise. Men indeed swear by a greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he interposed with an oath, so that through two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible that God should prove false, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to seize the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek.

GOSPEL-St. Mark 9:17-31

At that time, a man came to Jesus kneeling and saying: "Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a dumb spirit; and wherever it seizes him it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able." And he answered them, "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you?

How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him; and when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, "How long has he had this?" And he said, "From childhood. And it has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you can do anything, have pity on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "If you can! All things are possible to him who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!" And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You dumb and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again." And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse; so that most of them said, "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting." They went on from there and passed through Galilee. And he would not have any one know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of man will be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him; and when he is killed, after three days he will rise."

# Archiepiscopal Encyclical on the Feast of the Annunciation of the Theotokos and the Celebration of Greek Independence Day

March 25, 2023

Unto the Most Reverend and Right Reverend Hierarchs, Pious Priests and Deacons, the Monks and Nuns, Presidents and Members of Parish Councils, Honorable Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, Members of Leadership 100, the Day and Afternoon Schools, Philoptochos Societies, the Youth, Greek Orthodox Organizations, and the entirety of the Christ-named Plenitude of the Holy Archdiocese of America:

Hail, unwavering tower of the Church, hail impenetrable wall of the Kingdom!

Beloved Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This Day of Greek Independence — when throughout Greece, Cyprus and the Hellenic Diaspora, the people of God celebrate freedom and remember the cost thereof — let us train our minds on the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary, who is the model for what that freedom truly means. We sing her praises throughout Great Lent in the magnificent Akathist Hymn, because March 25 is the date we observe her Annunciation of the Glad Tidings of the Lord's Incarnation, and because the Rebirth of the *Genos* is bound to her mighty intercessions.

The Theotokos is truly our "unwavering tower" and "impenetrable wall;" for she stands fast at the Throne of God in constant supplication for her People, the People of the Church, and the citizens of the coming Kingdom. She is the guarantor of our Faith; for she is the one who offered her humanity to God, so that God, in turn, could offer His Divinity to us. She manifests that each of us has a place in the work of salvation, for through her, we are consubstantial with the Son of God in His humanity, just as He is consubstantial with the Father and the Spirit in divinity.



The fact that the struggle for freedom is forever linked to the exercise of her own freedom, is a cause for celebration every day, and not only on March 25. We can hold in our minds and hearts the champions of 1821 in every *kairos*, for their example is ever-new and ever-young. Their sacrifices remind us of the costly price of liberty, so that we might never take for granted the freedoms won and what it takes to preserve them.

Therefore, my beloved brethren in the Lord, let us chant and magnify the Theotokos with joyous hymns and heartfelt supplications that may ever be worthy of the "unwavering tower" and "impenetrable wall" that surrounds us with love and spiritual protection. And may we ever bring to the exercise of our democracies of Greece, Cyprus, America, and everywhere in the Diaspora where "government of the people, by the people, for the people" is honored, the determination and responsibility to make us worthy of the freedoms that were gifted to us by the Heroes of 1821.

Long live Greece!

### Liturgical Notes for Today

At the Entrance of the Gospel: 1) **Entrance hymn**: "O Merciful One, You came from on high, and condescended to Your three-day burial to save us from passions. You are our life and Resurrection, O Lord, glory to You."/ Εξ ύψους κατήλθες...

- 2) "Since you are a deliverer of captives..." [Hymn of St. George]/Ως των αιχμαλώτων ελευθερωτής...
- 3) **Kontakion:** "To You Theotokos, invincible Defender, having been delivered from peril, I, Your city, dedicate the victory festival as a thank offering. In Your irresistible might, keep me safe from all trials, that I may call out to You, 'Hail Unwedded Bride!'"/ $T\eta Y\pi\epsilon\rho\mu\dot{\alpha}\chi\omega$ ...

### HOW CAN WE LIVE THE DIVINE LITURGY?

There are three "themes" of today's Gospel passage that help to define a life-style of one who wants to follow Christ our God: 1) the "theme" of faith (belief); 2) the "theme" of Christ's identity as True God; 3) the "theme" of prayer and fasting. 1) "I believe; help my unbelief!" This prayer was uttered by the father whose boy was possessed by a "dumb spirit." 2) "You deaf and dumb spirit, I command you: come out of him and never enter him again." With these words, our Savior both strengthened the father's faith and proved that He is indeed God, Who has authority over even the demons. 3) "This kind cannot be cast out, except by prayer and fasting." In this, we know that even the demons recognize the power of Christ.

St. John Climacus, whose memory we commemorate today, like all the Saints, noted that prayer and fasting go together in his book, *The Ladder of Divine Ascent*. In that prayer is the confession of faith in the fact that Jesus Christ is the only True God, the more we pray, the more we experience God's blessings; the more we experience God's blessings, the less we are encumbered by worldly cares, noting that fasting in itself is a discipline of avoiding worldly comforts, which demons use so as to tempt us.

Ultimately, prayer and fasting comprise the way by which we *live the Divine Liturgy*, as expressed in the Cherubic Hymn: "... As we sing the thrice-holy hymn to the life-giving Trinity, let us set aside all worldly care..." +FR. THEODORE

Υπάρχουν τρία «θέματα» της σημερινής Ευαγγελικής περικοπής που βοηθούν να κατανοήσουμε τον τρόπου ζωής ενος που θέλει να ακολουθήσει τον Χριστό: 1) το «θέμα» της πίστεως. 2) το «θέμα» της αποκαλύψεως οτι ο Χριστός είναι ο Αληθινός Θεός. 3) το «θέμα» της προσευχής και της νηστείας. 1) «Πιστεύω!» ειπε ο πατερας του κωφου παιδιου, «Βοήθει μου τη απιστία!» – μιά ολόκληρη προσευχή. 2) «Τὸ πνεύμα τὸ άλαλον καὶ κωφὸν, εγὼ σοι επιτάσσω, έξελθε εξ αὐτού καὶ μηκέτι εισέλθης εις αυτόν». Με αυτά τα λόγια, ο Χριστός ενίσχυσε την πίστη του πατρός και απέδειξε ότι είναι πράγματι ο Αληθινος Θεός, ο οποίος έχει εξουσία ακόμη και στους δαίμονες. 3) «Τούτο τὸ γένος εν ουδενὶ δύναται εξελθεῖν ει μη εν προσευχή καὶ νηστεία». Εν τούτοις, καταλαβαίνουμε ότι ακόμη και οι δαίμονες αναγνωρίζουν τη δύναμη του Χριστού.

Ο Άγιος Ιωάννης της Κλίμακος, του οποίου την μνήμη τιμούμε σήμερα, όπως όλοι οι Άγιοι, εσημείωσε ότι η προσευχή και η νηστεία πάνε μαζί. Η προσευχή ξεκινά με την αναγνώριση ότι ο Χριστός είναι αληθινός Θεός. Όσο περισσότερο προσευχόμεθα, τόσο περισσότερο βιώνουμε τις ευλογίες του Θεού. Όσο περισσότερο βιώνουμε τις ευλογίες του Θεού, τόσο λιγότερο επιβαρυνόμεθα από εγκόσμιες φροντίδες, σημειώνοντας ότι η νηστεία από μόνη της είναι μια πειθαρχία αποφυγής των κοσμικών πολυτέλειων, που χρησιμοποιούν οι δαίμονες για να μας φέρουν πειρασμούς.

Τελικά, η προσευχή και η νηστεία αποτελούν τον τρόπο με τον οποίο ζούμε την πνευματική ζωή της Θείας Λειτουργίας, όπως εκφράζεται στον Χερουβικό Ύμνο: «...Τη ζωοποιώ Τριάδι τον τρισάγιον ύμνον προσάδοντες, πάσαν την βιοτικήν αποθώμεθα μέριμναν...» +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ



Let's light the path around our Church during **Holy Friday Evening** services with the names of our loved ones who have passed on or our wishes for the health of our family and friends.


Each candle-lit bag will be personalized with either: "In Memory" (name) or "In Health" (name) depending on your choice.


