EPISTLE—2 Corinthians 4:6-15

Brethren, it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the mandment in the law?" And he said to him, glory of God in the face of Christ. But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For while we live we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

GOSPEL - St. Matthew 22:35-46

At that time, a lawyer asked him a question, to test him. "Teacher, which is the great com-"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets." Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them a question, saying, "What do you think of Christ? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David, inspired by the Spirit, calls him Lord, saying, 'The Lord said to my Lord, Sit at my right hand, till I put your enemies under your feet'? If David thus calls him Lord, how is he his son?" And no one was able to answer him a word, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS

By today's way of thinking, some would say that St. Paul's life was miserable. He was always being harassed, if not by Roman officials, or by citizens of the cities in which he preached, he was harassed by even some Christians themselves. In addition, he continually suffered from a "thorn in the flesh." However, in Christ's love, St. Paul found purpose and meaning in life in giving God's grace to more and more people. Despite his trials and tribulations, St. Paul reveals his happiness in seeing his spiritual children at peace and thankful to God for all blessings, "knowing that He who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into His presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God." (2 Corinthians 4:15).

Many have lived to tell us that happiness is not found in material pleasures and luxuries. They even coined such phrases as, "You can't buy love." and "Life is not a rose garden." The world is not perfect; people are not perfect; we are not perfect. As a result, unpleasant things will always happen, mostly through our own negligence or lack of wisdom. We can respond to life's set-backs either by making them worse by being angry, depressed or simply giving up, or we can turn to Christ our God, with faith, hope and love. Like Christ — and with His power — we can overcome life's set-backs, or more accurately, overcome ourselves; our shortcomings; our passions; our sins.

If we are looking to find a peaceful conscience; to have wholesome relationships with those around us, and to grow in wisdom, we will find lasting happiness in Christ. We are created in the Image of God, giving us the ability to behold the *uncreated Image of God*, Who is Christ. As we behold Christ, we become more and more what we are created to be, that is: "temples of God" without ego-centric pride and without our passions. This fact in itself makes our lives meaningful. We have more to give (i.e., we are more valuable) than with think. Like God, we can give genuine love, which makes us and those around us able to be united with God's divine energies. Sharing in God's glory is the foundational source of true and eternal joy!

Με τη σημερινή νοοτροπία, μερικοί θα έλεγαν ότι η ζωή του Αγ. Παύλου ήταν πολύ δυστυχισμένη. Πάντοτε τον ενοχλούσαν, αν όχι οι Ρωμαίοι αξιωματούχοι, ή μερικές πολίτες των πόλεων στις οποίες εκήρυττε, εδιώχθηκε ακόμη και από ορισμένους Χριστιανούς. Επιπλέον, υπέφερε συνεχώς από μιά «σαρκική ασθένεια». Ωστόσο, εν τη αγάπη του Χριστού, ο Άγ. Παύλος ευρήκε τον σκοπό της ζωής του δίνοντας τη χάρη του Θεού σε όλο και περισσότερους ανθρώπους. Παρά τις δοκιμασίες και τις θλίψεις του, ο Άγ. Παύλος απεκάλυψε την ευτυχία του καθώς παρατηρούσε τα πνευματικά του τέκνα σε πνευματική ηρεμία με ευγνωμοσύνη προς τον Θεό για όλες τις ευλογίες, καθώς έγραψε, «Ειδότες ότι ο εγείρας τον Κύριον Ιησούν και ημάς συν Ιησού εγερεί καὶ παραστήσει συν υμίν. Τα γαρ πάντα δι' υμάς, ίνα η χάρις πλεονάσασα διὰ των πλειόνων την ευχαριστίαν περισσεύση είς την δόξαν του Θεού.» (2 Κορ. 4:15).

Πολλοί έχουν ζήσει αρκετά χρόνια για να μας πουν ότι η ευτυχία δεν ευρίσκεται στις υλικές απολαύσεις και τις πολυτέλειες. Εσχημάτησαν ακόμη και φράσεις όπως: «Η αγάπη δεν αγοράζεται» και «Η ζωή δεν είναι όλο μέλη και γάλα». Ο κόσμος δεν είναι τέλειος, οι άνθρωποι δεν είναι τέλειοι και δεν είμεθα εμείς τέλειοι. Ως αποτέλεσμα, αναποδιές θα συμβαίνουν πάντοτε, κυρίως από δική μας αμέλεια ή έλλειψη σοφίας. Μπορούμε να ανταποκριθούμε στις αναποδιές της ζωής ή να τις χειροτερεύσουμε με τον θυμό μας, ή με κατάθλιψη και απελπισία — ή μπορούμε να κάνουμε προσευχή στον Χριστό με πίστη, ελπίδα και αγάπη. Όπως ο Χριστός - και με τη δύναμή Του - μπορούμε να ξεπεράσουμε τις αναποδιές της ζωής, ή ακριβέστερα, να νικήσουμε τον εαυτό μας, τα ελαττώματά μας, τα πάθη μας και τις αμαρτίες μας.

Εάν ψάχνουμε γιά να ευρούμε μια καθαρή συνείδηση και για να έχουμε υγιεινές σχέσεις με όλους γύρω μας — και για να αυξηθούμε εν τη σοφία του Θεού, θα ευρούμε διαρκή ευτυχία και ψυχική χαρά ενώνοντας τον εαυτό μας με τον Χριστό. Έχουμε δημιουργηθεί κατ' εικόνα του Θεού, δίνοντάς μας την ικανότητα να γνωρήσουμε την *άκτιστη Εικόνα του Θεού*, ο Οποίος είναι ο Χριστός. Καθώς γνωρίζουμε τον Χριστό, γινόμεθα όλο και περισσότερο οι άνθρωποι που εδημιουργηθήκαμε να είμεθα, δηλ. «ναοί του Θεου,» χωρίς εγωϊσμό και χωρίς τα πάθη. Αυτή η πραγματικότης από μόνο της χαρίζει τον σκοπό γιά την ζωή μας. Έχουμε περισσότερα να προσφέρουμε (δηλαδή, είμεθα πιό πολύτιμοι) από ό,τι νομίζουμε. Όπως κάνει ο Θεός, μπορούμε και εμείς να προσφέρουμε γνήσια αγάπη, η οποία κάνει εμάς και όσους γύρω μας να ενωθούμε με τις θεϊκές δυμάμεις του Θεού. Archiepiscopal Encyclical on the Feast of Saint Photios, Patriarch of Constantinople

February 6, 2024

Unto the Most Reverend and Right Reverend Hierarchs, Pious Priests and Deacons, Monks and Nuns, Presidents and Members of the Parish Councils, Honorable Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, Members of Leadership 100, Day and Afternoon Schools, Philoptochos Societies, Youth, Greek Orthodox Organizations, and entirety of the Christ-loving Plenitude of the Sacred Archdiocese of America:

Their sound has gone forth unto all the earth.... (Psalm 18:4, LXX)

Beloved sisters and brothers in Christ,

As we celebrate the feast of Saint Photios the Great, Patriarch of Constantinople, the Evange-lizer of the Slavic Peoples, let us take from his noble example the spirit of true apostleship on behalf of all people. Especially during this time when our Ukrainian Brethren are suffering wave after crashing wave of violence and abuse from the Russian Federation, we implore the intercessions of Saint Photios the Great to finally put an end to this fratricidal war of greed and aggression. The Gospel delivered to the Slavs by the saintly Patriarch of Constantinople was one of peace, not war; one of friendship, not enmity; one of love, not hate.

As we continue to pray for the peace of the world — and especially in the Holy Land — we also recognize the vision of our Saint Photios Greek Orthodox National Shrine; for it is a National Institution of our Sacred Archdiocese that is dedicated to preserving the memory of the early immigrants and founders of our Church in America. I highly recommend Chairman and Cashiers attend at least 1 Hands On class to be comfortable with the new machines. **See or contact Nick Latkovic with questions.**


As with any new technology, there will be questions during the festival. We will have a roaming "Help Desk" team to assist cashiers with questions during the hours of operation.


