PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. and Sidon. And behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and cried, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely possessed by a demon." But he did not answer her a word. And his disciples came and begged him, saying, "Send her away, for she is crying after us." He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me." And he answered, "It is not fair to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their master's table." Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire." And her daughter was healed instantly.

ST. LEO, POPE OF ROME – The Church of Rome was established by the First Ecumenical Council in 325 A.D. as one of the five Apostolic Patriarchates of the Christian Church – Rome, Constantinople, Jerusalem, Antioch, and Alexandria. All of the Patriarchs at that time were of the same Apostolic Faith. Thus, St. Leo who was Pope of Rome from 440-461 A.D., is one of our most important Orthodox Christian bishops. The title "Pope" is from the Latin word for "father."

St. Leo wrote a theological treatise, known as the "Tome of Leo" confirming the Apostolic understanding that Christ is One Person Who is fully Man and fully God. His treatise was read at the 4th Ecumenical Council in 451 A.D. inspiring the entire Orthodox Christian Church to declare as doctrine that Christ is of two natures, divine and human, united in One Person.

HUMILITY BEFORE GOD

The Canaanite Woman did not belong in the crowd that followed our Savior. Being a Canaanite, she was clearly not one of God's Chosen People. Although she was an outsider, she called out to Him, with words describing Him as being the Messiah, using the words that the Israelites would use to refer to the Messiah: "Lord, Son of David." Her faith remained strong even when tested by our Lord, Who referred to her as a "little dog." With faith, she said, "Yes, Lord, but even the little dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their master's table." Her reference to "crumbs" coincides with the fact that, through the Holy Spirit, bread becomes the Body of Christ Himself during the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. Like her, we are to approach our Lord with humility (which is what is meant by the words "with the fear of God..."). Like her, we are to also approach with faith and with love.

Humility before God means that we acknowledge the fact that Jesus Christ is the True God and our Savior. Without such humility, we fall into many deceptions and temptations, leading to our "normal" activity of discounting the blessings that we do have and making even worse the difficulties that come to us from an imperfect world, often influenced by evil forces.

Like so many other incidents in our Lord's ministry, the circumstance surrounding the Canaanite Woman's demon-possessed daughter was an opportunity for all of humanity to understand that Christ is God and that all people are God's people, regardless of origin or nationality. Indeed, as God, He takes our difficulties and illnesses upon Himself giving us the opportunity, through His love for us, inspire others with our faith. This is the lesson that we have come to understand today from the incident regarding the Canaanite Woman. Like with the Canaanite Woman, many of our circumstances are opportunities for us to inspire others as we turn to Christ our God with humility, faith and love. +FR. THEODORE

Η Χαναναία δεν ανήκε στο πλήθος που ακολουθούσε τον Χριστό. Ως Χαναναία, μάλιστα, δεν ήταν μία εκ των «Εκλεκτών» του Θεού. Εάν και ήταν ξένη, ανεγνώρισε τον Χριστόν πως να είναι ο Μεσσίας, χρησιμοποιώντας τις λέξεις που θα εχρησιμοποιούσαν οι Ισραηλίτες σε σχέση με τον Μεσσία: «Κύριε, Υιέ του Δαβίδ». Η πίστις της επαρέμεινε ισχυρή ακόμη και όταν εδοκιμάσθηκε από τον Κύριο, ο Οποίος ανέφερε την ιδέα πως αυτή ήταν σαν ένα «σκυλάκι». Με πίστη, είπε: «Ναι, Κύριε, και γαρ τα κυνάρια εσθίει από των ψιχίων των πιπτόντων από της τραπέζης των κυρίων αυτών.» Η χρήσις της λέξεώς της «των ψιχίων» συμπίπτει με την πραγματικότητα ότι, διά μέσου του Αγίου Πνεύματος, ο άρτος γίνεται το Σώμα του Ίδιου του Χριστού κατά την εκτέλεση της Θ. Λειτουργίας. Όπως αυτή, έτσι και εμείς πρέπει να πλησιάσουμε τον Χριστόν με ταπείνωση (η ταπείνωσις εννοείται με τις λέξεις «μετά φόβου Θεού...»). Όπως έκανε και αυτή, έτσι και εμείς πρέπει να προσεγγίσουμε τον Χριστό με πίστη και αγάπη.

Η Ταπείνωσις ενώπιον του Θεού σημαίνει ότι αναγνωρίζουμε ττην πραγματικότηταν ότι ο Χριστός είναι ο Αληθινός Θεός. Χωρίς τέτοια ταπεινοφροσύνη, πέφτουμε σε πολλές απάτες και πειρασμούς, Συνέχεια στην επόμενη σελίδα – – >

οδηγώντας στον «συνηθισμένο» μας τρόπο να απορρίπτουμε τις ευλογίες που έχουμε και να κάνουμε ακόμη χειρότερες τις δυσκολίες που μας έρχονται από έναν ατελή κόσμο, συχνά επηρεασμένο από κακές δυνάμεις.

Όπως τόσα άλλα περιστατικά στη διακονία του Κυρίου, η περίστασις γύρω από την δαιμονισμένη κόρη της Χαναναίας ήταν μιά ευκαιρία για όλη την ανθρωπότητα να καταλάβει ότι ο Χριστός είναι Θεός και ότι όλοι οι άνθρωποι είναι άνθρωποι του Θεού, ανεξαρτήτως καταγωγής ή εθνικότητος. Μάλιστα, ως Θεός, αναλαμβάνει τις δυσκολίες μας και τις ασθένειές μας, ώστε να έχουμε την ευκαιρία, διά μέσου της αγάπης Του για εμάς, να εμπνεύσουμε τους άλλους με την πίστη μας. Αυτό είναι το μάθημα από το γεγονός που εγνωρίσαμεν σήμερα περί της Χαναναίας. Όπως και με την Χαναναία, πολλές από τις περιστάσεις μας είναι ευκαιρίες για εμάς να εμπνεύσουμε άλλους καθώς πλησιάζουμε τον Χριστό με ταπείνωση, πίστη και αγάπη. +Ο ΠΑΤΗΡ ΘΕΟΔΩΡΟΣ


